Thank you very much for that, Minister, and I welcome that additional announcement. Falls and fractures pose a huge problem for our increasingly aged population in Wales, especially among those who suffer from osteoporosis. When I wrote to you about the possibility of using this fund to invest in fracture liaison services, we found out that those services only exist in about half of Wales's hospitals. You said that you could see that as a viable way forward. What further conversations have you had with the Minister for Health and Social Services about extending this very important proposal?

The inquiry undertaken by the Finance Committee has been very helpful and I look forward to your report on the review into the invest-to-save fund. I am sure that you will have welcomed the announcement today, particularly, for example, the £90,000 for establishing collaborative local government farm estate services, which, of course, involves a number of local authorities. We must also ensure that we are reaching out to those smaller organisations that could benefit from invest to save.

Today's announcement shows the flexibility that we are using in terms of approving projects that fall below what has been our threshold of £100,000. However, I am also committed to the strategic approach, as I am sure that Paul Davies would recognise, in terms of maximising the opportunity for transfer, and transformation, in terms of public service improvement.

Given that the NHS is, by far, the major beneficiary of the invest-to-save fund, what do you intend to do to ensure that best practice, and investing now to save valuable resources, is not confined to the beneficiaries of your fund?

- Your question follows on very much from those of the opposition's finance spokesperson. We need to ensure that we promote the invest-to-save reports of case studies. In fact, we are circulating those across the public service, and are also ensuring that officials are raising awareness among various networks, through programmes and workshops. That reaches smaller organisations, as well as those parts of the sector that have used it extensively, including the NHS.

- Your 2012 interim evaluation also notes that the NHS is a key beneficiary because, unlike local government, it has limited options for borrowing. Given the widespread concern about future pressures on NHS finances, is there scope during the next few years to introduce a specific scheme, which is based on invest to save, for the NHS alone?

- The NHS has been a major beneficiary of this scheme. Indeed, it has been an important strand of finance, which, as it is not able to borrow in the same way as local government, has been appropriate. Some of the projects have been collaborative with local government, so we would need to ensure that there is cross-sectoral engagement in invest to save. However, I am sure that we would look at that proposal carefully in terms of a scheme for the NHS.

Despite the cuts that you imposed on the health and social services portfolio, it is fair to say that you allocated £1.2 billion in revenue allocations to Besti Cadwaladr University Local Health Board. However, a Wales Audit Office report from January predicts that, by the end of this financial year, the Besti Cadwaladr health board is likely to be, at best, £19 million in deficit, or possibly as much as £24 million in deficit. Once you have allocated your delivery of core NHS services funding for local health boards—some £5.5 billion has been allocated in revenue this year, and last year it was £5.1 billion—what is your involvement in terms of corporate governance, financial probity, best value and best practice with local health boards?

This question provides me with a good opportunity to remind Janet Finch-Saunders that over 40% of our budget is allocated to the NHS. We have been clear in our support for the NHS in Wales, not only in protecting the health budget from cash reductions at the start of the spending review, but also in allocating an additional £288 million over three years. 'Together for Health' gives the Welsh Government's commitment to reviewing the NHS finance regime, and that has been endorsed by the auditor general. I am working closely with the Minister for Health and Social Services to take this forward.

I am pleased to open this debate on the general principles of the Regulated Mobile Home Sites (Wales) Bill. I would like to put on record my thanks to the Chair and members of the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee for their helpful advice and support during their Stage 1 scrutiny of the Bill and for their comprehensive report. I also offer my thanks to the members of the Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee for their report. I would also like to place on record my appreciation to the public bodies, other organisations and members of the public who responded to my consultation on the draft proposals for the Bill and the committee's consultation and who gave evidence during the Stage 1 proceedings.

Once more, I want to acknowledge the support and hard work put into producing this Bill by Assembly Commission staff and my researchers, who have worked with me to produce it. I should also acknowledge the support of the Minister for Housing, Regeneration and Heritage and his officials. Although this is a Member's Bill, their constructive comments and searching questions have been invaluable in producing the Bill and assisting me through this process thus far.

The Bill will create a licensing regime, which is a modern, fit-for-purpose framework that can be consistently implemented across Wales. There are a number of key reforms contained in the Bill that I expect to be retained in the alternative legislative approach suggested by the Minister, which I shall talk about in more detail later.

Stage 1 Debate on the Regulated Mobile Home Sites (Wales) Bill

Unwaith eto, hoffwn gydnabod cymorth a gwaith caled staff Comisiwn y Cynulliad a'm hymchwilyr, sydd wedi gweithio gyda mi i lunio'r Bil hwn. Dylwn hefyd gydnabod cymorth y Gweinidog Tai, Adfywio a Threftadaeth a'i swyddogion. Er mai Bil gan Aelod ydyw, bu eu sylwadau adeiladol a chwestiynau treiddgar yn amhriiadwy wrth baratoi'r Bil ac yn gymorth imi drwy'r broses hon hyd yn hyn.

Bydd y Bil yn creu cyfundrefn drwyddedu, sy'n fframwaith modern sy'n addas at y diben y gellir ei weithredu'n gyson ledled Cymru. Mae'r Bil yn cynnwys nifer o ddiwygiadau allweddol y disgwyliaf y byddant yn cael eu cadw yn y dull deddfwriaethol amgen a awgrymwyd gan y Gweinidog, y byddaf yn sôn amdano'n fanylach yn ddiweddarach.

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Some of the key reforms are: a five-year licence subject to a fee that can resource enforcement activity and that is payable again on renewal; a fit-and-proper-person test; and provisions that make it easier for the licensing authority to enforce breaches of the licence, including management orders, notices requiring owners to carry out work, provision to carry out work in default, powers of entry and the availability of a fixed penalty as an option if they need to quickly punish a breach. It also includes the end of the veto on new sales and protection for existing residents from frivolous sale blocking; protection of the anonymity of members of residents associations so as to avoid intimidation; linking pitch fees to the consumer price index and ensuring that costs incurred by the site owner in licensing the site are not passed on to residents; protection for the home owners so as to enable them to carry out internal improvements; and provision on rights of succession.

I will start by referring to recommendation 2 of the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee's report. This specifically seeks clarification on the alternative legislative approach suggested by the Minister, which I have been discussing with him and his officials. The proposal is to overhaul the Bill so that, although it retains all the features just referred to, it effectively becomes a stand-alone mobile homes Act for Wales, based on the Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act 1960. The resulting Bill will be longer than the one currently before us. This is the approach that I would have taken, if I had had the resources and time after winning the ballot. To enable us to have the time to do this, I have requested of Business Committee, and have been granted, the postponement of Stage 2 until after the Whitsun recess. The new Bill will rely less on Order and regulation-making powers, allowing the Government to be in a position to commence it sooner than anticipated. It will also take on many of the recommendations of the two committee reports.

Paragraph 150 of the communities committee's report suggests that I should consider the approach taken in the English Mobile Homes Bill, which, where an agreement is already in place, introduces a mechanism for site owners to appeal to the residential property tribunal if they have legitimate grounds for wishing to prevent a particular sale; removes the requirement for mobile home owners entering into new agreements after the legislation is enacted to seek permission from the site owner before making a sale; and requires mobile home sellers to provide the site rules and written statement in writing to prospective buyers. That is a change to the way that the Bill is currently set out, which prevents an absolute veto and says that the site owner has no role to play in that. I am happy to accept that suggestion, although I would want to make provision so that the residential property tribunal could penalise appeals by site owners that have no merit whatsoever or form part of a pattern of appeals that it would reasonably conclude to be vexatious.

Mae hefyd yn cynnwys diwedd ar y feto ar werthiannau newydd a diogelwch i breswylwyr presennol rhag achosion o atal gwerthiant am resymau gwacsaw; diogelu anhysbysrwydd aelodau cymdeithasau preswylwyr er mwyn osgoi achosion o fygyly; cysylltu ffioedd lleiniau â'r mynegai prisiau defnyddwyr a sicrhau nad yw'r costau y mae perchennog y safle yn mynd iddynt er mwyn trwyddedu'r safle yn cael eu trosglwyddo i breswylwyr; diogelwch i berchnogion cartrefi er mwyn eu galluogi i wneud gwelliannau mewnol a darpariaeth ar hawliau olyniaeth.

Rwyf am ddechrau drwy gyfeirio at argymhellid 2 o adroddiad y Pwyllgor Cymunedau, Cydraddoldeb a Llywodraeth Leol. Mae hwn yn benodol yn gofyn am eglurhad ar y dull deddfwriaethol amgen a awgrymwyd gan y Gweinidog, yr wyf wedi bod yn ei drafod gydag ef a'i swyddogion. Y cynnig yw y dylid ailwampio'r Bil er mwyn iddo ddod i bob diben yn Ddeddf benodol i Gymru ar gartrefi symudol, yn seiliedig ar Ddeddf Safleoedd Carafannau a Rheoli Datblygu 1960, er y bydd yn cadw'r holl nodweddion yr wyf newydd gyfeirio atynt. Bydd y Bil canlyniadol yn hwy na'r un sydd ger ein bron ar hyn o bryd. Dyma'r hyn y byddwn wedi ei wneud, pe bai'r adnoddau a'r amser gennyf ar ôl ennill y balot. Er mwyn inni gael amser i wneud hyn, rwyf wedi gofyn i'r Pwyllgor Busnes am i Gyfnod 2 gael ei ohirio tan ar ôl toriad y Sulgwyn ac mae wedi caniatáu hynny. Bydd y Bil newydd yn dibynnu llai ar bwerau Gorchymyn a phwerau i wneud rheoliadau, gan alluogi'r Llywodraeth i fod mewn sefyllfa i'w roi ar gychwyn yn gynt na'r disgwyl. Bydd hefyd yn derbyn llawer o argymhellion y ddau adroddiad pwyllgor.

Mae paragraff 150 o adroddiad y pwyllgor cymunedau yn awgrymu y dylwn ystyried y dull a ddefnyddir yn y Bil Cartrefi Symudol yn Lloegr, sydd, lle mae cytundeb eisoes ar waith, yn cyflwyno ffordd i berchnogion safleoedd apelio i'r tribiwnlys eiddo preswyl os oes ganddynt sail ddilys dros ddymuno atal gwerthiant arbennig; sy'n dileu'r gofyniad ar berchnogion cartrefi symudol sy'n ymrwymo i gytundebau newydd ar ôl i'r deddfwriaeth gael ei gweithredu i geisio caniatâd gan berchennog y safle cyn gwerthu llain, ac mae'n ei gwneud yn ofynnol i werthwyr cartrefi symudol ddarparu rheolau'r safle a datganiad ysgrifenedig yn ysgrifenedig i ddarpar brynwyr. Mae hynny'n newid y ffordd y mae'r Bil wedi'i lunio ar hyn o bryd, sy'n atal feto absoliwt ac yn dweud nad oes gan berchennog y safle unrhyw rôl i'w chwarae yn hynny. Rwy'n fodlon derbyn yr awgrym hwnnw, er yr hoffwn wneud darpariaeth fel y gallai'r tribiwnlys eiddo preswyl gosbi apeliadau gan berchnogion safleoedd nad oes iddynt unrhyw deilyngdod o gwbl neu sy'n ffurfio patrwm o apeliadau y byddai'n rhesymol dod i'r casgliad eu bod yn flinderus.

In terms of the other recommendations in that report, I agree that mobile home site owners should be required to consult with their residents before applying to change the use of their site, and also that mains utility bills should be displayed on sites so as to improve transparency. The Bill as it is currently drafted already makes provision in section 32 for offences committed by corporate bodies. I agree, however, that local authorities should be able to inspect sites unannounced, providing that this does not include anybody's home, such as that of a site manager. Recommendation 13 as to the qualification of residents associations being on the basis of the proportion of homes on the site is also agreed. This was an oversight in the drafting of the Bill, which I am happy to put right.

In terms of the Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee's report, many of the recommendations will be overtaken by the amendments due to be tabled. However, with regard to recommendation 5 asking for more detail of the appeal procedure set out in section 16 of the Bill, I would refer the committee to the Residential Property Tribunal Procedures and Fees (Wales) Regulations 2012, which regulate the procedure to be followed for applications and appeals made to a residential property tribunal under the Mobile Homes Act 1983. In the circumstances, I do not believe that it would be logical for procedures relating to appeals under this Bill to be set out on its face, when they are already set out in relation to existing rights of appeal in one comprehensive set of regulations.

With regard to recommendation 6, suggesting that the level of the fixed fee be increased so that amending regulations will not be required soon after the commencement of section 24, it has been suggested that a better approach would be not to refer to an amount in the Bill at all and to remove the Minister's power to change the amount, but to legislate so that local authorities have the power to fix the level of penalty up to the maximum set out in level 1 on the standard scale, which is currently £200. This would then be revised when the standard scale is updated by the Ministry of Justice.

It is also suggested that we require each local authority to publish its own fee scheme, which would include the level of fixed fee applicable in that area, subject of course to the maximum. I am happy to agree with that.

I hope that I have offered assurance to Members as to how the Bill is to proceed from this point and that, in doing so, I have ensured that we will be crafting an exclusive Wales-only approach that will meet the needs of mobile home owners and protect them from the worst excesses of the industry. I ask you to agree the general principles and the financial resolution today, so that we can move to Stage 2 and seek to complete Stages 3 and 4 by the summer recess. Thank you.

O ran yr argymhellion eraill yn yr adroddiad hwnnw, cytunaf y dylai fod yn ofynnol i berchnogion safleoedd cartrefi symudol ymgynghori â'u preswylwyr cyn gwneud cais i newid y defnydd o'u safle, a hefyd y dylai biliau cyfleustodau prif gyflenwad gael eu harddangos ar safleoedd er mwyn sicrhau mwy o dryloywder. Mae'r Bil fel y'i drafftwyd ar hyn o bryd eisoes yn gwneud darpariaeth yn adran 32 ar gyfer troseddau a gyflawnir gan gyrff corfforaethol. Fodd bynnag, cytunaf y dylai awdurdodau lleol fod yn gallu archwilio safleoedd yn ddirybudd, ar yr amod nad yw hyn yn cynnwys cartref unrhyw un, megis cartref rheolwr y safle. Cytunir ar argymhelliad 13 hefyd, sef bod cymdeithasau preswylwyr yn gymwys ar sail cyfran y cartrefi ar y safle. Hepgorwyd hynny'n anfwriadol wrth lunio'r Mesur, ac rwy'n fwy na pharod i'w gynnwys.

O ran adroddiad y Pwyllgor Materion Cyfansoddiadol a Deddfwriaethol, bydd llawer o'r argymhellion yn ddiangen bellach oherwydd y gwelliannau y bwriedir eu cyflwyno. Fodd bynnag, o ran argymhelliad 5 sy'n gofyn am fwy o fanylion am y weithdrefn apelio a nodir yn adran 16 o'r Bil, hoffwn gyfeirio'r pwyllgor at Reoliadau Gweithdrefnau a Ffioedd Tribiwnlys Eiddo Preswyl (Cymru) 2012, sy'n rheoleiddio'r weithdrefn sydd i'w dilyn ar gyfer ceisiadau ac apeliadau a gyflwynir i dribiwnlys eiddo preswyl o dan Ddeddf Cartrefi Symudol 1983. O dan yr amgylchiadau, ni chredaf y byddai'n rhesymegol nodi gweithdrefnau sy'n ymwneud ag apeliadau o dan y Bil hwn yn y Bil ei hun, gan eu bod eisoes wedi'u nodi mewn perthynas â'r hawliau presennol i apelio mewn un set gynhwysfawr o reoliadau.

O ran argymhelliad 6, sy'n awgrymu y dylid cynyddu lefel y ffi benodedig fel na fydd angen rheoliadau diwygio yn fuan ar ôl cychwyn adran 24, awgrymwyd mai gwell fyddai peidio â chyfeirio at swm yn y Bil o gwbl a chael gwared ar bŵer y Gweinidog i newid y swm, ond yn hytrach na hynny, ddeddfu fel bod gan awdurdodau lleol y pŵer i bennu lefel y gosb hyd at yr uchafswm a nodir yn lefel 1 ar y raddfa safonol, sef £200 ar hyn o bryd. Câi hyn ei ddiwygio wedyn pan fydd y raddfa safonol yn cael ei diweddarau gan y Weinyddiaeth Gyfiawnder.

Awgrymir hefyd ein bod yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i bob awdurdod lleol gyhoeddi ei gynllun ffioedd ei hun, a fyddai'n cynnwys lefel y ffi benodedig sy'n gymwys yn yr ardal honno, yn amodol wrth gwrs ar yr uchafswm. Rwy'n fodlon cytuno ar hynny.

Gobeithiaf fy mod wedi cynnig sicrwydd i Aelodau ynghylch sut y bydd y Bil yn symud yn ei flaen o hyn ymlaen ac, wrth wneud hynny, fy mod wedi sicrhau y byddwn yn llunio dull unigryw o weithredu i Gymru a fydd yn diwallu anghenion perchnogion cartrefi symudol a'u diogelu rhag yr enghreifftiau gwaethaf o gamarfer gan y diwydiant. Gofynnaf ichi gytuno i'r egwyddorion cyffredinol a'r penderfyniad ariannol heddiw, fel y gallwn symud yn ein blaen i Gyfnod 2 a cheisio cwblhau Cyfnodau 3 a 4 erbyn toriad yr haf. Diolch yn fawr.

I call on the Chair of the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee, Ann Jones, to respond.

Galwaf ar Gadeirydd y Pwyllgor Cymunedau, Cydraddoldeb a Llywodraeth Leol, Ann Jones, i ymateb.

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Thank you very much, Presiding Officer. I am pleased to contribute to this debate as Chair of the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee, which was responsible for scrutinising Peter Black's Bill. Like Peter, I will also—on behalf of the committee—thank all those who contributed during the Stage 1 process and particularly our committee staff.

I do not propose to address all the issues that we raised in the report, but I will just highlight a couple of areas and assure the Chamber that there is widespread support among stakeholders for this new legislation to update and modernise the legislative framework, and to address the issues experienced on some mobile home sites in Wales. As a committee, we agree that legislation is required for this purpose and we support the general principles and intentions of the Bill.

The Bill intends to establish a dual licensing regime. The committee took the view that while a unified licensing regime would be simpler to operate for local authorities and site owners, it might not provide an equivalent level of protection for mobile home owners as a dual licensing regime. We therefore recommended that if the dual licensing regime is implemented, it should be kept under review to ensure that it remains effective.

I want to mention the fit-and-proper-person test. Whether the licensing regime is dual or unified, the committee feels that it should be robust and effective, and that it should include a fit-and-proper-person test. The fit-and-proper-person test was a key feature for many of those who came to give evidence before our committee. If properly defined and applied, we believe that this test could be influential in improving standards, and reducing the criminality and harassment that occurs on some mobile home sites.

To reduce the burden on site owners and local authorities, and to encourage consistency across Wales, the committee concluded that the test should be transferable between sites within a local authority area, and that local authorities, in carrying out the tests, should have regard to whether an individual has previously failed an equivalent test elsewhere in Wales.

In terms of licensing enforcement, it is clear from the evidence that we received that raising site standards is very important, and that this should be done by building good working relationships between local authorities and site owners, supported when required by robust and proportionate enforcement action to deal with licence condition breaches or bad practice. We believe that the enforcement powers, with some minor amendments, such as the ability for local authority officials to carry out unannounced inspections, are the way forward. I am pleased that Peter can accept that. We will make those arrangements at Stage 2.

Fel pwyllgor, rydym yn cytuno bod angen deddfwriaeth at y diben hwn ac rydym yn cefnogi egwyddorion cyffredinol a bwriadau'r Bil.

Mae'r Bil yn bwriadu sefydlu cyfundrefn drwyddedu ddeuol. Roedd y pwyllgor o'r farn, er y byddai cyfundrefn drwyddedu unedig yn symlach i awdurdodau lleol a pherchnogion safleoedd ei gweithredu, efallai na fyddai'n rhoi'r un diogelwch i berchnogion cartrefi symudol â chyfundrefn drwyddedu ddeuol. Felly, argymhellwyd gennym os bydd y drefn drwyddedu ddeuol yn cael ei rhoi ar waith, y dylid parhau i'w hadolygu er mwyn sicrhau ei bod yn effeithiol o hyd.

Hoffwn sôn am y prawf person addas a phriodol. Pa un a yw'r drefn drwyddedu yn un ddeuol neu unedig, teimla'r pwyllgor y dylai fod yn gadarn ac yn effeithiol, ac y dylai gynnwys prawf person addas a phriodol. Roedd prawf person addas a phriodol yn nodwedd allweddol i lawer o'r rhai a ddaeth i roi tystiolaeth gerbron ein pwyllgor. Os caiff ei ddiffinio a'i gymhwyso'n briodol, credwn y gallai'r prawf hwn fod yn ddylanwadol o ran gwella safonau, a lleihau nifer yr achosion o dor-cyfraith ac aflonyddu sy'n digwydd ar rai safleoedd cartrefi symudol.

Er mwyn lleihau'r baich ar berchnogion safleoedd ac awdurdodau lleol, a hyrwyddo cysondeb ledled Cymru, daeth y pwyllgor i'r casgliad y dylai'r prawf fod yn drosglwyddadwy rhwng safleoedd o fewn ardal awdurdod lleol, ac y dylai awdurdodau lleol, wrth gynnal y profion, ystyried a yw unigolyn wedi methu prawf cyfatebol mewn mannau eraill yng Nghymru yn y gorffennol.

O ran gorfodi trwyddedau, mae'n amlwg o'r dystiolaeth a gawsom fod codi safonau ar safleoedd yn bwysig iawn, ac y dylid gwneud hyn drwy feithrin perthynas waith dda rhwng awdurdodau lleol a pherchnogion safleoedd, ynghyd â chamau gorfodi cadarn a chymesur i ymdrin â thorri amodau trwydded neu arfer gwael lle y bo angen. Credwn mai'r pwerau gorfodi, gyda rhai mân newidiadau, megis y gallu i swyddogion awdurdodau lleol gynnal arolygiadau dirybudd, yw'r ffordd ymlaen. Rwy'n falch bod Peter yn fodlon derbyn hynny. Byddwn yn gwneud y trefniadau hynny yng Nghyfnod 2.

On the sale of mobile homes, mobile home owners and site owners told us that sale blocking has to be addressed. This practice, which involves unscrupulous site owners preventing mobile home owners from selling their mobile homes, and compelling them to sell that mobile home to the site owner for significantly less than it is worth, is one of the main causes of misery for the many mobile home owners. Quite rightly, the Bill seeks to address sale blocking by removing site owners' rights to approve mobile home buyers. However, on the basis of the evidence that we heard, we were concerned that this could have unintended consequences for mobile home buyers, site owners, and the existing community of residents on the mobile home sites. We recommended in our report that the Member in charge should look again at these provisions and consider including mechanisms to militate against any unintended consequences.

Turning to the financial implications, the modernisation of the licensing regime will raise standards on mobile home sites and will provide additional protections for mobile home owners, but it will not be without costs for the Welsh Government, local authorities, the residential property tribunal and the owners of mobile homes. However, we were satisfied that these costs are a reasonable consequence of updating a regime that has become outdated. Local authorities will be able to offset their costs by charging licence fees—Peter has referred to that already—by recovering the costs of enforcement, and by working collaboratively to deliver the administration, monitoring and enforcement of the updated regime. Mobile home owners will benefit from the improved standards, and good site owners will benefit from the cleaning up of their industry. Nobody has anything to fear from this Bill. The Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee is pleased to support the Bill, as detailed in our report, and we wish it well at Stage 2.

Fodd bynnag, ar sail y dystiolaeth a glywsom, roeddem yn pryderu y gallai hyn arwain at ganlyniadau anfwriadol i brynwyr cartrefi symudol, perchnogion safleoedd, a'r gymuned bresennol o breswylwyr ar y safleoedd cartrefi symudol. Argymhellwyd yn ein hadroddiad y dylai'r Aelod sy'n gyfrifol edrych eto ar y darpariaethau hyn ac ystyried cynnwys modd i filwrio yn erbyn unrhyw ganlyniadau anfwriadol.

Gan droi at y goblygiadau ariannol, bydd y broses o foderneiddio'r gyfundrefn drwyddedu yn codi safonau ar safleoedd cartrefi symudol a bydd yn diogelu perchnogion cartrefi symudol ymhellach, ond ni fydd hynny heb gostau i Lywodraeth Cymru, awdurdodau lleol, y tribiwnlys eiddo preswyl a pherchnogion cartrefi symudol. Fodd bynnag, roeddem yn fodlon bod y costau hyn yn ganlyniad rhesymol o ddiweddar cyfundrefn sydd wedi dyddio. Bydd awdurdodau lleol yn gallu gwrthbwyso eu costau trwy godi ffioedd trwydded—y mae Peter wedi cyfeirio at hyn eisoes—drwy adennill costau gorfodi, a thrwy gydweithio i weinyddu, monitro a gorfodi'r gyfundrefn newydd. The Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee's remit includes reporting on provisions in Assembly Bills that give powers to the Welsh Ministers to make subordinate legislation. The committee took evidence on this Bill from Peter Black, the Member in charge, and from the Minister for Housing, Regeneration and Heritage, and we reported to the Assembly on 22 February 2013. The committee's report is available as a supporting document for this debate and I commend it to you.

Mae cylch gwaith y Pwyllgor Materion Cyfansoddiadol a Deddfwriaethol yn cynnwys cyflwyno adroddiadau ar ddarpariaethau mewn Biliau Cynulliad sy'n rhoi pwerau i Weinidogion Cymru wneud is-ddeddfwriaeth. Cymerodd y pwyllgor dystiolaeth ar y Bil hwn gan Peter Black, yr Aelod sy'n gyfrifol, a chan y Gweinidog Tai, Adfywio a Threftadaeth, a chyflwynwyd adroddiad gennym i'r Cynulliad ar 22 Chwefror 2013. Mae adroddiad y pwyllgor ar gael fel dogfen ategol ar gyfer y ddadl hon ac fe'i cymeradwyaf ichi.

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We reported on the Bill as introduced, although, in so doing, we noted that the Minister, at that time, was considering an alternative approach. Indeed, in introducing today's debate on the principles of an overhauled Bill, Peter Black has outlined that he is happy with this and that the model for the Bill that is now before us would have been the one that he would have chosen had he been able to do so originally and if he had had the means to do that work.

Paratowyd adroddiad gennym ar y Bil fel y'i cyflwynwyd, er wrth wneud hynny, nodwyd bod y Gweinidog, ar y pryd, yn ystyried dull gweithredu amgen. Yn wir, wrth gyflwyno'r ddadl heddiw ar egwyddorion Bil ar ei newydd wedd, mae Peter Black wedi nodi ei fod yn fodlon ar hyn ac mai'r model ar gyfer y Bil sydd bellach ger ein bron yw'r un y byddai wedi'i ddewis pe bai wedi gallu gwneud hynny yn wreiddiol a phe bai modd iddo wneud y gwaith hwnnw.

We certainly welcome the fact that agreement has been reached, but we do consider this approach to be somewhat irregular. From the perspective of the scrutiny of this piece of legislation, it would have been far more preferable to have secured this agreement prior to introduction of the Bill. In effect, we are now discussing the principles of the Bill without a proper, fit report from the Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee. Nevertheless, in line with conclusion 4 of our report, we will aim, if the timetable permits, to undertake a further scrutiny session on this Bill as amended at Stage 2, and to report to the Assembly on the revised provisions in readiness for Stage 3 proceedings. We hope that this, even at a later stage, will produce the necessary scrutiny on the things that are within the Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee's remit.

There is little purpose in my going through the detail of our report, as it has been overtaken. However, some of the conclusions are relevant and still apply to the overhauled Bill. In our view, the balance between what was included on the face of the Bill as introduced and what was to be provided for by subordinate legislation was not as we would have expected. We noted that both the Minister and the Member in charge, in their evidence to us, were content in principle to address this point, and we certainly welcomed that. It is therefore pleasing that this issue is to be addressed, albeit through the alternative proposals. We believe that including more detail on the face of the Bill will strengthen it considerably and provide a clearer foundation for the policy it seeks to deliver. In our view, it is good practice for regulation-making powers to have clear principles attached to them. We hope, therefore, that amendments to be tabled at Stage 2 that contain regulation-making powers adhere to this principle.

Finally, while we concluded that the negative procedure is more appropriate for statutory instruments that deliver technical and administrative changes, we believe that more significant issues contained in such instruments should be subject to the greater level of scrutiny that is provided for by the affirmative procedure. As before, we hope that amendments tabled at Stage 2 take account of this principle, where it is appropriate.

Rydym yn sicr yn croesawu'r ffaith bod cytundeb, ond credwn fod y dull gweithredu hwn braidd yn afreolaidd. O safbwynt craffu ar y darn hwn o ddeddfwriaeth, byddai wedi bod yn llawer gwell pe bai'r cytundeb hwn wedi'i sicrhau cyn i'r Bil gael ei gyflwyno. Mewn gwirionedd, rydym bellach yn trafod egwyddorion y Bil heb adroddiad addas a phriodol gan y Pwyllgor Materion Cyfansoddiadol a Deddfwriaethol. Serch hynny, yn unol â chasgliad 4 o'n hadroddiad, byddwn yn ceisio, os caniatâ'r amserlen, gynnal sesiwn graffu bellach ar y Bil fel y'i diwygiwyd yng Nghyfnod 2, a chyflwyno adroddiad i'r Cynulliad ar y darpariaethau diwygiedig yn barod ar gyfer Cyfnod 3. Ein gobaith yw y bydd hyn, hyd yn oed ar gam hwyrach, yn fodd i sicrhau'r camau craffu angenrheidiol ar y pethau sydd o fewn cylch gwaith y Pwyllgor Materion Cyfansoddiadol a Deddfwriaethol.

Nid oes fawr o ddiben mewn manylu ar ein hadroddiad, gan nad yw'n gyfredol mwyach. Fodd bynnag, mae rhai o'r casgliadau yn berthnasol ac yn dal yn gymwys i'r Bil ar ei newydd wedd. Yn ein barn ni, nid yw'r cydbwysedd rhwng yr hyn a oedd wedi'i gynnwys yn y Bil fel y'i cyflwynwyd a'r hyn y bwriedir darparu ar ei gyfer drwy is-ddeddfwriaeth yn unol â'r hyn y byddem wedi ei ddisgwyl. Nodwyd gennym fod y Gweinidog a'r Aelod sy'n gyfrifol, yn eu tystiolaeth inni, yn fodlon mewn egwyddor i fynd i'r afael â'r pwynt hwn, a chroesawyd hynny gennym yn sicr. Gobeithiwn, felly, y bydd y gwelliannau y bwriedir eu cyflwyno yng Nghyfnod 2 sy'n cynnwys pwerau gwneud rheoliadau yn cadw at yr egwyddor hon.

Y Gweinidog Tai, Adfywio a Threftadaeth / The Minister for Housing, Regeneration and Heritage

I would like to begin by thanking Peter Black for bringing this piece of legislation before the Assembly. As I said in my White Paper, this Government will support and has supported achieving the aims of this Member's Bill, which would perhaps otherwise have been enabled through my housing Bill. The most important thing is not who brings the legislation forward, but the positive difference that it makes to people's lives. We are glad as a Government to complement Peter's good work in order to do this.

Hoffwn ddechrau drwy ddiolch i Peter Black am gyflwyno'r darn hwn o ddeddfwriaeth gerbron y Cynulliad. Fel y dywedais yn fy Mhapur Gwyn, bydd y Llywodraeth hon yn cefnogi ac mae wedi cefnogi cyflawni amcanion y Bil hwn gan Aelod, a fyddai efallai fel arall wedi cael eu galluogi drwy fy Mil ar dai. Y peth pwysicaf yw'r gwahaniaeth cadarnhaol a wna'r ddeddfwriaeth i fywydau pobl, nid pwysy'n ei chyflwyno. Rydym yn falch fel Llywodraeth i ategu gwaith da Peter er mwyn gwneud hyn.

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Mobile homes are a valued type of accommodation, particularly for older people. We have a duty to ensure that there is protection in law for the residents and owners of mobile home sites. While few and far between, unscrupulous owners and the unfair practices that have been described by others here today have to be stopped. In my view, much of this is about enforcement. There is a host of powers available to local authorities, but we must help them to enforce the law, for instance by allowing them to recover their costs.

However, I do not think that we need an additional site licensing regime. The Bill as it stood would have created, in effect, another tier of site licensing in Wales. I intend to table amendments at Stage 2 to ensure that there remains a single site licensing regime, whereby the existing system is preserved and modernised appropriately. Linked to this, it is absolutely critical that provisions in the Bill are workable alongside existing legislation. I will also be tabling amendments to ensure that that happens. I want to emphasise that, in doing this, I will ensure that we retain other important elements of Peter's Bill that I support, such as the fit-and-proper-person test and the end of the effective veto on sales.

I would like to take some time to consider the excellent work of the two committees involved in scrutinising the Bill at Stage 1. I will attempt to cover their main concerns in the short time that I have available today. First, I would like to reassure the Chairs of the committees and the Chamber as a whole that my officials will continue to work closely with the Member in charge and the committee clerks to ensure that we can create the best site licensing system that we can. I share the concerns of both committees about the number of subordinate legislation provisions, and I will aim to reduce those powers, where there is already existing provision, by amending existing law. For example, it is not the place of Welsh Ministers to make provisions regarding the making of applications for site licences.

I am also happy to consider with the Member in charge whether provision should be made for utility bills to be displayed publicly on site. As I said earlier, the fit-and-proper-person test is a vital part of the Bill, with the addition that a firearms offence be included in the list of considerations. However, I believe that it is sufficient for this to be introduced for site managers only, which will include owners if they manage their own site. I agree with Peter Black here. As he said in committee, applying the test to owners if they are not involved in day-to-day management would be

'difficult to enforce and quite burdensome'.

Mae cartrefi symudol yn fath gwerthfawr o lety, yn enwedig i bobl hŷn. Mae dyletswydd arnom i sicrhau y caiff preswylwyr a pherchnogion safleoedd cartrefi symudol eu diogelu o dan y gyfraith. Er mai ychydig iawn ohonynt sydd, rhaid cael gwared ar berchnogion diegwyddor a'r arferion annheg a ddisgrifiwyd gan bobl eraill yma heddiw. Yn fy marn i, mae a wnelo hyn â gorfodi i raddau helaeth. Mae lluo o bwerau ar gael i awdurdodau lleol, ond rhaid inni eu helpu i orfodi'r gyfraith, er enghraifft drwy eu galluogi i adennill eu costau.

Fodd bynnag, ni chredaf fod angen cyfundrefn trwyddedu safleoedd ychwanegol. Byddai'r Bil fel y safai, i bob diben wedi creu haen arall o drwyddedu safleoedd yng Nghymru. Bwriadaf gyflwyno gwelliannau yng Nghyfnod 2 i sicrhau y bydd cyfundrefn drwyddedu safleoedd unigol yn parhau, gyda'r system bresennol yn cael ei chadw a'i moderneiddio'n briodol. Yn gysylltiedig â hyn, mae'n gwbl hanfodol bod darpariaethau yn y Bil yn ymarferol ochr yn ochr â deddfwriaeth gyfredol. Byddaf hefyd yn cyflwyno gwelliannau i sicrhau bod hynny'n digwydd. Rwyf am bwysleisio, wrth wneud hyn, y byddaf yn sicrhau ein bod yn cadw elfennau pwysig eraill Bil Peter a gefnogaf, megis y prawf person addas a phriodol a diwedd ar y feto i bob diben ar werthu cartref.

Hoffwn dreulio ychydig o amser yn ystyried gwaith rhagorol y ddau bwyllgor a fu'n craffu ar y Bil yng Nghyfnod 1. Ceisïaf ymdrin â'u prif bryderon yn yr ychydig amser sydd gennyf heddiw. Yn gyntaf, hoffwn dawelu meddyliau Cadeiryddion y pwyllgorau a'r Siambr gyfan y bydd fy swyddogion yn parhau i weithio'n agos gyda'r Aelod sy'n gyfrifol a chlercod y pwyllgorau i sicrhau y gallwn greu'r system trwyddedu safleoedd orau bosibl. Rhannaf bryderon y ddau bwyllgor am nifer y darpariaethau is-ddeddfwriaethol, a byddaf yn anelu at leihau'r pwerau hynny, lle mae darpariaeth eisoes yn bodoli, drwy ddiwygio'r gyfraith bresennol. Er enghraifft, nid lle Gweinidogion Cymru yw gwneud darpariaethau ynghylch gwneud ceisiadau am drwyddedau safle.

Rwyf hefyd yn fodlon ystyried ar y cyd â'r Aelod sy'n gyfrifol a ddylid darparu ar gyfer arddangos biliau cyfleustodau yn gyhoeddus ar y safle. Fel y dywedais yn gynharach, mae'r prawf person addas a phriodol yn rhan hanfodol o'r Bil, a dylid ychwanegu trosedd sy'n ymwneud â drylliau yn y rhestr o ystyriaethau. Fodd bynnag, credaf ei bod yn ddigonol i hyn gael ei gyflwyno ar gyfer rheolwyr safleoedd yn unig, a fydd yn cynnwys perchnogion os ydynt yn rheoli eu safle eu hunain. Cytunaf â Peter Black yn hyn o beth. Fel y dywedodd yn y pwyllgor, byddai cymhwyso'r prawf at berchnogion os nad ydynt yn rheoli'r safle o ddydd i ddydd yn

anodd ei orfodi ac yn eithaf beichus.

With regard to sale blocking, I agree with the Communities, Equality and Local Government committee that the approach being taken in England is appealing here. I intend to table an amendment at Stage 2 to make it a requirement that the veto on sales will not apply to future agreements between site owners and residents. In the case of existing agreements, a site owner may object to the sale by applying to the residential property tribunal for a refusal order preventing the occupier from selling the mobile home and assigning the agreement.

The distinction between new and existing agreements is important. It would be unfair to remove the consent requirement in respect of existing agreements. This was, after all, something that owners and residents agreed at the time they entered into them. By including the opportunity for site owners to apply for a refusal order, any change to the site owner's ability to exercise control over his land is limited.

Finally, I do not support the recommendation that further powers are needed for unannounced entry onto sites by local authority officers. Current legislation already provides that 24 hours' notice is required for admission to land unless a Justice of the Peace authorises a local authority officer to enter the land.

Once again, I thank everyone who has contributed to this debate and I am grateful for the support shown for the Bill. While I am not able to address all the points made, due to the time available, I will consider each in detail, alongside the Member in charge. The Welsh Government has tabled the financial resolution for the Bill, which will be moved immediately after this debate. I urge Members to vote in favour of the general principles of this Bill.

O ran atal gwerthu cartref, cytunaf â'r Pwyllgor Cymunedau, Cydraddoldeb a Llywodraeth Leol fod y dull gweithredu a ddefnyddir yn Lloegr yn apelio o ran hyn. Bwriadaf gyflwyno gwelliant yng Nghyfnod 2 i'w gwneud yn ofyniad na fydd y feto ar werthu cartref yn gymwys i gytundebau rhwng perchnogion safleoedd a phreswylwyr yn y dyfodol. Yn achos cytundebau sy'n bodoli eisoes, caiff perchennog safle wrthwynebu gwerthiant drwy wneud cais i'r tribiwnlys eiddo preswyl am orchymyn gwrthod sy'n atal y deiliad rhag gwerthu'r cartref symudol ac aseinio'r cytundeb.

Mae'r gwahaniaeth rhwng cytundebau newydd a chytundeb sy'n bodoli eisoes yn bwysig. Byddai'n annheg cael gwared ar y gofyniad am ganiatâd mewn perthynas â chytundebau sy'n bodoli eisoes. Roedd hyn, wedi'r cyfan, yn rhywbeth y cytunodd perchnogion a phreswylwyr arno pan ymrwymwyd i'r cytundeb. Drwy gynnwys y cyfle i berchnogion safleoedd wneud cais am orchymyn gwrthod, bydd unrhyw newid i allu perchennog y safle i arfer rheolaeth dros ei dir yn gyfyngedig.

Yn olaf, ni chefnogaf yr argymhelliad bod angen pwerau pellach i swyddogion yr awdurdod lleol gael mynediad dirybudd i safleoedd. Mae'r ddeddfwriaeth bresennol eisoes yn darparu bod angen rhoi 24 awr o rybudd cyn cael mynediad i dir oni bai bod Ynad Heddwch yn awdurdodi swyddog awdurdod lleol i fynd ar y tir.

Unwaith eto, hoffwn ddiolch i bawb sydd wedi cyfrannu at y ddadl hon ac rwy'n ddiolchgar am y gefnogaeth i'r Bil. Er na allaf ymdrin â'r holl bwyntiau a wnaed, oherwydd yr amser sydd ar gael, byddaf yn ystyried pob un yn fanwl, ochr yn ochr â'r Aelod sy'n gyfrifol. Mae Llywodraeth Cymru wedi cyflwyno'r penderfyniad ariannol ar gyfer y Bil, a fydd yn cael ei gynnal yn union ar ôl y ddadl hon. Anogaf yr Aelodau i bleidleisio o blaid egwyddorion cyffredinol y Bil hwn.

There are around 3,500 mobile homes located at some 92 residential park sites across Wales, and many residents are vulnerable because of age or ill health. That is why reports of harassment, intimidation, exploitation and sharp practice by a small minority of site operators are so disturbing, although only a small minority of site operators are guilty of the worst offences. Last month, a company that owned an Isle of Wight mobile home site was ordered to pay more than £300,000 after pleading guilty to 11 charges, including intimidation of residents and the blocking of mobile home sales.

Mae tua 3,500 o gartrefi symudol wedi'u lleoli mewn oddeutu 92 o safleoedd parciau preswyl ledled Cymru, ac mae llawer o'r preswylwyr yn agored i niwed oherwydd eu hoedran neu afiechyd. Dyna pam mae adroddiadau o aflonyddu, bygwth, camfanteisio a drwg-arfer gan leiafrif bach o weithredwyr safleoedd mor annifyr, er mai dim ond lleiafrif bach o weithredwyr safleoedd sy'n euog o'r troseddau gwaethaf. Fis diwethaf, gorchmynnwyd i gwmni sy'n berchen ar safle cartrefi symudol ar Ynys Wyth dalu dros £300,000 ar ôl pledio'n euog i 11 o gyhuddiadau, gan gynnwys bygwth preswylwyr ac atal gwerthu cartrefi symudol.

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Last June, a park home owner and constituent in Wrexham e-mailed to say that he had found that he was being illegally charged for electricity and water. With able representation, the site owner was forced to charge him for water and electricity in the correct way. About three years ago, a close neighbour of his used the ombudsman to shake Wrexham council out of its inertia regarding the site owner illegally siting homes in his park. The borough solicitor successfully prosecuted the owner. My constituent added that, if possible, site owners should be kept out of a home sale.

This legislation is, therefore, required to update the mobile home licensing regime and to address the issues experienced by residents in mobile home sites in Wales. Previous evidence from the Minister noted there is a heavy reliance on Order making and supplementary legislation later. So, in relation to a number of issues, we would ask why they were not included in the Bill to begin with. I am pleased that that is now being taken forward.

One of the unforeseen consequences of the Bill might be that it drives people out of the permanent housing licensing regime and into the holiday licensing regime. Residents should be consulted before any change of use. After I noted that a site operator could apply for a holiday park licence when it was not really a holiday park, I asked the Minister whether we should consider some requirement for a local authority to require the site operator applying for a change of use or a holiday park licence to show that they had made reasonable checks to ensure that their residents have a primary home elsewhere. The reply I received from his official was, 'Yes, definitely'. Amen to that.

When I questioned the British Holiday and Home Parks Association about its general support for the fit-and-proper-person test, it said that, by reducing the criteria and directing them to where the real problems are, you could have a more effective system and, most importantly, a more effective deterrent. It said that that is what it wants: it wants to see these people leave the industry so that residents can live happily in their park homes. It also commented that requiring only site managers to pass a fit-and-proper-person test would leave the door open for very nasty people to own park home sites and employ somebody else to run them.

A fortnight ago, I received an e-mail from the Park Home Owners Justice Campaign. Three years ago, it started its campaign to change the law to stop sale blocking. In about three weeks' time, it will have brought about a change in the law. It said that that is great news for park home residents in England, but it now looks to the Assembly to do its part and hopes that it is not too long before there is similar legislation in Wales. We will support that legislation in Wales.

Gyda chynrychiolaeth fedrus, gorfodwyd perchennog y safle i godi arno am ddŵr a thrydan yn y ffordd gywir. Tua thair blynedd yn ôl, defnyddiodd cymydog agos iddo yr ombwdsmon i ysgwyd Cyngor Wrecsam o'i ddifaterwch pan aeth perchennog y safle ati i leoli cartrefi yn ei barc yn anghyfreithlon. Dygodd cyfreithiwr y fwrdeistref achos yn erbyn y perchennog yn llwyddiannus. Ychwanegodd fy etholwr na ddylai perchnogion safleoedd fod yn rhan o'r broses o werthu cartref, os oes modd.

Mae angen y ddeddfwriaeth hon, felly, i ddiweddarur' gyfundrefn trwyddedu cartrefi symudol a mynd i'r afael â'r problemau a brofir gan breswylwyr mewn safleoedd cartrefi symudol yng Nghymru. Nododd tystiolaeth flaenorol gan y Gweinidog fod dibyniaeth drom ar wneud Gorchmynion a deddfwriaeth atodol yn ddiweddarach. Felly, mewn perthynas â nifer o faterion, byddem yn gofyn pam na chawsant eu cynnwys yn y Bil ar y dechrau. Rwy'n falch bod camau yn cael eu cymryd o ran hynny bellach.

Efallai mai un o ganlyniadau annisgwyl y Bil yw y bydd yn gorfodi pobl i newid o'r gyfundrefn trwyddedu tai parhaol i'r gyfundrefn trwyddedu gwyliau. Dylid ymgynghori â phreswylwyr cyn gwneud unrhyw newid defnydd. Ar ôl imi nodi y gallai gweithredwr safle wneud cais am drwydded parc gwyliau er nad oedd yn barc gwyliau mewn gwirionedd, gofynnais i'r Gweinidog a ddylem ystyried rhoi rhyw ofyniad ar awdurdod lleol i'w gwneud yn ofynnol i weithredwr y safle sy'n gwneud cais am newid defnydd neu drwydded parc gwyliau ddangos ei fod wedi cynnal gwiriadau rhesymol i sicrhau bod gan ei breswylwyr brif gartref yn rhywle arall. Yr ateb a gefais oddi wrth ei swyddog, oedd 'Dylid, yn bendant'. Amen i hynny.

Pan holais Gymdeithas Parciau Gwyliau a Pharciau Cartrefi Prydain am ei chefnogaeth gyffredinol i'r prawf person addas a phriodol, dywedodd, drwy leihau'r meini prawf a'u cyfeirio at y mannau lle mae problemau go iawn, y gallech gael system fwy effeithiol ac, yn bwysicaf oll, ddull gweithredu ataliol mwy effeithiol. Dywedodd mai dyna'r hyn a ddymuna: mae am weld y bobl hyn yn gadael y diwydiant fel y gall preswylwyr fyw'n ddedydd yn eu cartrefi mewn parciau. Dywedodd hefyd y byddai ei gwneud yn ofynnol i reolwyr safleoedd yn unig basio prawf person addas a phriodol yn golygu y gallai pobl gas iawn fod yn berchen ar safleoedd cartrefi mewn parciau a chyflogi rhywun arall i'w rhedeg.

Bythefnos yn ôl, derbyniais e-bost gan Ymgyrch Cyfiawnder Perchnogion Cartrefi mewn Parciau. Dair blynedd yn ôl, dechreuodd ei ymgyrch i newid y gyfraith i roi rhyfyn ar atal gwerthu cartrefi. Ymhen tua thair wythnos, bydd wedi llwyddo i sicrhau newid yn y gyfraith. Dywedod fod hyn yn newyddion gwych i breswylwyr cartrefi mewn parciau yn Lloegr, ond mae'n disgwyl i'r Cynulliad chwarae ei ran yn awr ac mae'n gobeithio y bydd deddfwriaeth debyg yng Nghymru cyn hir. Byddwn yn cefnogi'r deddfwriaeth honno yng Nghymru.

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Rwyf hefyd yn croesawu cyflwyniad y Bil yng Nghyfnod 1 heddiw ac yn llongyfarch Peter Black am ei osod o'n blaenau. Mae dau safle cartrefi symudol yn etholaeth Llanelli: Parc Aber yn Llangennech a Poplar Court yn Cross Hands. Rwyf wedi cwrdd â rhai o'm hetholwyr sy'n byw yn y safleoedd hyn i wrando ar eu pryderon. Mae eu pryderon yn bwysig ac yn deillio o hen reolau'r safleoedd hynny. Fel Ann Jones a'r Gweinidog yn gynharach, rwyf hefyd yn croesawu'n arbennig un o brif nodau'r Bil, sef cyflwyno prawf person addas a phriodol ar gyfer rheolwyr. I have met with some of my constituents who live on these sites to listen to their concerns. Their concerns are important and emerge from old rules governing these sites. Like Ann Jones and the Minister earlier, I also welcome in particular one of the main aims of the Bill, which is to introduce a fit-and-proper-person text for managers. It is crucial that that forms part of the licensing system.

I will certainly continue to meet with my constituents and to listen to them on this issue and take action on their behalf.

Mae'n bwysig nodi bod y fframwaith rheoleiddiol hwnnw yn bwysig nid yn unig i berchnogion y cartrefi symudol hyn, ond i berchnogion a rheolwyr y safleoedd sydd am ymddwyn mewn ffordd gyfrifol. Roedd angen y fframwaith hwn ar gyfer y naill a'r llall. Credaf ein bod yn cynorthwyo perchnogion a rheolwr safleoedd ledled Cymru trwy gyflwyno'r fframwaith hwn.

On behalf of the Plaid Cymru group, I warmly welcome this Bill in this stage of the legislative process. Some of us have been raising this matter consistently since 1999, and it is good to see that, by now, a Bill is actually going through the legislative process that will create a regulatory framework for this particular area. It is important to note that that regulatory framework is important to, not just the owners of the mobile homes, but the owners and managers of the sites who wish to act in a responsible manner. This framework was needed for both sets of people. I believe that we are assisting both owners and site managers throughout Wales by introducing this framework.

Rwy'n falch iawn o weld bod Peter wedi cydweithio â'r ddau bwyllgor, a'i fod wedi cydweithio â'r Gweinidog. Mae wedi ymateb yn gadarnhaol i'r awgrymiadau sydd wedi dod o'r naill bwyllgor a'r llall. We have had an opportunity to discuss these issues at length. What we have been waiting for in Wales, for a long time, is an opportunity to act in this field.

However, I understand the nature of that delay and am willing to put up with that, because, ultimately, we will have legislation in Wales that will ensure that the people living on these sites, the people managing these sites, and the people who own these sites, will have a regulatory framework that will be appropriate for them all.

As Members will know, I have a number of mobile home sites in my constituency. I know that when they are well run, they provide comfortable homes, often in an idyllic setting, and people are very happy. However, I also know that, when they are badly run, they can be a living hell for the people who find themselves there—a living hell that they often cannot escape from because of the ability of the park owner to block sales. It can be a terrible situation in which to live.

The legislation proposed by my colleague comes at the end of a long line of attempts by the Chamber to improve conditions for people living on mobile home sites. I pay tribute to Jocelyn Davies, the former Deputy Minister for Housing and Regeneration, who took a great deal of interest in this issue. She met constituents of mine on many occasions, and used the powers that she had then to try to improve terms and conditions. However, it is only now, since our referendum and since we have the law-making powers available to us, that we can really make a difference on behalf of my constituents and people the length and breadth of Wales.

I congratulate my colleague, Peter Black, on the work that he has done on this issue, although I remain peeved that it was his name that came out of the ballot. [Laughter.] I thank Ann Jones, who chaired the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee's scrutiny of the Bill at Stage 1. I was very pleased to work alongside other committee colleagues on this piece of legislation, which I believe is long overdue and very much needed. That belief was one that was reinforced by the evidence that the committee received from residents living in mobile park homes across Wales. I am glad that Peter Black has found the committee's report useful, and I am pleased that the additional suggestions that the committee put forward, such as the requirement to publicly display utility bills, has been accepted by Peter. The approach outlined by Peter today—I cannot quite recall the word that the Deputy Presiding Officer used—is indeed unusual, but it does overcome some of the issues related to the level of detail left to regulations in the Bill as it was currently drafted, which was problematic for the Member in charge, the Government, and caused some concerns to the committee. While this may indeed delay the start of Stage 2, I hope that it will ultimately mean that the protection that mobile park home owners need will be more readily available if we can put more on the face of the Bill, as outlined by the Minister for housing and Peter Black. I am pleased about the assurances given by Peter Black today, which means that, if the Assembly is willing, the Bill will be passed into law by the end of the summer term.

Cyfarfu ag etholwyr i mi ar sawl achlysur, a defnyddiodd y pwerau a oedd ganddi ar y pryd i geisio gwella telerau ac amodau. Rwy'n falch o gael y sicrwydd a roddwyd gan Peter Black heddiw, sy'n golygu, os bydd y Cynulliad yn fodlon, y bydd y Bil yn mynd yn gyfraith gwlad erbyn diwedd tymor yr haf.

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I am particularly glad to see the inclusion and support for the fit-and-proper-person test, and the right to end the veto by park owners is absolutely essential. However, as highlighted by Mark Isherwood, concerns have been expressed about whether the rogue element in this industry will look to escape this regulation via applying for a change of use and moving out of the permanent residency sector into the holiday home sector. That is a cause of concern to some people who are currently living in mobile park homes. However, I would be grateful to hear what reassurances Peter Black could give about how the law could be attuned to address that. That was always a danger if we brought legislation forward, but the need for the legislation outweighs the danger of those rogue elements applying for a change of use. Ultimately, it will be down to local authorities, in whom I have confidence, to be able to spot a rogue site owner acting in that way and protect local residents if change of use applications come in.

It seems from listening to speakers around the Chamber today that this Bill will pass to Stage 2, and I look forward to an extended residency on the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee to consider it.

I also congratulate Peter Black for bringing this Bill forward, and for the way in which he has worked and positively engaged, not only with the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee, but the Minister and the Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee, as regards the future of the Bill. I want to make a short contribution to today's debate in relation to the difficulty I have with the Bill in its current form. I will be supporting the Bill because there are abuses on mobile home sites that need to be addressed. However, like others in the Chamber who have spoken about the holiday industry, and caravan industry in particular, I am disappointed that the scope of the Bill is not allowed to address the potential for abuses on those sites. Let us face it; some similar things to what are happening on mobile home sites are also happening on caravan parks, including in my own constituency. It is appropriate that, at some point in the future, the Welsh Government should be able to come forward with legislation in order to address some of those concerns.

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There is no doubt in my mind that we need a fit-and-proper-person test for caravan park owners, as well as mobile home site owners. There is no doubt in my mind that we need to scrap the veto on caravan owners being able to sell their holiday homes, as well as the veto that will be provided for on the face of Peter Black's Bill. People may think that this is only a small problem in Wales, but it is quite a significant one, which is getting bigger and worse. We all know that Conwy council in north Wales has worked very closely with Denbighshire council to try to identify the scale of the abuse by some caravan park owners. We know that thousands of people are living in caravans on holiday sites, using those caravans as their main homes and taking advantage of local services, for which they do not contribute anything in council tax, and for which the NHS and local authorities are not receiving funds to be able to provide those services. Therefore, it is a growing issue in terms of its scale, and it is one that, if it goes unchecked for too much longer, will unfortunately lead to the demise of our caravan holiday industry in some parts of the country.

Therefore, while I am absolutely with you in terms of this legislation, Peter, I am disappointed that the scope of the Bill does not incorporate holiday caravan parks. I look to you, Minister, to address some of the concerns that have been raised in respect of caravan sites in north Wales, as well as in other parts of the country, in the future, through improvements to the licensing regime.

As a member of the Communities, Equality and Local Government Committee, who listened to all the evidence from the various witnesses, I support this Bill going forward to Stage 2. As a committee, I believe that we have listened to the views, and have reported evenly and fairly on the aspects that were raised and the concerns that were voiced. I am particularly supportive of the need to avoid the unintended consequence of the site owner's right to approve the sales of mobile homes, and that it should include suitable protection for site owners, buyers and existing community residents as a whole.

I thank all the Members who have participated today. I particularly wish to thank Kirsty Williams, my leader, who initially raised this issue in the Chamber, on many occasions, and is still miffed at the fact that I beat her in the ballot; I will never, ever hear the last of it. [Laughter.]

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In response to several of the points that have been made, particularly by the Chairs of the two committees, the changes that I have outlined today—which will hopefully be brought forward as amendments in Stage 2—will lead to having more detail on the face of the Bill. Furthermore, these changes will dispense with the double licensing regime, which I believe both committees were concerned about, and will provide greater clarity. They will also provide a stand-alone approach for Wales, which is important in terms of starting to create that Welsh legislative statute book, if you like, for Welsh-only Bills.

I understand the points that were made by Kirsty and by Mark Isherwood in terms of the unforeseen consequences of site owners possibly looking to change the use of their site. Ultimately, the reasonableness of the licensing regime is the best bulwark against that. If we approach this in a reasonable way, and ensure that we are doing this to protect residents, and not to penalise the site owners, I believe that most site owners will go along with it and consider it to be a business cost that they will have to bear in order to stay in the business. I do not believe that this regime, or the regime that we are planning to replace it with, will add a significantly greater cost to site owners, which would cause their businesses to become unprofitable. I believe that they will still be able to make a profit, but at the same time, they will be within a proper, modern licensing regime, which means that those owners will also be within a regulated industry. That will hopefully help them to attract people to buy units on their site, which will also help. However, I believe that I have said—and I believe that the Minister is also open to this—that we will consider a clause that notes that residents will be consulted before a change of use. I believe that that will also help as part of that.

I agree with Keith Davies that a fit-and-proper-person test is crucial. I share the Minister's view that this should apply to the manager if we are going to make this regime work properly. I believe that the balance of evidence to the committee also supported that. I do not believe that it is impractical to include the owner in that, particularly if they are not going to be the manager on the site. All sorts of consequences and issues arise should it be applied to virtually anybody who has any ownership on the site. That will have to be considered at Stage 2. I do not envy the committees, because the changes that we will make at Stage 2 will be substantial. I am not quite sure how they will handle that in terms of taking the amendments forward. However, I will certainly undertake to publish those amendments as early as possible so that other Members can table amendments too and we can have a proper debate on that.

I understand Darren Millar's difficulty about holiday caravan sites and I understand that he has a particularly sticky situation in his constituency in that regard. Darren, had you not chosen bubble gum rather than this particular issue yourself, you would not be in such a sticky situation. [Laughter.] However, there may be opportunities through future ballots for you or other Members to bring forward other changes to this to include holiday caravan sites as well. The fact that we have a stand-alone, Wales-only Bill will make it easy to amend part of that as well. There are other issues in the 1960 Act apart from holiday caravan sites and residential sites that may need to be addressed in future, which the Minister might even be considering as part of his housing Bill.

Therefore, in conclusion, I thank everybody for their support and forbearance with regard to the changes that I have to make to this Bill and the way in which we are dealing with this. I hope that we will be able to get this Bill on the statute book before we come back in the autumn.

I move the motion in my name and with the names of Jocelyn Davies, Paul Davies, Mick Antoniw, Darren Millar, Suzy Davies, William Powell, Angela Burns, Mark Isherwood, David Rees, Vaughan Gething, Julie Morgan, Ann Jones, Christine Chapman, David Melding, Joyce Watson and Mohammad Asghar.

I am very pleased to be able to propose the latest motion in the series of backbench-initiated debates, which have been a feature of this fourth Assembly. I know that my fellow sponsors, Paul Davies and William Powell, hope to contribute to the debate, which will be answered on behalf of the proposers by Jocelyn Davies. I am very grateful to all of those Members for their sustained interest and for their support, and to all of those Members from all parties who subscribed to the motion once it was submitted.

Devolution in Wales was delivered on a promise of conducting democracy differently. The National Assembly was not simply to be a new institution, but a new sort of institution, conducting its business in a new way, setting new standards for openness, inclusivity and accountability. In very many ways, the practice has lived up to the promise. Today's modest proposal is entirely in line with that history, because if much has already been put in place, it is quite certainly not to say that more could and should not be done to build further on those achievements. I said 'modest' because the motion does not seek to invent some new or novel procedure, but to learn from what is now already well-established and successfully put into practice elsewhere.

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In 2007, the then Government at Westminster laid out a new agenda for constitutional reform. One of its proposals was to introduce the right of parliamentary select committees to hold pre-appointment hearings for a limited number of high-profile public appointments. The White Paper, which the Government of the time published, suggested that, across the United Kingdom, Ministers make more than 3,800 public appointments every year. With the growth in regulation and inspection, the White Paper argued, some of the bigger regulators and senior public appointments wield significant political power. In response, since 2008, in the House of Commons, relevant select committees have scrutinised the decisions of Ministers in making major public appointments. The two most recent, for example, have involved the Treasury Committee's scrutiny of the proposed new Governor of the Bank of England, and the Business, Innovation and Skills Committee's endorsement of Christine Tacon as the newly created Groceries Code Adjudicator. Those of us who propose today's motion here simply believe that the time has come for the committees of the National Assembly to discharge the same oversight and to provide the same guarantee of democratic legitimacy as is now available in comparable circumstances elsewhere.

While the idea of parliamentary oversight of executive decision making in public appointments was a new departure, practice has been more incremental than radical. Ministers at Westminster retain all their executive authority to set job descriptions, to advertise, to short-list, to interview and identify a candidate for appointment. In an agreed number of major appointments, select committees conduct an oral hearing with that candidate and publish a report on that person's suitability. Even then, Ministers retain entirely the power to go ahead with an appointment whatever views a select committee might have reached.

In 2001, after the last general election and with a number of years of experience to draw upon, the House of Commons Liaison Committee reported on that experience and endorsed the basic proposition that major public appointments should be subject to parliamentary scrutiny. Some original fears that such hearings might deter able candidates from applying for high-profile public appointments have not been borne out in practice. Rather, the committee concluded that five major advantages could now be clearly identified for the new system. Pre-appointment hearings had, first, delivered greater scrutiny of the quality of ministerial decision making. Secondly, it had provided public reassurance that the appointments were made solely on merit. Thirdly, they had enhanced the legitimacy for the appointment made. Fourthly, public evidence of the independence of mind of the endorsed office holder had been secured and, finally, the system had provided a greater opportunity for approved candidates to understand parliamentary expectation of the post they occupy.

Yn y ddwy enghraifft ddiweddaraf, bu Pwyllgor y Trysorlys yn craffu ar Lywodraethwr newydd arfaethedig Banc Lloegr, a chymeradwyodd y Pwyllgor Busnes, Arloesedd a Sgiliau Christine Tacon fel y Dyfarnwr Cod Cyflenwi Bwydydd newydd. Yn syml, mae'r rheini ohonom sy'n cynnig y cynnig yma heddiw o'r farn ei bod yn bryd i bwyllgorau'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol arddel yr un swyddogaethau goruchwyllo a darparu'r un warant o ran dilystrwydd democrataidd ag sydd bellach ar gael o dan amgylchiadau tebyg mewn mannau eraill.

Er bod y syniad o drosolwg seneddol o'r broses o wneud penderfyniadau gweithredol ym maes penodiadau cyhoeddus yn wriad newydd, bu'r arfer yn fwy graddol na radical. Gweinidogion yn San Steffan sydd â'r holl awdurdod gweithredol i bennu disgrifiadau swydd, i hysbysebu, i lunio rhestr fer, i gyfweld ac i ddewis ymgeisydd i'w benodi o hyd. Mewn nifer benodedig o benodiadau pwysig, bydd pwyllgorau dethol yn cynnal gwrandawriad llafar gyda'r ymgeisydd ac yn cyhoeddi adroddiad ar addasrwydd yr unigolyn hwnnw. Hyd yn oed wedyn, gall Gweinidogion barhau i benodi unigolyn ni waeth beth fydd barn pwyllgor dethol.

Yn 2001, ar ôl yr etholiad cyffredinol diwethaf a chyda nifer o flynyddoedd o brofiad i'w hystyried, cyflwynodd Pwyllgor Cyswllt Tŷ'r Cyffredin adroddiad ar y profiad hwnnw gan gymeradwyo'r cynnig sylfaenol y dylai penodiadau cyhoeddus pwysig fod yn destun gweithdrefnau craffu seneddol. Ni chadarnhawyd rhai o'r ofnau gwreiddiol y byddai gwrandawiadau o'r fath o bosibl yn atal ymgeiswyr cymwys rhag ymgeisio am benodiadau cyhoeddus proffil uchel. Yn hytrach, daeth y pwyllgor i'r casgliad y gellir bellach nodi pum prif fantais mewn perthynas â'r system newydd. Yn gyntaf, roedd gwrandawiadau cyn penodi yn golygu bod trefniadau gwell ar waith ar gyfer craffu ar benderfyniadau gweinidogion. Yn ail, roeddent wedi rhoi sicrwydd i'r cyhoedd bod y penodiadau yn cael eu gwneud ar sail teilyngdod llwyr. Yn drydydd, roeddent wedi gwella cyfreithlondeb y penodiad a wnaed. Yn bedwerydd, cafwyd tystiolaeth gyhoeddus fod y deiliad swydd a gymeradwywyd yn annibynnol ac, yn olaf, roedd y system yn rhoi gwell cyfle i'r ymgeiswyr a gymeradwywyd ddeall y disgwyliadau seneddol o ran y swydd a gyflawnant.

Now, what might all this mean for Wales? The Welsh Government's website lists 16 major bodies, each of which has a publicly appointed chair. These include, for example, the Arts Council of Wales, the Care Council for Wales, the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales and the Sports Council for Wales. In addition, the commissioners for children, older persons and the Welsh language are all major posts of the sort which, in Westminster, would involve a direct parliamentary stage in the appointment process.

It is not the purpose of this motion to set out a definitive list before the National Assembly. Our ambitions, as I said at the outset, are more modest. We seek an agreement this afternoon to the principle of pre-appointment hearings. In Westminster, the actual list of appointments to be subject to pre-appointment hearings was agreed between the Executive and the Parliament using the office of the Speaker of the House of Commons to help bring that about. I am very grateful for the opportunities that I have had to discuss the possibility of pre-appointment hearings with both the First Minister and the Presiding Officer. I have no doubt at all that if this motion is agreed today, the practical arrangements to introduce a new system and to make a start on it all can be put in place very quickly. That is the key point. There are practical matters to consider, of course. There are decisions to be made about where we make a start on all of this, but making a start is the most important thing of all. Once we are embarked on this course of action, just as they have found it in the House of Commons, I am confident that here, too, we will learn from that experience and develop a system that works for us. In that way, a further step will have been taken in confirming the reputation of this Assembly as the voice of people in Wales, and the guarantor that their views will be heard in critical decisions that are made in their name.

Yn eu plith, er enghraifft, mae Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru, Cyngor Gofal Cymru, Cyngor Cyllido Addysg Uwch Cymru a Chyngor Chwaraeon Cymru. Yn ogystal, mae'r Comisiynydd Plant, y Comisiynydd Pobl Hŷn a Chomisiynydd y Gymraeg oll yn swyddi pwysig o'r math y byddai'r broses benodi ar eu cyfer, yn San Steffan, yn cynnwys cam seneddol uniongyrchol.

Nid diben y cynnig hwn yw cyflwyno rhestr ddiffiniol gerbron y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol. Mae ein dyheadau, fel y dywedais ar y dechrau, yn symlach. Rydym am sicrhau cytundeb y prynhawn yma i'r egwyddor o wrandawiadau cyn penodi. Yn San Steffan, cytunodd y Weithrediaeth a'r Senedd ar y rhestr wirioneddol o benodiadau a fyddai'n destun gwrandawiadau cyn penodi gan ddefnyddio swyddfa Llefarydd Tŷ'r Cyffredin i helpu yn hynny o beth. Rwy'n ddiolchgar iawn am y cyfleoedd a gefais i drafod y posibilrwydd o wrandawiadau cyn penodi gyda Phrif Weinidog Cymru a'r Llywydd. I am pleased to add my name to this motion led by Mark Drakeford and supported by Members of all four political parties in this Chamber.

I believe that, as in other places, we should be holding pre-confirmation hearings for major public appointments in Wales. This is a debate not between political parties, but about the relationship between the Executive and the legislature, and about strengthening the democratic scrutiny of public appointments. The rationale for proposing pre-appointment hearings is based on increasing the democratic scrutiny of public appointments, and on providing greater public reassurance that those appointed to key public offices are appointed on pure merit. The whole idea of having a public hearing would also allow us to understand more about the candidates taking up a public role, and encourage greater political accountability for major appointments.

Mae'n bleser gennyf ychwanegu fy enw at y cynnig hwn a arweinir gan Mark Drakeford ac a gefnogir gan Aelodau o bob un o'r pedair plaid wleidyddol yn y Siambr hon.

Credaf, fel mewn mannau eraill, y dylem fod yn cynnal gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau ar gyfer penodiadau cyhoeddus pwysig yng Nghymru. Nid dadl rhwng pleidiau gwleidyddol mo'r ddadl hon, ond dadl am y gydberthynas rhwng y Weithrediaeth a'r ddeddfwrfa, ac am atgyfnerthu'r broses graffu ddemocrataidd ar gyfer penodiadau cyhoeddus. Mae'r rhesymeg dros gynnis gwrandawiadau cyn penodi yn seiliedig ar gynyddu'r trefniadau craffu democrataidd ar gyfer penodiadau cyhoeddus, ac ar roi mwy o sicrwydd i'r cyhoedd y caiff y rheini a benodir i swyddi cyhoeddus allweddol eu penodi ar sail teilyngdod llwyr. Byddai'r cysyniad cyfan o gynnal gwrandawiad cyhoeddus hefyd yn esgor ar well dealltwriaeth o'r ymgeiswyr sy'n ymgymryd â rôl cyhoeddus, ac yn annog mwy o atebolrwydd gwleidyddol dros benodiadau pwysig.

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As Mark Drakeford has outlined, the UK Government's 2010 coalition agreement promised to increase scrutiny of public bodies, particularly through increasing the powers of select committees to scrutinise potential appointees. Members may be familiar with the House of Commons Liaison Committee's report in September 2011 on select committees and public appointments, which reviewed the process of pre-confirmation hearings by select committees. It noted that they had been a success and that the procedure represented a modest step forward in securing the democratic accountability of ministerial decision-making. While that report went on to list a number of issues that needed to be refined, the overarching message was that pre-confirmation hearings for major public appointments were a good thing.

Since the introduction of the pre-confirmation hearing system at Westminster, a number of further enhancements to this procedure have been agreed by the UK Government. The chairs of select committees now meet with the appointing Minister early on in this process to discuss the role and job description of the post under consideration, the criteria against which candidates are to be approved and to clarify expectations. Committees will also be provided with additional broad contextual information about the number of applicants and their reduction through the long-listing and short-listing process, so that the final nomination can be better understood.

Quite simply, what we are calling for today is for the National Assembly to seriously consider implementing a similar process in Wales. I believe that anyone who is politically appointed, other than the appointments of Ministers, should have their appointment fully scrutinised through a pre-confirmation hearing before that appointment is confirmed. I would like to think that I have been fairly consistent on this issue, given that I called for the National Assembly to play a much greater role in the appointment of the Welsh Language Commissioner during scrutiny of the Welsh Language (Wales) Measure 2011. Unfortunately, my suggestions at that time were rejected, and it was suggested that checks and balances were already built into the appointment process to ensure that it was open, transparent and fair. I am not challenging the fact that there are checks and balances in place currently, but introducing a pre-confirmation hearing would strengthen the process and make it more open and transparent. Therefore, I am pleased to have another opportunity to discuss this very important issue in the Assembly Chamber, and, alongside other Members, to use this opportunity to persuade the Assembly to seriously consider this proposal.

I believe that the relevant Assembly committees should have a role in scrutinising a public appointment. For example, the appointment of the children's commissioner should be fully scrutinised by the Children and Young People Committee. In these circumstances, members of relevant committees would be familiar with the general policy area and would be in a stronger position to scrutinise the public appointment. They would also be in a position to pose relevant questions to the candidate on their field of work. This information would then be made publically available so that the people of Wales can be witness to the democratic process as it develops.

Fel yr amlinellodd Mark Drakeford, addawodd cytundeb clymblaid Llywodraeth y DU yn 2010 y byddai'n cynyddu'r trefniadau craffu ar gyfer cyrff cyhoeddus, yn arbennig drwy gynyddu pwerau pwyllgorau dethol i graffu ar ddarpar benodeion. Efallai y bydd yr Aelodau yn gyfarwydd ag adroddiad Pwyllgor Cyswllt Tŷ'r Cyffredin ym mis Medi 2011 ar bwyllgorau dethol a phenodiadau cyhoeddus, a adolygodd y broses o wrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau gan bwyllgorau dethol. Nodwyd eu bod wedi bod yn llwyddiant a bod y weithdrefn yn gam bach ymlaen wrth sicrhau atebolrwydd democrataidd penderfyniadau a wneir gan weinidogion. Er bod yr adroddiad hwnnw hefyd yn rhestru nifer o faterion roedd angen ymdrin â hwy, y neges gyffredinol oedd bod gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau ar gyfer penodiadau cyhoeddus pwysig yn beth da.

Ers cyflwyno'r system gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau yn San Steffan, mae Llywodraeth y DU wedi cytuno ar nifer o welliannau pellach i'r weithdrefn hon. Mae cadeiryddion pwyllgorau dethol bellach yn cyfarfod â'r Gweinidog sy'n penodi yn gynnar yn ystod y broses hon i drafod rôl a disgrifiad swydd y swydd berthnasol, y meini prawf ar gyfer cymeradwyo ymgeiswyr, ac i egluro disgwyliadau. Bydd pwyllgorau hefyd yn cael gwybodaeth gyd-destunol eang ychwanegol am nifer yr ymgeiswyr a sut y lleihawyd y nifer honno drwy'r broses rhestr hir a'r broses rhestr fer, er mwyn iddynt allu deall yr enwebiad terfynol yn well.

Yn syml, yr hyn yr ydym yn galw amdano heddiw yw i'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol ystyried o ddifrif roi proses debyg ar waith yng Nghymru. Credaf y dylid craffu'n llawn ar benodiad unrhyw un a gaiff ei benodi'n wleidyddol, ac eithrio Gweinidogion a benodir, drwy wrandawyd cyn cadarnhau cyn cadarnhau'r penodiad hwnnw. Hoffwn gredu fy mod wedi arddel barn gymharol gyson ar y mater hwn, o gofio imi alw am i'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol chwarae rhan llawer mwy sylweddol wrth benodi Comisiynydd y Gymraeg wrth graffu ar Fesur y Gymraeg (Cymru) 2011. Yn anffodus, gwrthodwyd fy awgrymiadau bryd hynny, ac awgrymwyd bod system o bwysio a gwrthbwysio eisoes yn rhan o'r broses benodi er mwyn sicrhau ei bod yn agored, yn dryloyw ac yn deg. Nid wyf yn herio'r ffaith bod trefniadau pwysio a gwrthbwysio ar waith ar hyn o bryd, ond byddai cyflwyno gwrandawriad cyn cadarnhau yn atgyfnerthu'r broses ac yn sicrhau ei bod yn fwy agored a thryloyw. Felly, rwy'n falch o gael cyfle arall i drafod y mater pwysig iawn hwn yn Siambr y Cynulliad, ac, ochr yn ochr ag Aelodau eraill, i ddefnyddio'r cyfle hwn i ddarbwylllo'r Cynulliad y dylai roi ystyriaeth ddifrifol i'r cynnig hwn.

Credaf y dylai fod gan bwyllgorau perthnasol y Cynulliad ran i'w chwarae wrth graffu ar benodiad cyhoeddus. Er enghraifft, dylai'r Pwyllgor Plant a Phobl Ifanc graffu'n llawn ar y broses o benodi'r Comisiynydd Plant. O dan yr amgylchiadau hyn, byddai aelodau'r pwyllgorau perthnasol yn gyfarwydd â'r maes polisi cyffredinol a byddent mewn sefyllfa gryfach i graffu ar y penodiad cyhoeddus. Byddent hefyd mewn sefyllfa i ofyn cwestiynau perthnasol i'r ymgeisydd ar ei faes gwaith. This will provide public reassurance that those appointed to key public offices are selected on merit and that they are subject to a robust pre-confirmation process. Naturally, the final decision would rest with the First Minister or the relevant Minister in charge of the particular policy area of the public appointment. However, the Minister would have the weight of a strong committee report to support him or her in confirming a public appointment. I accept that there may be concerns about the mechanisms by which the Assembly could be involved in public appointments. However, I believe that the benefits very much outweigh the risks. Therefore, I look forward to hearing the Welsh Government's response to this debate. I urge Members to support this motion this afternoon.

I am very pleased to speak in this debate. I congratulate Mark Drakeford and the other movers of this motion. It is not such a modest step. It is improving democracy and making things more open and accountable, so it is an important step.

I have taken part in a number of pre-appointment hearings. When I was a member of the Westminster Public Administration Select Committee, we did a report after 'The Governance of Britain' Green Paper, recommending that pre-appointment hearings should go ahead. As part of this inquiry, we went to Washington to look at the confirmation hearings there. I have to emphasise that they were different to what we are talking about here, but it was still interesting to see the pitfalls and issues that arose in hearings that there was a great deal of concern about. Of course, in the US, the Senate can veto the President's choice, so it was very party political, very high drama and very adversarial, and it was part of the struggle for power between different parts of the Government and of the antagonism between political parties. I am sure that everyone remembers the huge difficulties that Clinton had in getting his appointments through when he was first elected, with the main issues related to how housekeepers were employed and so on. We are talking about something entirely different here, but it was interesting to see that to inform our debates.

Mae'n bleser mawr gennyf siarad yn y ddatl hon. Hoffwn longyfarch Mark Drakeford a'r unigolion eraill sy'n gyfrifol am gyflwyno'r cynnig hwn. Nid cam syml mohono mewn gwirionedd. Mater o wella democratiaeth a sicrhau bod pethau yn fwy agored ac atebol ydyw, felly mae'n gam pwysig.

Rwyf wedi cymryd rhan mewn nifer o wrandawiadau cyn penodi. Pan oeddwn yn aelod o'r Pwyllgor Dethol ar Weinyddiaeth Gyhoeddus yn San Steffan, lluniwyd adroddiad gennym yn deillio o'r Papur Gwyrdd 'The Governance of Britain', yn argymhell y dylid cynnal gwrandawiadau cyn penodi. Fel rhan o'r ymchwiliad hwn, aethom i Washington i edrych ar y gwrandawiadau cadarnhau yno. Rhaid imi bwysleisio eu bod yn wahanol i'r hyn rydym yn ei drafod yma, ond roedd dal yn ddiddorol gweld y rhwystrau a'r problemau a oedd yn codi mewn gwrandawiadau a oedd yn peri cryn bryder. Wrth gwrs, yn yr UD, gall y Senedd roi feto ar ddewis yr Arlywydd, felly roedd yn wleidyddol iawn, yn llawn drama ac yn wrthwynebus iawn, ac yn rhan o'r frwydr am bŵer rhwng gwahanol rannau o'r Llywodraeth a'r elyniaeth rhwng pleidiau gwleidyddol. Rwy'n siŵr bod pawb yn cofio'r anawsterau aruthrol a gafodd Clinton wrth geisio cael cymeradwyaeth i'w benodiadau pan gafodd ei ethol gyntaf, gyda'r prif faterion yn ymwneud â'r ffordd yr oedd gwragedd cadw tŷ yn cael eu cyflogi ac yn y blaen. Rydym yn trafod rhywbeth cwbl wahanol yma, ond roedd yn ddiddorol gweld hynny fel sail i'n dadleuon.

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Here, as part of the proposals that Mark Drakeford and others have come up with, the committee is to give a view. All of the hearings that I was involved with in Westminster confirmed the choice that the Government was putting forward, and, in preparation for this debate, I looked back at some of the pre-appointment hearings that I had taken part in. When I was a Member of the Justice Committee, we had a pre-appointment hearing for the chief inspector of prisons. I am discussing this one because it was not controversial in any way. We had two committee meetings. In the first meeting, we interviewed Anne Owers, who was the retiring director, about what she saw as the key issues in the prison service. That interview was for information only, for us to familiarise ourselves with the issues. In the second meeting, we interviewed Nick Hardwick. We were unanimous in thinking of him as an excellent choice. We looked at his previous jobs; we were looking for someone who was independent of Government and was a regulator, which is a point that Mark Drakeford made in his introduction. We also felt that it enhanced his legitimacy to appear before us as a committee. The other important thing was that it established a relationship between him, as the inspector of prisons, and the Justice Select Committee. It was important to show that there was a relationship with the Parliament and the public. It would be a very good move if we were to follow this in the Assembly.

I think that there will be practical issues, as Mark Drakeford referred to, but, today, we are just talking about the principle. Select committees in Westminster did not consider legislation, so there would be a practical issue for us there. When they were proposing to look at these pre-appointment hearings, it was limited to three a year because of time constraints. That is something that would have to be considered. However, it is interesting to note that, even before the governors had written and there were these changes in Westminster, the Treasury Committee had always interviewed members of the monetary policy committee, but those were pre-commencement hearings. Therefore, there is a range of different types of hearings.

In conclusion, this is a good and positive move. I noted the different positions that could be looked at by the committees. Paul Davies mentioned that the children's commissioner should be looked at by the Children and Young People Committee. The issue that I would like to bring up is that, as I understand it, the children's commissioner is appointed with the full involvement of children, so we would somehow have to encompass that so that that important point is not diluted in any way. My experience is that this would be a tremendous step forward and would increase the democracy that we have in Wales.

Cawsom ddau gyfarfod pwyllgor. Yn ystod y cyfarfod cyntaf, cyfwelwyd Anne Owers, sef y cyfarwyddwr a oedd yn ymddeol, er mwyn trafod y prif faterion a oedd yn wynebu'r gwasanaeth carchardai, yn eu barn hi. I begin by thanking Mark Drakeford very much for tabling this important debate and for the opportunity to work with colleagues across the Chamber on taking forward this initiative. I also thank Julie Morgan very much for her remarks, drawing on her experience in another place.

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As Mark highlighted in his opening remarks, today's debate is about opening up our politics and creating a much greater level of transparency in our institutions, improving the democratic accountability of putting people in office to serve and represent the interests of the people of Wales. In recent years, as we all know, politics in general has been dogged by accusations of political nepotism and of a 'jobs for the boys' culture. Such accusations gain all the more traction when unelected but potentially powerful public appointments are made with little obvious transparency and where successful candidates have historic links to governing parties, whichever they might be.

As a way of combating this, I would commend the steps that were taken by the former UK Government under the premiership of Gordon Brown, when a system was introduced back in 2008 for the House of Commons. Looking more closely at the results of that decision, we can see that, in practice, the vast majority of candidates who have been subject to pre-appointment hearings have been straightforwardly approved by select committees. In stressing that point, I would add the non-political nature of that particular statistic. Such hearings are not about undermining the governing party or parties, regardless of which colour they may have. It is my firm belief that it is international best practice for Parliaments and not Governments to appoint people such as commissioners. This debate attempts to stress that point and to bring Wales up to date with best practice elsewhere, be that in England, the United States—which, despite the caveats that Julie Morgan has referred to, has something to offer us—or a number of our partners in continental Europe.

Looking more closely at what I would argue is a largely successful House of Commons system, we can see that a further small number of improvements could be made with minor tweaks to that system. In fact, in only two cases to date have the appointments of proposed candidates not gone forward. In May 2011, the appointment of a new chief inspector of probation was halted and then reopened by the Ministry of Justice and, at that stage, the original candidate failed to secure the support of the Justice Committee. In June 2011, the candidate for chair of the UK Statistics Authority withdrew prior to the Public Administration Committee reporting, as a result of concerns raised around the perceived independence of that candidate. In only one case has an appointment been approved by a Minister in contradiction to the findings of a select committee, and the facts of that case were less about the candidate per se than a disagreement over the nature of the post.

In summary, of 34 Westminster hearings conducted between July 2008 and July 2011, 31 were positive, two were negative and, in one case, the candidate withdrew without a report being issued. In only four cases were committees not unanimous in their recommendations. Of the 31 positive reports, eight contained additional comments or caveats, for example, where the proposed chair of the Social Security Advisory Committee was endorsed, but with a note of concern about the candidate's

Fel y nododd Mark yn ei sylwadau agoriadol, mae a wnelo'r ddadl heddiw â sicrhau bod ein gwleidyddiaeth yn fwy agored a chreu llawer mwy o dryloywder yn ein sefydliadau, gan wella atebolrwydd democrataidd y broses o benodi pobl i wasanaethu a chynrychioli buddiannau pobl Cymru. Gan edrych yn fanylach ar ganlyniadau'r penderfyniad hwnnw, gallwn weld, yn ymarferol, bod y mwyafrif helaeth o'r ymgeiswyr a fu'n destun gwrandawriad cyn penodi wedi cael eu cymeradwyo gan bwyllgorau dethol heb unrhyw drafferthion. Wrth bwysleisio'r pwynt hwnnw, hoffwn nodi natur anwleidyddol yr ystadegyn penodol hwnnw. Nid diben gwrandawriadau o'r fath yw tanseilio'r blaid neu'r pleidiau sy'n llywodraethu, ni waeth beth fo'u lliw. Rwy'n gadarn o'r farn mai'r arfer rhyngwladol gorau yw i Seneddau ac nid Llywodraethau benodi pobl fel comisiynwyr. Mae'r ddadl hon yn ceisio pwysleisio'r pwynt hwnnw a sicrhau bod Cymru yn gweithredu gan gydymffurfio â'r arfer gorau mewn mannau eraill, boed hynny yn Lloegr, yn yr Unol Daleithiau—y mae ganddi, er gwaethaf y cafeatau y cyfeiriodd Julie Morgan atynt, rywbeth i'w gynnig inni—neu nifer o'n partneriaid ar gyfandir Ewrop.

Gan edrych yn fanylach ar system Tŷ'r Cyffredin, sydd, yn fy marn i, yn llwyddiannus ar y cyfan, gallwn weld y gellid gwneud nifer fach o welliannau pellach drwy ailwampio'r system honno rywfaint. Yn wir, dim ond dau achos a gafwyd hyd yn hyn lle na chymeradwywyd yr ymgeiswyr arfaethedig. Ym mis Mai 2011, gohiriwyd y broses o benodi prif arolygydd newydd ar gyfer y gwasanaeth prawf ac wedyn fe'i hail-agorwyd gan y Weinyddiaeth Gyfiawnder ac, ar y pryd, methodd yr ymgeisydd gwreiddiol ag ennyn cefnogaeth y Pwyllgor Cyfiawnder. Ym mis Mehefin 2011, tynnodd yr ymgeisydd ar gyfer swydd cadeirydd Awdurdod Ystadegau'r DU ei gais yn ôl cyn i'r Pwyllgor Gweinyddiaeth Gyhoeddus gyflwyno ei adroddiad, o ganlyniad i bryderon a godwyd ynghylch annibyniaeth ganfyddedig yr ymgeisydd hwnnw. Dim ond mewn un achos y mae Gweinidog wedi cymeradwyo penodiad yn groes i ganfyddiadau pwyllgor dethol, ac roedd ffeithiau'r achos hwnnw yn ymwneud fwy ag anghytundeb ynghylch natur y swydd na'r ymgeisydd fel y cyfryw.

I grynhoi, o'r 34 o wrandawriadau a gynhaliwyd yn San Steffan rhwng mis Gorffennaf 2008 a mis Gorffennaf 2011, roedd 31 yn gadarnhaol, roedd dau yn negyddol ac, mewn un achos, tynnodd yr ymgeisydd ei gais yn ôl heb i adroddiad gael ei gyhoeddi. Dim ond mewn pedwar achos y methodd argymhellion y pwyllgorau â bod yn unfrydol. These examples from the other side of the M4 highlight just how effective pre-confirmation hearings can be, in practice, in ensuring a greater level of transparency and public accountability, without any political undermining. In short, I believe that they have something to offer us here in Wales, and I would commend your support.

As a final note, I stress that the call for further openness is not limited to those of us on the backbenches. Independence of government must be a central pillar of a major political appointee, such as a commissioner, as the Paris principles make clear. Independence of government goes, in my view, hand in hand with the closer relationship that the scrutiny functions of this Assembly should have. I urge Members to support the small but important steps that we are proposing today.

I also welcome the debate, because it is the sort of debate that we should be having about how we advance and develop accountability, transparency and democracy in Wales. When the process started in the UK Parliament in 2003 with the Green Paper, it was very much about looking at the suitability of candidates, looking at the candidates' key priorities, and then examining the process that was used in the selection. Above all, and more than anything, it was about it being open and transparent. For us, as a new democracy and a new legislature, it seems to me that it is particularly important because, with the Government of Wales Act 2006 we changed our structure quite radically—we separated Government from the Assembly itself. With the advancement of legislative powers, it becomes essential that not only do we have an effective Government but also that that Government is held to account.

An interesting research paper was commissioned by the Cabinet Office in 2010, which reviewed the process up to that point and how it had been working. It is still work in progress in Westminster—it is still a learning curve as to how the whole process works—but they did come up with some interesting analysis. The first one was from the parliamentarians. There was a concern as to whether the parliamentarians in Westminster had any real confidence that what they were doing was going to be taken seriously by the Government. So, that is obviously an issue. When they consulted the preferred candidates, the majority felt that the process was beneficial to them, and that it was justified on democratic grounds. A number of candidates indicated confidentially that, had the scrutiny process resulted in a negative report, they would probably not have taken up the position even if the Government had wanted them to take it up.

Mae'r enghreifftiau hyn o ochr arall yr M4 yn tynnu sylw at effeithiolrwydd gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau, yn ymarferol, wrth sicrhau mwy o dryloywder ac atebolrwydd cyhoeddus heb unrhyw danseilio gwleidyddol. Yn gryno, credaf fod ganddynt rywbeth i'w gynnig inni yma yng Nghymru, a byddwn yn annog eich cefnogaeth.

I gloi, pwysleisaf nad yw'r alwad i fod yn fwy agored wedi'i chyfyngu i'r rheini ohonom ar y meinciau cefn. Rhaid i annibyniaeth ar y llywodraeth fod yn un o gonglfeini penodeion gwleidyddol pwysig, fel comisiynydd, fel yr eglurir yn egwyddorion Paris. Yn fy marn i, mae annibyniaeth ar y llywodraeth yn mynd law yn llaw â'r gydb berthynas agosach a ddylai fod rhwng swyddogaethau craffu'r Cynulliad hwn. Anogaf yr Aelodau i gefnogi'r camau bach ond pwysig rydym yn eu cynnig heddiw.

Croesawaf hefyd y ddadl, gan mai dyma'r math o ddadl y dylem fod yn ei chael am sut i wella a datblygu atebolrwydd, tryloywder a democratiaeth yng Nghymru. Pan ddechreuodd y broses yn Senedd y DU yn 2003 gyda'r Papur Gwyrdd, roedd a wnelo'n bennaf ag ystyried addasrwydd ymgeiswyr, ystyried blaenoriaethau allweddol ymgeiswyr, ac wedyn ystyried y broses a ddefnyddiwyd wrth ddethol. Uwchlaw popeth, ac yn anad dim, roedd a wnelo â bod yn agored ac yn dryloyw. I ni, fel democratiaeth newydd a deddfwrfa newydd, ymddengys i mi ei bod yn hynod bwysig oherwydd, o ganlyniad i gyflwyno Deddf Llywodraeth Cymru 2006, newidiwyd ein strwythur yn sylweddol—gwahanwyd y Llywodraeth oddi wrth y Cynulliad ei hun. Wrth i bwerau deddfwriaethol ddatblygu, daw'n hollbwysig sicrhau nid yn unig bod gennym Lywodraeth effeithiol ond hefyd bod y Llywodraeth honno yn cael ei dwyn i gyfrif.

Comisiynwyd papur ymchwil diddorol gan Swyddfa'r Cabinet yn 2010, a adolygodd y broses hyd at y pwynt hwnnw a sut y bu'n gweithio. Mae'r gwaith yn mynd rhagddo o hyd yn San Steffan—mae'n gromlin ddyysgu o hyd o ran sut y mae'r broses gyfan yn gweithio—ond gwnaethant gyflwyno rhai dadansoddiadau diddorol. Daeth y cyntaf o du'r seneddwy. Roedd pryder ynghylch p'un a oedd gan y seneddwy yn San Steffan unrhyw ffydd wirioneddol bod y Llywodraeth yn mynd i gymryd eu gwaith o ddifrif. Felly, mae hynny'n amlwg yn broblem. Wrth ymgynghori â'r ymgeiswyr dewisol, roedd y mwyafrif o'r farn bod y broses o fudd iddynt hwy, ac y gellid ei chyfiawnhau ar sail ddemocrataidd. Nododd nifer o ymgeiswyr yn gyfrinachol, pe byddai'r broses graffu wedi arwain at adroddiad negyddol, na fyddent fwy na thebyg wedi derbyn y swydd hyd yn oed pe byddai'r Llywodraeth wedi'i chynnig iddynt.

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It states that department officials were broadly neutral about the hearings. They did not feel that there was much value added in the new approach. Search consultants were initially negative, but their concerns that the system would be a deterrent, which is one of the big points that is always raised against having this type of scrutiny—that it would deter people from coming forward—had not been realised. The important conclusion overall, which I think is a fair one, was that it was generally felt that there had been a positive benefit from the new approach in terms of democracy and transparency in relation to the appointments and that, although it was not a giant stride, it was a modest step forward—a point that Mark Drakeford has made, I think.

Therefore, it seems to me that the principle of this is that it is a test of our maturity and confidence as an Assembly, and as a Welsh Government, in that it is prepared to have its actions and decisions looked at openly, transparently and accountably. Looking at the way in which this Assembly has taken on legislative scrutiny, which I think has been very effective and as good as in any other Parliament that I have ever looked at, we are now in a position to move forward, to consider a system in which we can increase scrutiny and accountability. I think that this will be to the benefit of all and it will raise the esteem of the Assembly in the eyes of the people of Wales.

Mae'n datgan fod swyddogion adrannol yn gymharol niwtral o ran y gwrandawiaidau. Nid oeddent o'r farn bod y dull gweithredu newydd yn ychwanegu llawer o werth. Roedd ymgynghorwyr chwilio yn negyddol i ddechrau, ond ni wireddwyd eu pryderon y byddai'r system yn atalydd, sef un o'r pwyntiau mwyaf a godir bob amser yn erbyn y math hwn o graffu—y byddai'n atal pobl rhag ymgeisio. Y casgliad pwysig cyffredinol, sy'n un teg, yn fy marn i, oedd y teimlwyd yn gyffredinol bod y dull gweithredu newydd wedi bod o fudd o ran democratiaeth a thryloywder mewn perthynas â'r penodiadau ac, er nad oedd yn gam aruthrol, ei fod yn gam da ymlaen—pwynt a wnaeth Mark Drakeford, fe gredaf.

Felly, ymddengys imi mai egwyddor y mater yw ei fod yn brawf ar ein haeddfedrwydd a'n hyder fel Cynulliad, ac fel Llywodraeth Cymru, yn yr ystyr ei fod yn barod i'w gamau gweithredu a'i benderfyniadau gael eu hystyried mewn ffordd agored, tryloyw ac atebol. Gan edrych ar y ffordd y mae'r Cynulliad hwn wedi ymgymryd â chraffu deddfwriaethol, a fu'n effeithiol iawn yn fy marn i a chystal ag unrhyw Senedd arall yr edrychais arni erioed, rydym bellach mewn sefyllfa i symud ymlaen, i ystyried system lle y gellir cynyddu trefniadau craffu ac atebolrwydd. Credaf y bydd hyn o fudd i bawb ac y bydd yn gwella parch pobl Cymru at y Cynulliad.

Y Gweinidog Cyllid ac Arweinydd y Tŷ / The Minister for Finance and Leader of the House

I am very pleased to respond to this debate on behalf of the Welsh Government. The case for pre-confirmation hearings has been well made in the Chamber. It is very helpful, in responding to this debate, to start by considering current practice, which has developed since the Assembly's inception in 1999.

The Assembly already has a key role in some very important public appointments: the Children's Commissioner for Wales, the Older People's Commissioner for Wales and the Welsh Language Commissioner are appointed by the First Minister, with the Assembly's views taken into account. For the appointment of the children's and older people's commissioners, the regulations require the First Minister to take into account the views of, among others, a selection panel that includes Assembly Members who have been nominated by the three opposition groups. As Julie Morgan has said, we pioneered the way on this by involving a panel of children and young people for the appointment of the children's commissioner, and a panel that represents older people's interests in the appointment of the older people's commissioner.

For the appointment of the Welsh Language Commissioner, the First Minister may take into account the views of the Assembly, Assembly committees and Assembly Members. Paul Davies was very supportive of this in his contribution in support of the motion. Welsh Ministers may also invite a relevant Assembly committee to nominate an Assembly Member to sit on the selection panel that interviews candidates for the position of commissioner and make recommendations to the First Minister in relation to the appointment. This demonstrates that the Assembly already has a key role in some very important public appointments in Wales.

Mae'n bleser mawr gennyf ymateb i'r ddadl hon ar ran Llywodraeth Cymru. Cyflwynwyd yr achos o blaid gwrandawiaidau cyn cadarnhau yn huawdl yn y Siambr. Mae'n ddefnyddiol iawn, wrth ymateb i'r ddadl hon, ddechrau drwy ystyried arfer presennol, sydd wedi datblygu ers sefydlu'r Cynulliad yn 1999.

Mae'r Cynulliad eisoes yn chwarae rhan allweddol mewn rhai penodiadau cyhoeddus pwysig iawn: mae Comisiynydd Plant Cymru, Comisiynydd Pobl Hŷn Cymru a Chomisiynydd y Gymraeg yn cael eu penodi gan y Prif Weinidog, gan ystyried barn y Cynulliad. Wrth benodi'r Comisiynydd Plant a'r Comisiynydd Pobl Hŷn, mae'r rheoliadau yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i'r Prif Weinidog ystyried, ymhlith eraill, safbwyntiau panel dethol sy'n cynnwys Aelodau'r Cynulliad a enwebwyd gan y tair wrthblaid. Fel y dywedodd Julie Morgan, buom yn arloesol yn hyn o beth drwy gynnwys panel o blant a phobl ifanc wrth benodi'r comisiynydd plant, a phanel sy'n cynrychioli buddiannau pobl hŷn wrth benodi'r comisiynydd pobl hŷn.

Wrth benodi Comisiynydd y Gymraeg, gall y Prif Weinidog ystyried safbwyntiau'r Cynulliad, pwyllgorau'r Cynulliad ac Aelodau'r Cynulliad. Roedd Paul Davies yn gefnogol iawn i hyn yn ei gyfraniad o blaid y cynnig. Gall Gweinidogion Cymru hefyd wahodd un o bwyllgorau perthnasol y Cynulliad i enwebu Aelod o'r Cynulliad i fod yn aelod o'r panel dethol sy'n cyfweld ymgeiswyr ar gyfer swydd y comisiynydd ac sy'n gwneud argymhellion i'r Prif Weinidog o ran y penodiad hwnnw. Mae hyn yn dangos bod gan y Cynulliad eisoes ran allweddol i'w chwarae yn y broses o wneud rhai penodiadau cyhoeddus pwysig iawn yng Nghymru.

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In opening this debate, Mark Drakeford helpfully drew on the experience of Westminster and elsewhere in operating pre-confirmation hearings. As he indicated, pre-appointment hearings, as they are known in Westminster, were introduced formally in 2008. Under the Westminster arrangements, select committees are consulted on the selection process and publicity strategy before the preferred candidate appears before the committee—it is important for us to note and learn from that. Committees have no power of veto, except where it is already established or reflected in statute. It is also important to learn that information on the selection process, including the size of the field of candidates, the number shortlisted and the number deemed suitable for appointment, is also provided to select committees, suitably anonymised, prior to the pre-appointment hearing. So, this debate has enabled us—certainly those of us in Government, as well as those Members who are promoting the motion—to look at this carefully.

Of course, Westminster is not the only legislature where there is parliamentary involvement in public appointments. It is interesting to look at the position in Scotland, where, I understand, the Scottish Government has opposed the introduction of pre-appointment parliamentary scrutiny of ministerial nominations for public bodies as a result of concerns that such hearings could deter candidates from applying for high profile posts. That is something that I know has been addressed, and I will reflect on it further.

I think that it is important that we hear from experience, and Julie Morgan gave her experience, as a former Member of Parliament, of being involved in those pre-appointment hearings.

Wrth agor y ddadl hon, cyfeiriodd Mark Drakeford yn ddefnyddiol at brofiad San Steffan a mannau eraill wrth weithredu gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau. Fel y nododd, cyflwynwyd gwrandawiadau cyn penodi, fel y'u gelwir yn San Steffan, yn ffurfiol yn 2008. O dan drefniadau San Steffan, ymgynghorir â phwyllgorau dethol ar y broses ddethol a'r strategaeth gyhoeddusrwydd cyn i'r ymgeisydd dewisol ymddangos ger bron y pwyllgor—mae'n bwysig inni nodi hynny a dysgu ohono. Nid oes gan y pwyllgorau unrhyw bŵer i roi feto, ac eithrio lle y mae hynny eisoes wedi'i gadarnhau neu wedi'i ystyried mewn statud. Mae'n bwysig hefyd dysgu bod y pwyllgorau dethol yn cael gwybodaeth am y broses ddethol, gan gynnwys maint y gronfa o ymgeiswyr, y nifer ar y rhestr fer a nifer yr ymgeiswyr yr ystyriwyd eu bod yn addas i'w penodi, heb unrhyw enwau, cyn y gwrandawriad cyn penodi. Felly mae'r ddadl hon wedi rhoi cyfle inni—yn sicr y rheini ohonom sy'n rhan o'r Llywodraeth, yn ogystal â'r Aelodau hynny sydd o blaid y cynnig—i ystyried hyn yn ofalus.

Wrth gwrs, nid San Steffan yw'r unig ddeddfwrfa lle ceir cyfranogiad seneddol mewn penodiadau cyhoeddus. Mae'n ddiddorol edrych ar y sefyllfa yn yr Alban, lle mae Llywodraeth yr Alban, yn ôl yr hyn a ddeallaf, wedi gwrthwynebu cynigion i gyflwyno proses graffu seneddol cyn penodi ar gyfer enwebiadau gweinidogol i gyrff cyhoeddus o ganlyniad i bryderon y gallai gwrandawiadau o'r fath atal ymgeiswyr rhag gwneud cais am swyddi proffil uchel. Mae hynny'n rhywbeth y gwn iddo gael ei drafod, a byddaf yn ei ystyried ymhellach.

Credaf ei bod yn bwysig inni wrando ar rywun sydd â phrofiad o hyn, a chyfeiriodd Julie Morgan at ei phrofiad, fel cyn Aelod Seneddol, o gymryd rhan yn y gwrandawiadau cyn penodi hynny.

Sorry; I missed the point that you were making about the Scottish Parliament. Did you say that the Scottish Government has stopped the process of parliamentary scrutiny of appointments? That would seem a retrograde step, if that is the case. I may have misunderstood you.

Mae'n ddrwg gennyf; methais eich pwynt am Senedd yr Alban. A oeddech yn dweud bod Llywodraeth yr Alban wedi rhoi'r gorau i'r broses graffu seneddol ar gyfer penodiadau? Os felly, byddai hynny'n ymddangos yn gam yn ôl. Efallai fy mod wedi eich camddeall.

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My understanding is that they have not taken the step of introducing pre-appointment parliamentary scrutiny of ministerial nominations to public bodies. It is not a matter of stopping; they just have not introduced the pre-appointment scrutiny. I will be going to Scotland in a couple of weeks and I am going to talk to colleagues there about how they considered this and learning from them, but also considering it in response to this debate today. It is important, as Julie Morgan indicated, that the House of Commons' Liaison Committee has looked at the way that pre-appointment hearings have been working in Westminster, and Mark Drakeford referred to this as well. The recent report in September 2011 is informative, in the sense that it concluded that the pre-appointment hearings scrutinised the quality of the ministerial decision making, were a key part of ministerial accountability, provided public reassurance that those appointed to key public offices are selected on merit, enhanced the appointees' legitimacy in undertaking their functions and provided public evidence of the independence of mind of the candidate. William Powell referred to these points in his contribution this afternoon. This report did clearly indicate that there are clear benefits around the democratic legitimacy of appointees and of this process.

We are mindful—and these points have been expressed today—that there are issues that we need to address. Time constraints have been mentioned in terms of the impact on the Assembly's workload, and pre-confirmation hearings would have to be factored into that. There may be issues to consider about costs. They are unlikely to be very significant, but that is a factor in terms of budgets under extreme pressure. Also, going back to the point about the experience and consideration in Scotland, there may have been debates in terms of the Scottish Government's stance on this. We have to look at the possible impact that the introduction of pre-confirmation hearings could have on the diversity of people putting themselves forward for appointment. We are seeking, and across this Chamber, I know that you support me on this as Minister, to improve the representation of women, disabled people and minority ethnic community members on our public bodies. We do not want to be in a position where people feel deterred from putting themselves forward for public appointment. We need to look at that carefully and possibly consider consulting with the equality bodies, which are addressing this in terms of improving representation. I understand that this was a concern in Westminster, but it seems to have been a largely unfounded concern in terms of being a deterrent to people putting themselves forward. That is an issue that we would certainly want to consider very carefully.

In conclusion, the Welsh Government supports the principle of pre-confirmation hearings. We see the benefits of increased transparency and the democratic legitimacy of appointments, but, equally, we need to be clear about what we want them to achieve in Wales, and mindful of the impact that they might have on the diversity of candidates for public appointments.

Caf ar ddeall nad ydynt wedi cyflwyno proses graffu seneddol cyn penodi ar gyfer enwebiadau gweinidogol i gyrff cyhoeddus. Nid mater o roi'r gorau iddi ydyw; ond nid ydynt wedi cyflwyno'r broses graffu cyn penodi eto. Byddaf yn mynd i'r Alban ymhen ychydig wythnosau ac rwy'n bwriadu trafod â chydweithwyr yno sut yr aethant ati i ystyried y broses a dysgu ganddynt, ond byddaf hefyd yn ei ystyried mewn ymateb i'r ddadl hon heddiw. Mae'n bwysig, fel y nododd Julie Morgan, bod Pwyllgor Cyswllt Tŷ'r Cyffredin wedi ystyried y ffordd y bu gwrandawiadau cyn penodi yn gweithio yn San Steffan, a chyfeiriodd Mark Drakeford at hyn hefyd. Mae'r adroddiad diweddar ym mis Medi 2011 yn llawn gwybodaeth, yn yr ystyr iddo ddod i'r casgliad bod y gwrandawiadau cyn penodi yn craffu ar ansawdd penderfyniadau a wnaed gan weinidogion, eu bod yn rhan allweddol o atebolrwydd gweinidogol, eu bod yn rhoi sicrwydd i'r cyhoedd bod y rheini a gaiff eu penodi i swyddi cyhoeddus allweddol yn cael eu dethol ar sail teilyngdod, yn gwella cyfreithlondeb penodeion o ran cyflawni eu swyddogaethau ac yn rhoi tystiolaeth i'r cyhoedd o annibyniaeth yr ymgeisydd. Cyfeiriodd William Powell at y pwyntiau hyn yn ei gyfraniad y prynhawn yma. Nododd yr adroddiad hwn yn glir fod buddiannau amlwg yn gysylltiedig â chyfreithlondeb democrataidd penodeion a'r broses hon.

Rydym yn ymwybodol—a mynegwyd y pwyntiau hyn heddiw—bod problemau y mae angen inni ymdrin â hwy. Soniwyd am gyfyngiadau amser o ran yr effaith ar lwyth gwaith y Cynulliad, a byddai'n rhaid ystyried gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau yn hynny o beth. Mae'n bosibl y bydd materion i'w hystyried o ran costau. Nid ydynt yn debygol o fod yn fawr iawn, ond mae'n rhywbeth i'w ystyried o ran rhoi cyllidebau dan bwysau aruthrol. Hefyd, gan ddychwelyd at y pwynt o ran profiad ac ystyriaethau yn yr Alban, mae'n bosibl y cafwyd trafodaethau o ran safbwynt Llywodraeth yr Alban ar hyn. Rhaid inni ystyried effaith bosibl cyflwyno gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau ar yr amrywiaeth o bobl a fydd yn ymgeisio ar gyfer swydd. Rydym yn ceisio, ac ymhob rhan o'r Siambr hon, gwn eich bod yn fy nghefnogi yn hyn o beth fel Gweinidog, gwella'r ffordd y caiff merched, pobl anabl ac aelodau o'r gymuned lleiafrifoedd ethnig eu cynrychioli ar ein cyrff cyhoeddus. Nid ydym am fod mewn sefyllfa lle mae pobl yn teimlo na allant ymgeisio am benodiad cyhoeddus. Mae angen inni ystyried hynny'n ofalus ac o bosibl, ystyried ymgynghori â'r cyrff cydraddoldeb, sy'n ymdrin â hyn o ran gwella cynrychiolaeth. Deallaf y bu hyn yn bryder yn San Steffan, ond ymddengys nad oedd llawer o sail i'r pryder hwnnw o ran atal pobl rhag ymgeisio. Mae hynny'n fater y byddem yn sicr yn awyddus i'w ystyried yn ofalus iawn.

I gloi, mae Llywodraeth Cymru yn cefnogi'r egwyddor o wrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau. Rydym yn gweld buddiannau tryloywder cynyddol a chyfreithlondeb democrataidd penodiadau, ond, yn yr un modd, mae angen inni fod yn eglur ynghylch yr hyn rydym am iddynt ei gyflawni yng Nghymru, gan ystyried yr effaith y gallent ei chael ar yr amrywiaeth o ymgeiswyr ar gyfer penodiadau cyhoeddus.

I call on Jocelyn Davies to reply to the debate.

Galwaf ar Jocelyn Davies i ymateb i'r ddadl.

I very much welcome today's debate and would particularly like to pay tribute to Mark Drakeford in putting this important matter before us. We are very fortunate that this Assembly is held in relatively high esteem, especially by the people it is elected to serve. This high regard is based in no small part on this institution's willingness to embrace openness and to reflect the age in which we live, as detailed by Mark Drakeford in his thoughtful contribution.

Many are in awe of legislatures that are steeped in centuries of history, tradition and ceremony, and I suppose that there is no great harm in a little formality here and there, but a great strength of our democracy is its lack of needless historical hang-ups. The motion before us is entirely consistent with our ethos. It strengthens our processes and, in my view, the adoption of pre-confirmation hearings for important public positions would lead to better outcomes by ensuring transparency.

Many examples have been given in this debate of the important public appointments made by Welsh Ministers that could be subject to pre-confirmation hearings. It is worth keeping in mind their significant powers, and also the sums of money that they are responsible for. Sport Wales, for example, spent over £25 million in 2010-11, and the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales oversees a vital function that has a direct impact on our future economic and social prospects. In addition to appointments to Welsh Government sponsored bodies, as we have heard today, we have to consider the Assembly-nominated appointments and the commissioners. There is a clear public interest in ensuring a greater degree of transparency in those appointments. The hearings would be in public and broadcast live. Indeed, we could go a little further and ask the public to participate as well as spectate. That could involve inviting the public to tweet and e-mail questions, through the chairs of the hearings, of course. In turn, the candidates could be asked to answer those questions. That would build on best practice that exists and has already been mentioned today.

There are legitimate questions to be answered in terms of which appointments should be subject to confirmation hearings. No-one would like to see the process unduly protracted, but perhaps we could subject each appointment to three basic tests on the current framework used at Westminster. Those three tests consider positions that play a key role in regulating a Government, positions that play a role in protecting and safeguarding the public's rights and interests, particularly in relation to the actions of the Government, and positions where the reputation and credibility of the public body in question depends on the post holder being, and being seen to be, independent of Ministers.

Rhodddwyd sawl enghraifft yn y ddadl hon o'r penodiadau cyhoeddus pwysig a wneir gan Weinidogion Cymru y gellid cynnal gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau ar eu cyfer. Mae'n werth cofio eu pwerau sylweddol, a hefyd y symiau o arian y maent yn gyfrifol amdanynt. Er enghraifft, gwariodd Chwaraeon Cymru dros £25 miliwn yn 2010-11, ac mae Cyngor Cyllido Addysg Uwch Cymru yn goruchwyllo swyddogaeth hanfodol sy'n cael effaith uniongyrchol ar ein rhagolygon economaidd a chymdeithasol ar gyfer y dyfodol. Yn ogystal â phenodiadau i gyrff a noddir gan Lywodraeth Cymru, fel y clywsom heddiw, rhaid inni ystyried penodiadau a enwebir gan y Cynulliad a'r comisiynwyr. Mae budd cyhoeddus amlwg o ran sicrhau mwy o dryloywder mewn perthynas â'r penodiadau hynny. Câi'r gwrandawiadau eu cynnal yn gyhoeddus a'u darlledu'n fyw. Yn wir, gallem fynd gam ymhellach a gofyn i'r cyhoedd gymryd rhan yn ogystal â gwyllo. Gallai hynny gynnwys gwahodd y cyhoedd i drydar ac e-bostio cwestiynau, drwy gadeiryddion y gwrandawiadau, wrth gwrs. Yn eu tro, gellid gofyn i'r ymgeiswyr ateb y cwestiynau hynny. Byddai hynny'n adeiladu ar yr arfer gorau sy'n bodoli eisoes ac y cyfeiriwyd ato eisoes heddiw.

Mae cwestiynau dilys i'w hateb o ran pa benodiadau y dylid cynnal gwrandawiadau cadarnhau ar eu cyfer. Ni fyddai neb am weld proses rhy faith, ond efallai y gallai pob penodiad fod yn destun tri phrawf sylfaenol, yn seiliedig ar y fframwaith cyfredol a ddefnyddir yn San Steffan. Mae'r tri phrawf hyn yn ystyried swyddi sy'n chwarae rhan allweddol wrth reoleiddio Llywodraeth, swyddi sy'n chwarae rhan wrth ddiogelu a gwarchod hawliau a buddiannau'r cyhoedd, yn arbennig mewn perthynas â chymau gweithredu'r Llywodraeth, a swyddi lle y mae enw da a hygyrddedd y corff cyhoeddus dan sylw yn dibynnu ar y ffaith bod deiliad y swydd yn annibynnol ar Weinidogion, ac yn cael ei ystyried yn annibynnol arnynt.

Before I respond to Members on their specific points, I would like to add another dimension. If a consensus could be secured around the principle of pre-confirmation hearings in this country, perhaps we could consider not limiting them to Welsh Government sponsored appointments. There are other positions that I believe could be subject to pre-confirmation hearings that are not directly within the competence of this Assembly. However, there is a case to be made for subjecting them to pre-confirmation hearings anyway. I know that this falls outside the motion. Perhaps the Secretary of State for Wales could be one of them. I am not making a political point; I think that it would prove to be an interesting use of this particular procedure.

Mark set out for us the practices in Westminster on major appointments, from the many thousands that are in the gift of UK Ministers, although they are not used in every case. He also described the preserved constitutional conventions in our proposal alongside the hearings. I agree with his analysis that the advantages far outweigh the disadvantages. They are feared disadvantages that have largely not materialised. I also agree with Paul Davies that this proposal is about the relationship between the legislature and the executive and it would add to the legitimacy of ministerial decision making. His point on strengthening, rather than discrediting, the current system is a very important one. We must acknowledge that the Nolan principles currently apply and that this would enhance them rather than detract from them.

I was pleased to hear from Julie Morgan because she usefully drew on her direct experience of the pre-appointment system. She mentioned the United States of America and its adversarial system, which she acknowledged that we did not intend to propose here, but the committees here could perhaps take a view rather than a veto, which is important. Will Powell made the important point that this motion avoids the constant accusation of 'jobs for the boys'. I agree that this is about building on best practice elsewhere and he usefully put that on the record for us. Will Powell also drew our attention to the very few occasions when appointments have not been confirmed, which demonstrates the effectiveness of this system. The Minister's concerns that people would be put off or that diversity would not be encouraged were not supported by the evidence that he was able to present to us.

Mick Antoniw reminded us of the need to continue to strive for openness and transparency, especially within our new constitutional arrangement. He was quite right when he said that our maturity needs testing from time to time. I am pleased that the Minister found our debate useful when she laid out the current system for us. We acknowledge that it has many good features. I understand entirely her defence of it, but I am delighted that she is exploring options for the future, which include our proposals.

To close, this has been a comprehensive and useful debate and I hope that the Government takes the necessary steps and acts upon what would amount to an enhancement of our democracy in Wales.

Fodd bynnag, mae achos o blaid cynnal gwrandawiadau cyn cadarnhau ar eu cyfer beth bynnag. Gwn nad yw hyn yn rhan o'r cynnig. Efallai y gallai Ysgrifennydd Gwladol Cymru fod yn un ohonynt. Nid gwneud pwynt gwleidyddol yr wyf, credaf y byddai'n ddefnydd diddorol o'r weithdrefn benodol hon.

Disgrifiodd Mark yr arferion yn San Steffan o ran penodiadau pwysig, o blith y miloedd ohonynt y mae Gweinidogion y DU yn gyfrifol amdanynt, er na chânt eu defnyddio ymhob achos. Disgrifiodd hefyd y confensiynau cyfansoddiadol a gadwyd yn ein cynnig ochr yn ochr â'r gwrandawiadau. Cytunaf â'i ddadansoddiad bod y manteision yn drech o lawer na'r anfanteision. Ni wireddwyd yr anfanteision yr oedd pryderon yn eu cylch, i raddau helaeth. Cytunaf hefyd â Paul Davies fod a wnelo'r cynnig hwn â'r gydberthynas rhwng y ddeddfwrf a'r weithrediaeth ac y byddai'n ychwanegu at gyfreithlondeb penderfyniadau gweinidogion. Gwnaeth Will Powell y pwynt pwysig bod y cynnig hwn yn osgoi'r cyhuddiad rheolaidd o 'swyddi i'r hogiau'. Cytunaf fod a wnelo hyn ag adeiladu ar yr arfer gorau mewn mannau eraill a rhoddodd hynny'n ddefnyddiol ar gofnod inni. Tynnodd Will Powell hefyd ein sylw at yr adegau prin pan na chafodd penodiadau eu cadarnhau, sy'n dangos effeithiolrwydd y system hon. Ni chafodd pryderon y Gweinidog, y byddai pobl yn cael eu hatal rhag ymgeisio neu na chât amrywiaeth ei hannog, eu hategu gan y dystiolaeth a gyflwynodd ger ein bron.

Atgoffodd Mick Antoniw ni am yr angen i barhau i anelu at fod yn agored ac yn dryloyw, yn enwedig o fewn ein trefniant cyfansoddiadol newydd. Roedd yn llygad ei le pan ddywedodd fod angen profi ein haeddfedrwydd o bryd i'w gilydd. Rwy'n falch y bu'r ddadl o ddefnydd i'r Gweinidog wrth iddi ddisgrifio'r system gyfredol inni. Rydym yn cydnabod bod ganddi lawer o nodweddion da. Deallaf yn llwyr y ffaith ei bod yn ei hamddiffyn, ond rwy'n falch ei bod yn ystyried opsiynau ar gyfer y dyfodol, sy'n cynnwys ein cynigion.

I gloi, bu'r ddadl hon yn gynhwysfawr ac yn ddefnyddiol a gobeithio y bydd y Llywodraeth yn cymryd y camau angenrheidiol ac yn gweithredu ar gynnig a fyddai'n gwella ein democratiaeth yng Nghymru.

Welsh Liberal Democrats Debate: Innovation in Health Technology and Treatments

Motion NDM5188 Aled Roberts

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales:

1. Expresses concern that patients in Wales are not able to access the newest and most innovative medicines and treatments available to their counterparts across the UK;

2. Welcomes the creation of a Welsh Health Technology Fund but regrets the lack of investment in new, innovative technologies from the £5million allocation for the financial year 2012-2013;

3. Notes that the pharmaceutical industry invested £4.4billion in UK research and development in 2009 which is more than any other industry sector and believes that NHS Wales needs an environment that is receptive to innovation in order to compete effectively for clinical trials at a global level;

4. Believes that spending on modern medicines should be viewed as an investment rather than a cost and therefore regrets that in 2011 new medicines used in primary care accounted for only 0.5% of total NHS expenditure in Wales; and

5. Notes that Wales is forecast to gain savings of around £186million between 2011-2015 due to Loss of Exclusivity (LOE) and calls on the Welsh Government to invest some of this money into the Health Technology Fund, to support engagement with the All Wales Medicines Strategy Group (AWMSG) and National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE) so that more patients in Wales can benefit from the latest medicines and treatments.

I move the motion.

Cynigiau y cynnig.

I begin by saying that I welcome very much the fact that the Welsh Government has established a Welsh health technology fund and has attached money to it. The Liberal Democrat vision for this fund would be for it to be one that assists Welsh patients in accessing the latest treatments; ensures that the NHS in Wales would be able to recruit and retain the best clinicians in our health system; and further supports the health sciences field, in which Wales has been traditionally very strong, both in terms of academic research and the field of manufacturing. After the budget negotiations, even though the Welsh Liberal Democrats were unable to come to an agreement with the Government to substantively support the budget, we were very glad to see that that idea was taken up by it.

However, we were then disappointed that the initial allocation made to the fund was spent on equipment that I would suggest was less than innovative. That is not to say that what the money was spent on was not valuable. The replacement of scanners and other equipment in the Welsh NHS is welcome, but it was not the basis of the idea for the fund. I have met with the Minister and she has explained that there was a requirement to spend that money quite quickly, before the end of the financial year. I know that the Minister and her officials are working on new plans on how to ensure that, in future, the money is spent on cutting-edge technologies. However, it was disappointing that the first tranche was not used for that.

I also say how personally delighted I am to have seen the announcement with regard to Velindre hospital yesterday. Many times in the Chamber, I have urged the Government to invest in new cancer treatments at Velindre, and I was very pleased to see that announcement coming forward at the beginning of the week. I would be grateful if the Minister could give greater clarity on the types of treatment that will now be available in Cardiff as a result of this investment and on what other plans she has for other types of innovative radiotherapy to be made available. I also seek clarity on how issues of access for patients from north and mid Wales will be addressed. While the availability of new treatments in south Wales is very much to be welcomed—I am very pleased indeed about the announcement—it would be useful to know what plans there are to make sure that all patients in Wales have access to those treatments.

Dechreuaf drwy ddweud fy mod yn croesawu'n fawr y ffaith bod Llywodraeth Cymru wedi sefydlu cronfa technolegau iechyd Cymru ac wedi buddsoddi arian ynddi. Gweledigaeth y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol ar gyfer y gronfa hon fyddai iddi fod yn gronfa sy'n helpu cleifion yng Nghymru i gael gafael ar y triniaethau diweddaraf, yn sicrhau y byddai'r GIG yng Nghymru yn gallu recriwtio a chadw ein clinigwyr gorau yn ein system iechyd; a chefnogi'r maes gwyddorau iechyd, lle y bu Cymru yn draddodiadol gryf iawn, o ran gwaith ymchwil academiaidd ac ym maes gweithgynhyrchu. Nid yw hynny i ddweud na wariwyd yr arian ar rywbeth gwerthfawr. Dylid croesawu cynigion i adnewyddu sganwyr a chyfarpar arall yn y GIG yng Nghymru, ond nid dyna oedd diben sefydlu'r gronfa. Cyfarfûm â'r Gweinidog ac eglurodd y bu'n rhaid gwario'r arian hwnnw yn gymharol gyflym, cyn diwedd y flwyddyn ariannol. Gwn fod y Gweinidog a'i swyddogion yn gweithio ar gynlluniau newydd er mwyn sicrhau, yn y dyfodol, y caiff yr arian ei wario ar dechnolegau arloesol. Fodd bynnag, roedd yn siomedig na ddefnyddiwyd yr haen gyntaf yn y fath fodd.

Hoffwn ddweud hefyd fy mod yn hynod falch gweld y cyhoeddiad am ysbyty Felindre ddoe. Sawl gwaith yn y Siambr, anogais y Llywodraeth i fuddsoddi mewn triniaethau cancer newydd yn Felindre, ac roeddwn wrth fy modd gweld y cyhoeddiad hwnnw ddechrau'r wythnos. Byddwn yn ddiolchgar pe gallai'r Gweinidog egluro pa fathau o driniaeth a fydd bellach ar gael yng Nghaerdydd o ganlyniad i'r buddsoddiad hwn a pha gynlluniau eraill sydd ar y gweill ganddi er mwyn sicrhau bod mathau eraill o radiotherapi arloesol ar gael. Hoffwn gael esboniad hefyd o ran sut yr ymdrinnir â gallu cleifion o'r gogledd a'r canolbarth i gael gafael ar y triniaethau. Er y dylid croesawu'r ffaith bod triniaethau newydd ar gael yn y de yn fawr—rwyf wrth fy modd â'r cyhoeddiad—byddai'n ddefnyddiol gwybod pa gynlluniau a gaiff eu rhoi ar waith i sicrhau y gall pob claf yng Nghymru gael gafael ar y triniaethau hynny.

While welcoming the announcement, I am disappointed that the Government has categorically ruled out the use of the health technology fund to look at pharmaceutical interventions. Pharmaceutical interventions are also very important, and can make a huge difference to Welsh patients. Drugs recommended by the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence are ones that have gone through the approval process. However, just because that has happened, it does not mean that they are readily available in the Welsh NHS. There are examples of patients finding it difficult to get access to those latest technologies. Recently, the Health and Social Care Committee looked at the issue of atrial fibrillation, and we received evidence about new anticoagulants that were coming to the market, having been approved by NICE, to replace the old warfarin regimes. However, the actual level of prescription of those drugs was very low, and patients were not being offered them as a treatment for their AF, even though they were part of a much better regime that would require much less monitoring and many fewer visits to a GP—they were superior drugs, but prescription levels were very low.

This is not necessarily about subverting a NICE or an all-Wales medicines strategy group system. It is about ensuring that drugs that have already been approved are readily available. I know that my colleagues will go on to talk about drugs that have been approved by NICE, but still cannot be accessed by Welsh patients today on the NHS. Over the next few years, between now and 2015, a number of medicines will come off patent and will therefore be available for generic use. This will accrue savings to the Welsh NHS of some £186 million, and we are arguing that some of that money could be used to ensure that Wales ups its level of prescriptions of the very latest technology. In 2011, new medicines used in primary care accounted for only 0.5% of NHS expenditure in Wales. We are arguing that some of the money that is saved through the generification of drug regimes could be ploughed back in to ensure that we have access to the latest technology.

One particular area in which I would like to see that money used is orphan drugs. In Scotland, the Scottish Government has made available some £21 million to pay for the cost of medicines that are described as 'orphan drugs'. These are medicines for illnesses that affect fewer than one in 2,000 people, so these are medications for people suffering from very rare conditions. Often, the companies developing them are not able to go through the process, because the evidence that would be required by the processes of the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence or the all-Wales medicine strategy group require many more patients to have been treated. They are simply not able to take forward that process. The Scottish Government has acknowledged that and made that funding available. It makes the individual patient referral system and funding system much fairer, and ensures that those suffering from very rare conditions can get access to the drugs that they need on the advice of clinical specialists.

Er fy mod yn croesawu'r cyhoeddiad, rwy'n siomedig bod y Llywodraeth wedi diystyru'n llwyr y posibilrwydd o ddefnyddio'r gronfa technolegau iechyd i ystyried ymyriadau fferyllol. Mae ymyriadau fferyllol hefyd yn bwysig iawn, a gallant wneud gwahaniaeth mawr i gleifion yng Nghymru. Mae cyffuriau a argymhellir gan y Sefydliad Cenedlaethol dros lechyd a Rhagoriaeth Glinigol yn gyffuriau sydd wedi cael eu cymeradwyo. Fodd bynnag, nid yw hynny o reidrwydd yn golygu eu bod ar gael i bawb yn y GIG yng Nghymru. Mae enghreifftiau o gleifion sy'n ei chael hi'n anodd cael gafael ar y technolegau diweddaraf hynny. Fodd bynnag, roedd lefel wirioneddol y presgripsiynau ar gyfer y cyffuriau hynny yn isel iawn, ac nid oedd cleifion yn cael eu cynnig fel triniaeth ar gyfer eu ffibriliad atriaidd, er eu bod yn rhan o driniaeth lawer gwell a fyddai'n galw am lawer llai o fonitro a llawer llai o apwyntiadau meddyg teulu—roedd y cyffuriau yn llawer gwell, ond roedd lefelau presgripsiynau yn isel iawn.

Nid oes a wnelo hyn o reidrwydd â thanseilio system NICE neu grŵp strategaeth meddyginiaethau Cymru gyfan. Y nod yw sicrhau bod cyffuriau sydd eisoes wedi'u cymeradwyo ar gael yn gyffredinol. Gwn y bydd fy nghyd-Aelodau yn cyfeirio'n ddiweddarach at gyffuriau a gymeradwywyd gan NICE, ond na all cleifion yng Nghymru gael gafael arnynt o hyd yn y GIG. Yn ystod yr ychydig flynyddoedd nesaf, rhwng nawr a 2015, bydd nifer o feddyginiaethau yn derbyn patent ac felly ar gael i'w defnyddio'n gyffredinol. Bydd hyn yn arwain at arbedion o ryw £186 miliwn i'r GIG yng Nghymru, ac rydym yn dadlau y gellid defnyddio rhywfaint o'r arian hwnnw i sicrhau bod Cymru yn cynyddu lefel y presgripsiynau a roddir ar gyfer y technolegau diweddaraf. Yn 2011, dim ond 0.5% o wariant y GIG yng Nghymru a wariwyd ar feddyginiaethau newydd ym maes gofal sylfaenol. Yn yr Alban, mae Llywodraeth yr Alban wedi darparu tua £21 miliwn i dalu cost meddyginiaethau a ddisgrifir fel 'cyffuriau amddifad', sef meddyginiaethau ar gyfer mathau o salwch sy'n effeithio ar lai nag un o bob 2,000 o bobl, felly meddyginiaethau ar gyfer pobl sy'n dioddef o gyflyrau anghyffredin iawn ydynt. Yn aml, ni all y cwmnïau sy'n eu datblygu ymgymryd â'r broses, gan fod y dystiolaeth a fyddai'n ofynnol gan brosesau'r Sefydliad Cenedlaethol dros lechyd a Rhagoriaeth Glinigol neu grŵp strategaeth meddyginiaethau Cymru gyfan yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol bod nifer lawer uwch o gleifion wedi cael eu trin. Yn syml, ni allant ddatblygu'r broses honno. Mae Llywodraeth yr Alban wedi cydnabod hynny ac wedi rhyddhau'r arian hwnnw. O ganlyniad, mae'r system cyfeirio cleifion unigol a'r system ariannu yn llawer tecach, ac yn sicrhau y gall y rheini sy'n dioddef o gyflyrau anghyffredin iawn gael gafael ar y cyffuriau sydd eu hangen arnynt yn ôl cyngor arbenigwyr clinigol.

I will just take a moment to talk about the Tory amendment with regard to the cancer drugs fund. Cancer is a terrible disease that touches every single family in Wales, and I know how awful that is. However, the Welsh Liberal Democrats believe that it is important that all illnesses are treated on an equal basis. Professor Mike Richards, the cancer tsar for England, has himself acknowledged that levels of prescription for Alzheimer's and other conditions are as poor as they can be for cancer. While we would expect some cancer drugs to fall into the technologies fund, we think it important that all illnesses are treated on an equitable basis, and we should be looking at new and innovative drugs across the field—for cystic fibrosis, for example, which was mentioned in the Chamber only yesterday—and that this fund should not be established to treat cancer exclusively.

I hope that we can persuade the Welsh Government, having persuaded it of the need for a Welsh health technology fund in the first place, to work with us to ensure that the fund could be extended to look at pharmaceutical solutions where that is clinically appropriate, so that Welsh patients have access to the very best medicine that is available, and so that doctors practicing their medicine know that they can use those technologies to best assist their patients. Why would you want to be a doctor working in a system that does not allow you to practice your best medicine? This would also support an industry that the Welsh Government itself has said is strategically important to the Welsh economy. I look forward to what colleagues have to say in this important debate.

Hoffwn am eiliad gyfeirio at welliant y Toriaid mewn perthynas â'r gronfa cyffuriau cancer. Mae cancer yn glefyd echrydus sy'n effeithio ar bob teulu yng Nghymru, a gwn pa mor ofnadwy yw hynny. I am grateful for the motion tabled today. It is comprehensive and very timely, as Kirsty Williams said, given the announcement this week by the Government on the investment in new radiotherapy equipment in Velindre. That is to be welcomed and it will be welcomed across the Chamber, I am sure, and by cancer patients and those suffering from other diseases across Wales. It is important for me as an Assembly Member for Ceredigion that Velindre, as a centre of excellence, works for all parts of Wales, including my constituency.

I will refer, therefore, to the amendment in the name of Plaid Cymru. I accept entirely clause 1 in the motion as drafted, which:

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'pryder nad yw cleifion yng Nghymru yn gallu cael gafael ar y triniaethau a'r meddyginaethau mwyaf newydd a mwyaf arloesol'.

Fodd bynnag, rydym yn cynnig gwella'r cymal hwnnw drwy osod bod hwn yn enwedig o wir yn achosion cleifion sy'n dioddef o glefydau sy'n brin iawn. Hoffwn gymryd rhywfaint o amser i sôn am etholwraig i mi a'i phrofiad hi gyda hyn. Mae hi'n fenyw ifanc sy'n dioddef ar hyn o bryd o'r cyflwr prin acromegali. Ers 2005—wyth mlynedd yn ôl—mae gwaith academiaidd bellach wedi digwydd ar effeithiolrwydd pegvisomant, ond, er hyn, nid yw fy etholwraig i wedi bod yn llwyddiannus yn ei chais na'i apel i gael derbyn y cyffwr hwn drwy'r NHS, gan fod y grŵp strategaeth meddyginaethau yn cadw at ei asesiad yn 2005, sef wyth mlynedd yn ôl.

Meddyliwch am sefyllfa'r unigolyn hwn, yn cael diagnosis o un o glefydau mwyaf prin gwledydd Prydain ac yna i ddeall nad yw'r unig driniaeth ar ôl iddi ar gael iddi drwy'r NHS. Mae ei theulu wedi trefnu deiseb ac wedi ei gyflwyno i'r Pwyllgor Deisebau eisoes. Bydd hwnnw'n cael ei drafod maes o law gan y Pwyllgor Deisebau, ac rwyf yn cyfathrebu â'r Gweinidog ar y mater hwn. Un unigolyn yw hwn, ac un cyffwr ar gyfer un clefyd prin. Fodd bynnag, mae'n rhaid inni gael cyfundrefn sy'n asesu cyffuriau yn dryloyw yng Nghymru, ac yn rheolaidd. Cyfeiriodd Plaid Cymru at hyn yn ein dadl yn y Cynulliad yr wythnos diwethaf. Hoffwn weld agwedd rhagweithiol oddi wrth Lywodraeth Cymru i gydweithio â'r diwydiant fferyllol. Gall hwn ddod â budd economaidd o ran swyddi ymchwil a datblygu i Gymru a phortffolio academiaidd o ansawdd uchel. Hefyd, mae gweithgarwch y cwmnïau fferyllol yng Nghymru yn gallu arwain, wrth gwrs, at fwy o dreialon clinigol yng Nghymru, sydd o fudd i gleifion yng Nghymru, ond mae hi hefyd yn gwneud ein prifysgolion a'n hysbytai sy'n cynnal treialon clinigol yn fwy deniadol i glinigwyr disglair ac i staff sydd eisiau gweithio a pharhau i weithio o fewn y NHS yng Nghymru, nid dim ond yng Nghaerdydd, ond yn Abertawe, Bangor ac mewn ysbytai ar hyd a lled Cymru. Rydym wedi gweld Llywodraeth yr Alban yn gwneud cynnydd mawr yn y maes hwn a hoffwn weld Llywodraeth Cymru yn gwneud yr un cynnydd.

'Expresses concern that patients in Wales are not able to access the newest and most innovative medicines and treatments'.

However, we propose improving that clause by stating that this is especially true in the case of patients who suffer from very rare diseases. I would like to take some time to talk about a constituent of mine and her experience in this regard. She is a young woman who currently suffers from the rare condition acromegaly. The only possible treatment for her, which is recommended by her hospital consultant, is the drug pegvisomant, which is licensed by only one drugs company.

Pegvisomant was last assessed in 2005 by the All-Wales medicines strategy group. It was recommended that it should not be available within NHS Wales as a rule. Since 2005—eight years ago—further academic work has been done on the effectiveness of pegvisomant, but, despite this, my constituent has not succeeded in her bid or her appeal to receive this drug on the NHS, as the all-Wales medicines strategy group has kept to its assessment in 2005, which is eight years ago.

Consider the situation of this individual, given a diagnosis of one of the rarest diseases in the UK and then to understand that the only treatment available to her is not available on the NHS. Her family has organised a petition and has already presented it to the Petitions Committee. That will be discussed in due course by the Petitions Committee, and I am in correspondence with the Minister on this issue. That is one individual, and one drug for one rare disease. However, we have to have a regime that assesses drugs in a transparent way in Wales, and regularly. By the way, acromegaly is not a cancer, and that is why we will today vote against the Conservative amendment that refers to cancer treatments only. In accordance with what Kirsty Williams said in her opening remarks, we need to expand this debate to cover treatments and drugs that relate to all those unfortunate enough to suffer from these diseases in Wales, including cancer.

I would like to turn to one other area in this motion before I conclude, and that is point 3 of the motion, which mentions the important economic role of the pharmaceutical industry. Plaid Cymru referred to this in our debate in the Assembly last week. I would like to see a proactive approach from the Welsh Government to collaborating with the pharmaceutical industry. This could bring economic benefits in terms of research and development jobs to Wales and a high-quality academic portfolio. Also, the activity of pharmaceutical companies in Wales can lead, of course, to more clinical trials in Wales, which is of benefit to patients in Wales, but also makes our universities and hospitals that conduct clinical trials more attractive to outstanding clinicians and staff who want to work and continue to work within the NHS in Wales, not only in Cardiff, but in Swansea, Bangor and in hospitals throughout Wales. We have seen the Scottish Government make great progress in this area and I want to see the Welsh Government make the same progress.

This is a great time to have one of these debates, because we know that the Welsh health technology fund, when it was established, was trumpeted by the Government as something that would provide brand new and innovative technologies that were going to make a real difference to people in Wales. Then, lo and behold, it was a let-down in terms of the things that it actually funded—things that should have been simple replacements of equipment that, for some reason, were ring-fenced into this particular fund in order to give the impression of action in terms of trying to get modern treatments to Welsh patients. Well, we have managed to expose already in this debate the fact that this health technologies fund was not all it was trumpeted to be when it was established. That point was made quite eloquently by Kirsty Williams, and it is a point that we share.

Mae nawr yn amser ardderchog i gael un o'r dadleuon hyn, oherwydd gwyddom fod y Llywodraeth wedi canmol cronfa technolegau iechyd Cymru, adeg ei sefydlu, fel rhywbeth a fyddai'n darparu technolegau arloesol, newydd sbon a fyddai'n gwneud gwahaniaeth gwirioneddol i bobl yng Nghymru. Wedyn, wele ryfeddod, roedd yn siom o ran y pethau a ariannwyd ganddi mewn gwirionedd—cyfarpar y dylid bod wedi'i adnewyddu fel mater o drefn a gafodd ei glustnodi, am ryw reswm, i'r gronfa benodol hon er mwyn rhoi'r argraff ein bod wedi gweithredu o ran ceisio sicrhau triniaethau modern ar gyfer cleifion yng Nghymru. Wel, rydym wedi llwyddo eisoes, fel rhan o'r ddadl hon, i amlygu'r ffaith nad oedd y gronfa technolegau iechyd hon yn cyfateb mewn gwirionedd i'r hyn a addawyd adeg ei sefydlu. Gwnaeth Kirsty Williams y pwynt hwnnw yn huawdl iawn, ac mae'n bwynt a rennir gennym.

Reference has been made by the previous two speakers in this debate to this not being just about cancer. I understand that point. I absolutely do. If you look at our amendments, we do not preclude the health technologies fund from funding other forms of treatments or drugs. We are simply saying that we are very disappointed that cancer drugs and treatments do not form part of that fund's allocation. Therefore, I hope that you will withdraw your opposition to the amendments that have been tabled in the name of William Graham, because they are there for a purpose. They are there because we believe that the evidence is very clear that there are over 20 drugs—24 drugs, according to the Rarer Cancers Foundation—that are now regularly available in other parts of the United Kingdom, most notably, in England, through the establishment of the cancer drugs fund there, which are not regularly available in Wales. That is very disappointing. There is a stark difference between the approach taken in Wales and the one taken in England. That is why we have people who—in absolute dire straits after receiving an appalling diagnosis with some difficult news in terms of the prognosis—decide that they have to move from their family homes in Wales and re-root themselves in England in order to get access to drugs. That is absolutely intolerable in this day and age as far as I am concerned. We need to do better in relation to access to those drugs. I hope, therefore, that you will support the amendments which we have tabled.

Reference has also been made to the Scottish Government's orphan drugs fund. I think that is a very interesting development. It is something that we need to take note of in Wales. However, I think that we have to be realistic about what can be achieved through such funds. I was talking to somebody from a company called Shire this morning, which has innovative enzyme treatments for people with certain rare diseases. Its products are very specialised and would help a relatively small number of people each year in Wales, but would cost, on an annual basis, just for that small pool of people, about £8.3 million. So, we have to be careful in how we use our money. We have to ensure that the emphasis is in the right areas. That is why, while I absolutely recognise the important developments taking place in Scotland, I wonder whether £20 million will be enough to meet the demands placed upon it, frankly.

With regard to the pharmaceutical industry, it, of course, contributes a huge amount to the UK economy, but not so much to the Welsh economy. That is because we have not done enough as a nation to attract investment from pharmaceutical companies into Wales and to allow Wales to benefit from jobs and the research and development spend that these companies can bring. I note that the Minister for business is in the Chamber this afternoon and I know that she is listening carefully to this debate, because this can have a huge impact on our economy. I very much hope that she is doing all that she can to attract that kind of investment.

Felly, rhaid inni fod yn ofalus o ran sut y defnyddiwn ein harian. Rhaid inni sicrhau bod y pwyslais ar y meysydd cywir. Dyna pam, er fy mod yn llwyr gydnabod y datblygiadau pwysig sy'n mynd rhagddynt yn yr Alban, rwy'n amau, mewn gwirionedd, a fydd £20 miliwn yn ddigon i fodloni'r gofynion ar y gronfa.

O ran y diwydiant fferyllo, wrth gwrs, mae'n cyfrannu swm sylweddol i economi'r DU, ond nid cymaint i economi Cymru. Mae hynny am nad ydym wedi gwneud digon fel cenedl i ddenu buddsoddiad gan gwmnïau fferyllo i Gymru ac i alluogi Cymru i elwa ar y swyddi a'r gwariant ymchwil a datblygu a all fod yn gysylltiedig â'r cwmnïau hyn. Nodaf fod y Gweinidog Busnes yn y Siambr y prynhawn yma a gwn ei bod yn gwrandao'n astud ar y ddadl hon, oherwydd gall hyn gael effaith sylweddol ar ein heconomi. Gobeithio'n fawr ei bod yn gwneud ei gorau glas i ddenu'r math hwnnw o fuddsoddiad.

Turning to the reinvestment of some of the £186 million in savings that are coming online over the next few years, we absolutely support that point. We think that there is no reason why a proportion of those savings cannot be reinvested into making sure that Welsh patients can benefit from some of these modern, effective drugs, which have been approved and demonstrated to have clinical effectiveness, but which are not yet available here. The reality is that this is not just about pharmaceuticals; there are other treatments out there. We have already talked about stereotactic radiotherapy, but there are other targeted forms of radiotherapy that are not delivered in that way, for example, selective internal radiation therapy, which also needs to be more widely available here.

Mae cyffuriau 'ultra-orphan' yn cael eu trwyddedu i drin clefydau prin sy'n effeithio ar llai nag un o bob 50,000 o bobl yn y Deyrnas Unedig. Yng Nghymru, byddai hyn yn cyfateb i tua 60 achos. Caiff pob meddyginiaeth ei harfarnu fesul achos, ond mae costau uchel yn gysylltiedig â datblygu meddyginiaethau 'ultra-orphan'. Mae polisi gan grŵp strategaeth meddyginiaethau Cymru gyfan, ond efallai y dylid cael corff arbenigol ar wahân yng Nghymru i ystyried y meddyginiaethau hyn a sut y gallwn ysgogi eu datblygiad.

Rydym hefyd yn hapus i gefnogi gwelliannau'r Ceidwadwyr. Bydd ymestyn y gronfa technolegau iechyd i gwmpasu buddsoddiad mewn meddyginiaethau newydd yn anochel yn ehangu mynediad i driniaethau cancer modern i gleifion yng Nghymru, yn ogystal â thriniaethau ar gyfer nifer o glefydau eraill. Fodd bynnag, fel y dywedodd Kirsty, nid ydym yn credu y dylid rhoi blaenoriaeth i fuddsoddi mewn meddyginiaethau cancer ar draul meddyginiaethau eraill. Yn 2010, dangosodd adroddiad gan yr Athro Mike Richards bod y ddarpariaeth meddyginiaethau mewn meysydd fel dementia ac MS yr un mor wael â'r ddarpariaeth ar gyfer cancer, ond nad oedd unrhyw gynlluniau ar gyfer cyllid tebyg i'r rhai ar gyfer y gronfa cyffuriau cancer yn Lloegr.

Mae Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol Cymru wedi cyflwyno'r ddadl hon gan ein bod yn pryderu bod gormod o gleifion yng Nghymru yn methu â chael gafael ar y meddyginiaethau mwyaf diweddar ac arloesol, er eu bod ar gael a bod tystiolaeth helaeth yn dangos eu bod yn effeithiol yn glinigol ac yn gost-effeithiol. Mae cais rhyddid gwybodaeth wedi dangos bod Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Cwm Taf yn dal i weithio ar ganllawiau i gyflwyno rivaroxaban ar gyfer thrombosis gwythiennau dwfn ac embolism yr ysgyfaint na fyddant yn dod i rym tan fis Mai neu fis Mehefin, er bod y cyffur wedi ei gymeradwyo ym mis Gorffennaf 2012. Mae'n rhaid i gleifion yng Nghymru aros tan fis Mai i gael penderfyniad ar y cyffur Kalydeco, sy'n driniaeth a all newid bywydau pobl sydd â rhai mathau o ffibrosis systig. Mae'r cyffur wedi bod ar gael ar y gwasanaeth iechyd yn Lloegr ers 1 Ionawr ac ers 1 Mawrth yn yr Alban. Yn 2011, canfu adroddiad gan y Rarer Cancers Foundation o'r enw 'Nations Divided?' bod cleifion yng Nghymru bum gwaith yn llai tebygol o allu cael gafael ar gyffur cancer nad yw ar gael fel arfer o gymharu â chleifion yn Lloegr.

I confirm from the outset that we are happy to support Plaid Cymru's amendment, which adds to the motion. Ultra-orphan drugs are those licensed for the treatment of rare diseases that affect fewer than one in 50,000 people in the UK. In Wales, this would equate to around 60 cases. Each medicine is appraised on a case by case basis, but there are high costs associated with the development of ultra-orphan medicines. The all-Wales medicines strategy group has a policy, but perhaps we should be looking at a separate specialist body in Wales to consider these medicines and how we can incentivise their development.

We are also happy to support the Conservative amendments. Extending the health technology fund to cover investment in new medicines will inevitably extend access to modern cancer treatments for Welsh patients, as well as treatments for many other diseases. However, as Kirsty said, we still do not believe in the need to prioritise investment in cancer drugs above other medicines. In 2010, a report by Professor Mike Richards showed that medicine provision in areas such as dementia and MS was ranked as poorly as the provision for cancer, but there were no plans to introduce funding similar to the cancer drugs fund in England.

The Welsh Liberal Democrats have tabled this debate because we are concerned that too many patients in Wales cannot access the newest and most innovative medicines, even though they are available and supported by extensive evidence that they are effective clinically and are cost effective. A freedom of information request has revealed that Cwm Taf Local Health Board is still working on guidelines to introduce rivaroxaban for deep vein thrombosis and pulmonary embolism that will not be implemented until May or June, even though the medicine was approved in July 2012. Patients in Wales must wait until May for a decision on the Kalydeco drug, which is a potentially life-changing treatment for people with a certain form of cystic fibrosis. In England, this drug has been freely available on the NHS since 1 January and in Scotland it has been available since 1 March. In 2011, the Rarer Cancers Foundation report 'Nations Divided?' found that patients in Wales were five times less likely to access a cancer drug that is not routinely available compared with patients in England.

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Rydym yn arbennig o bryderus ynglŷn â'r bwlch asesu rhwng arfarnu technoleg iechyd a'r ceisiadau am gyllid gan gleifion. Mae penderfyniad yng Nghymru yn cael ei wneud dipyn yn arafach nag yn Lloegr a'r Alban, ond hefyd nid yw rhai cwmnïau, elusennau nag unigolion yn gallu cael gafael ar y dystiolaeth eang sy'n ofynnol i brofi pa mor glinigol a chost-ffeithiol ydyw. Mae Elin Jones eisoes wedi rhoi esiampl i ni o'r defnydd o pegvisomant, ond mae esiampl arall hefyd. Yn 2012, cysylltodd y grŵp strategol gyda datblygwyr y cyffur Fampyra, sy'n gallu gwella gallu oedolion sydd â pharlys ymledol i gerdded. Mae treialon clinigol wedi dangos bod y cyffur yn gallu cyflymu cerddediad 25% ar gyfartaledd. Yn anffodus, mae datblygwyr wedi methu cyflwyno'r data angenrheidiol ar ba mor glinigol a chost-ffeithiol ydyw, fel y gall y grŵp strategol ei arfarnu.

Pan fo'r meddyginiaethau mwyaf modern ar gael, maent yn gallu cael effaith anferth ac arbed bywydau cleifion di-rif yng Nghymru. Cyhoeddwyd yr wythnos diwethaf bod y cyffur newydd Tresiba, sydd ar gyfer cleifion gyda diabetes math 1 a math 2 i reoli'r cyflwr unwaith y dydd gyda phigiad, ar gael bellach ar y gwasanaeth iechyd yng Nghymru.

Felly, pwrpas ein dadl heddiw yw mynegi cryn bryder ynghylch y defnydd sydd wedi ei wneud o'r gronfa eleni, tra'n croesawu'r egwyddor y tu cefn i'r gronfa. Mae llawer mwy y gallwn ei wneud.

We are particularly concerned about the gap in assessment between the health technology appraisal and individual patient funding requests. Decisions in Wales are being made much slower than decisions in England and Scotland, but also some companies, charities and individuals are unable to obtain the extensive evidence required to prove clinical and cost-effectiveness. Elin Jones has already given us an example of the use of pegvisomant, but there is also another example. In 2012, the strategy group contacted the developer of the drug Fampyra, which can improve walking in adult patients with multiple sclerosis. Clinical trials have shown that the drug can increase walking speed by an average of 25%. Sadly, the developer has failed to submit the necessary data on clinical and cost-effectiveness to enable the strategy group to appraise it.

Where the most modern medicines are being made available, they can have a huge impact and potentially save the lives of many patients in Wales. Last week, it was announced that the new drug Tresiba, for patients with type 1 and type 2 diabetes to manage their condition with a once-a-day injection, is now available on the NHS in Wales.

Therefore, the purpose of our debate today is to express grave concern about the use that has been made of the fund this year, while welcoming the principle behind the fund. There is much more that we can do.

It is very good that the Liberal Democrats have chosen this week to have this debate, which gives me the opportunity to welcome the big investment in Velindre hospital in my constituency, and I am very pleased that all parties have welcomed this investment. It is something that Velindre has been looking at for a long time. It made a presentation here which many of you attended, although I cannot remember how long ago that was, and it has been working very carefully on a business case to provide stereotactic body radiotherapy, and the Welsh Government responded with £4.6 million as soon as the business case was completed. It is a great day for patients suffering from cancer in Wales, because it is a major step forward. It will treat 290 patients a year. Velindre will be offering it to some patients who have lung lesions that are currently inoperable. Therefore, it is groundbreaking. This also coincides with £1.5 million from Cancer Research Wales to do more cancer research work via the Wales cancer bank. Certainly, it is generally accepted that Wales is leading the way in working collaboratively between the voluntary sector and the public sector in pursuing these developments.

Mae'n beth da iawn bod y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol wedi dewis yr wythnos hon i gael y ddadl hon, sy'n rhoi'r cyfle imi groesawu'r buddsoddiad sylweddol yn ystyby Felindre yn fy etholaeth, ac rwy'n falch iawn bod pob plaid wedi croesawu'r buddsoddiad hwn. Mae'n rhywbeth y mae Felindre wedi bod yn ei ystyried ers peth amser. Gwnaeth gyflwyniad yma, yr oedd llawer ohonoch yn bresennol ynddo, er na allaf gofio faint o amser sydd ers hynny, ac mae wedi bod yn gweithio'n ofalus iawn ar achos busnes dros ddarparu radiotherapi corff stereotactig, ac ymatebodd Llywodraeth Cymru drwy roi £4.6 miliwn cyn gynted ag y cwblhawyd yr achos busnes. Mae'n ddiwrnod mawr i gleifion yng Nghymru sy'n dioddef o ganser, gan ei fod yn gam mawr ymlaen. Bydd yn trin 290 o gleifion bob blwyddyn. Bydd Felindre yn ei gynnig i rai cleifion â briwiau ar yr ysgyfaint na ellir cynnal llawdriniaeth arnynt ar hyn o bryd. Felly, mae'n torri tir newydd. Mae'n cyd-daro hefyd â £1.5 miliwn i Ymchwil Canser Cymru i gynnal mwy o waith ymchwil i ganser drwy fanc cancer Cymru. Yn sicr, derbynnir yn gyffredinol bod Cymru ar flaen y gad o ran cydweithredu rhwng y sector gwirfoddol a'r sector cyhoeddus wrth frw at â'r datblygiadau hyn.

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I chair the cross-party group on cancer. We recently had a presentation on the groundbreaking research that is being done in Wales. The motion does not recognise that many patients have the opportunity of having the new drugs when they take part in the clinical trials. Wales has, in fact, exceeded its targets for the number of patients on clinical trials. It is now above 10%. One in seven patients in Wales has the opportunity to take part in the clinical trials. It is thought now that that figure should be set higher. There is also a programme to test cancer patients in order to ascertain whether they are suitable for certain stratified medicines, such as Herceptin. Wales is only one of two places in the UK where there is a technical hub, which is a laboratory site, and a clinical hub to collect samples. The other is in the Royal Marsden hospital. Wales is certainly developing very well in these fields in terms of progressing cancer treatment. I do not think that it is fair not to recognise the big strides that are being made in Wales at the present time.

I agree with the Liberal Democrats that one of the issues is that there are many ideas in Wales, but it is difficult to get small countries to produce the goods to make the heart valves, the different bits of equipment and so on. Wales tends to get the ideas—you consistently hear on Radio 4 that there are new advances from Cardiff, Swansea and Bangor universities and so on—but the big pharmaceutical companies have to do the manufacturing work. It will be really good if we could get more of the home-grown bodies. However, then, we do not want to decry the big companies such as GE Healthcare in my constituency in Cardiff North.

I know that things are not straightforward. All patients in Wales have the right to have drugs that are NICE approved. There are difficulties sometimes in getting access to those drugs. For example, I met the Minister about haemophiliac patients who have had difficulty in accessing drugs that had been agreed by NICE. That has now been sorted out and, hopefully, that is a procedure that can be streamlined. On a positive point, talking about haemophiliac patients, the centre in the Heath hospital in Cardiff is visited by people from England. Patients from England go to the haemophilia centre because its standards are so high and it is a first-class place. We are offering very good things.

My last point is about the Welsh health technologies fund. Some of the funds received from the Welsh Government in 2012-13 have been invested in the upgrading of the next-generation sequencing platforms and medical genetics service in the Heath hospital. This is of major importance, because it will mean that the research samples will not necessarily have to be sent out of the country to be analysed as happens at the moment. It is disappointing that this particular proposal is being downgraded.

Rwy'n gadeirydd ar y grŵp trawsbleidiol ar ganser. Yn ddiweddar, cawsom gyflwyniad ar yr ymchwili arloesol sy'n mynd rhagddi yng Nghymru. Nid yw'r cynnig yn cydnabod bod llawer o gleifion yn cael y cyfle i gael y cyffuriau newydd drwy gymryd rhan yn y treialon clinigol. Mae Cymru, mewn gwirionedd, wedi rhagori ar ei thargedau ar gyfer nifer y cleifion ar dreialon clinigol. Mae bellach yn uwch na 10%. Caiff un o bob saith claf yng Nghymru y cyfle i gymryd rhan yn y treialon clinigol. Credir bellach y dylid pennu'r ffigur hwnnw ar lefel uwch. Mae rhaglen hefyd i brofi cleifion cancer er mwyn canfod a ydynt yn addas ar gyfer meddyginiaethau strata penodol, megis Herceptin. Mae Cymru yn un o blith dim ond dau le yn y DU lle ceir canolfan dechnegol, sef labordy, a chanolfan glinigol ar gyfer casglu samplau. Yn Ysbyty Brenhinol Marsden mae'r llall. Yn sicr, mae Cymru'n datblygu'n dda iawn yn y meysydd hyn o ran gwella triniaethau cancer. Ni chredaf ei bod yn deg peidio â chydabod y camau mawrion a wneir yng Nghymru ar hyn o bryd.

Cytunaf â'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol mai un o'r problemau yw bod llawer o syniadau yng Nghymru, ond ei bod yn anodd cael gwledydd bach i gynhyrchu'r nwyddau i wneud falfiau'r galon, y gwahanol fathau o gyfarpar ac ati. Y duedd yw bod y syniadau yn deillio o Gymru—clywch yn rheolaidd ar Radio 4 am ddatblygiadau newydd gan brifysgolion Caerdydd, Abertawe a Bangor ac ati—ond mai'r cwmnïau fferyllol mawr sy'n gwneud y gwaith gweithgynhyrchu. Byddai o fudd mawr pe galledddefnyddio mwy o gyrff o Gymru. Fodd bynnag, wedyn, nid ydym am fychanu'r cwmnïau mawr megis GE Healthcare yn fy etholaeth i yng Ngogledd Caerdydd.

Gwn nad yw pethau'n syml. Mae gan bob claf yng Nghymru yr hawl i gael cyffuriau sydd wedi'u cymeradwyo gan NICE. Ceir anawsterau weithiau wrth gael gafael ar y cyffuriau hynny. Er enghraifft, cyfarfûm â'r Gweinidog am gleifion hemoffilig sydd wedi ei chael hi'n anodd cael cyffuriau y cytunwyd arnynt gan NICE. Mae hynny bellach wedi'i ddatrys a, gobeithio, fod honno'n driniaeth y gellir ei symleiddio. Ar bwynt cadarnhaol, wrth gyfeirio at gleifion hemoffilig, mae pobl o Loegr yn ymweld â'r ganolfan yn ysbyty'r Mynydd Bychan yng Nghaerdydd. Mae cleifion o Loegr yn mynd i'r ganolfan hemoffilia gan fod ei safonau mor uchel a'i bod yn ganolfan o'r radd flaenaf. Rydym yn cynnig pethau da iawn.

Mae a wnelo fy mhwynt olaf â chronfa technolegau iechyd Cymru. Buddsoddwyd rhywfaint o'r arian a gafwyd gan Lywodraeth Cymru yn 2012-13 mewn prosesau i uwchraddio llwyfannau dilyniannu cenhedlaeth nesaf a'r gwasanaeth geneteg meddygol yn ysbyty'r Mynydd Bychan. Mae hyn yn bwysig iawn, oherwydd bydd yn golygu na fydd o reidrwydd yn rhaid anfon y samplau ymchwil allan o'r wlad i'w dadansoddi fel sy'n digwydd ar hyn o bryd. Mae'n siomedig fod y cynnig penodol hwn yn cael ei israddio.

I thank Julie Morgan for referencing some important research centres here in Cardiff, namely the Velindre Cancer Centre and the medical genetics service that she just referenced. The Velindre NHS Trust does not only treat patients, it is also a major centre for clinical trials. As Kirsty Williams said, there is a question of why you would want to be a doctor in a place where you cannot do your best medicine. You have to ask why you would want to invest in a clinical trial in a place where they are never going to take up that new medicine.

The life sciences is a key sector for our economy and it has grown by nearly 20% in Wales over the last three years. It is a fantastic success story for us. The jobs are high in value and quality and they are deeply embedded. Once they are created, these jobs create supply chains that are difficult to replicate elsewhere, so it is well worth investing in. Now is a crucial time in the development of life sciences as an industry. We see the big pharmaceutical companies now closing their major research and development centres in favour of developing partnerships with universities, hospital trusts and research institutes. There is a wonderful opportunity for Wales there, but we must recognise that it is a huge global industry and there are very credible competitors elsewhere. If we look at just the rest of the UK, we see that in 2009, the pharmaceutical industry invested £4.4 billion in the UK economy, more than any other individual industry. That is extraordinary. It is 28% of all the research and development investment in the UK economy. It is an extraordinary amount.

Wales is, in theory, well placed to benefit from that, because we have an existing life sciences business cluster around Cardiff and Swansea. We have innovators and market leaders like Quotient Bioresearch, which does things like tagging elements in different drugs so that they can be tracked. We have spin-out companies from our universities and we have a fantastic research capacity in Wales. In our higher education, we have people such as Professor Chris McGuigan at Cardiff University school of pharmacy who is a one-man pharmaceutical company in many ways, because he has developed so many new lines of inquiry. We have third sector organisations such as Cancer Research UK's clinical trials unit, based in Cardiff and we have the Velindre Cancer Centre in Cardiff North too.

However, as I said, we have to be realistic. There are competitors everywhere. It is not just the golden triangle of Oxford, Cambridge and the London universities. If it were, it would be tough enough, but this is a global industry, and we are competing with the big universities in America, Australia and new and emerging economies. That is a major threat to our ambitions in this area. If we are to harness this investment for Wales, we have to support growth in life sciences by creating an environment in Wales that is receptive to and obviously values that innovation.

Diolch i Julie Morgan am gyfeirio at rai canolfannau ymchwil pwysig yma yng Nghaerdydd, sef Canolfan Canser Felindre a'r gwasanaeth geneteg meddygol y mae newydd gyfeirio ato. Nid dim ond trin cleifion a wna Ymddiriedolaeth GIG Felindre, mae'n ganolfan bwysig ar gyfer treialon clinigol hefyd. Fel y dywedodd Kirsty Williams, pam y byddech am fod yn feddyg yn rhywle lle na allwch ymarfer eich meddygaeth orau? Rhaid gofyn pam y byddech am fuddsoddi mewn treial clinigol mewn lleoliad lle na fyddant byth yn defnyddio'r feddyginiaeth newydd honno.

Mae gwyddorau bywyd yn sector allweddol ar gyfer ein heconomi ac mae wedi tyfu bron i 20% yng Nghymru yn ystod y tair blynedd diwethaf. Mae'n stori lwyddiant ardderchog inni. Mae'r swyddi yn uchel o ran eu gwerth a'u hansawdd ac wedi ymsefydlu'n gadarn. Unwaith y cânt eu creu, mae'r swyddi hyn yn creu cadwyni cyflenwi sy'n anodd eu hefelychu mewn mannau eraill, felly mae'n werth buddsoddi ynddynt. Mae bellach yn gyfnod hanfodol yn y broses o ddatblygu gwyddorau bywyd fel diwydiant. Gwelwn yn awr fod y cwmnïau fferyllol mawr yn cau eu prif ganolfannau ymchwil a datblygu er mwyn datblygu partneriaethau â phrifysgolion, ymddiriedolaethau ysbyty a sefydliadau ymchwil. Mae hynny'n gyfle ardderchog i Gymru, ond rhaid inni gydnabod ei fod yn ddiwydiant byd-eang enfawr a bod cystadleuwyr credadwy iawn mewn mannau eraill. Dim ond o ystyried gweddill y DU, gwelwn fod y diwydiant fferyllol wedi buddsoddi £4.4 biliwn yn economi'r DU yn 2009, sy'n fwy nag unrhyw ddiwydiant unigol arall. Mae hynny'n anhygoel. Mae'n cyfateb i 28% o'r holl fuddsoddiad ymchwil a datblygu yn y DU. Mae'n swm anhygoel.

Mewn egwyddor, mae Cymru mewn sefyllfa dda i gael budd o hynny, gan fod gennym glwstwr busnes gwyddorau bywyd eisoes yn ardal Caerdydd ac Abertawe. Mae gennym arloeswyr ac arweinwyr y farchnad fel Quotient Bioresearch, sy'n gwneud pethau fel tagio elfennau o fewn gwahanol gyffuriau fel y gellir eu holrhain. Mae gennym gwmnïau deillio o'n prifysgolion ac mae gennym gapasiti ymchwil gwych yng Nghymru. Yn ein sefydliadau addysg uwch, mae gennym bobl fel yr Athro Chris McGuigan yn ysgol fferylliaeth Prifysgol Caerdydd, sydd, mewn sawl ffordd, yn gwmni fferyllol un-dyn, gan ei fod wedi datblygu cymaint o linellau ymholi newydd. Mae gennym sefydliadau trydydd sector fel uned treialon clinigol Cancer Research UK yng Nghaerdydd ac mae gennym Ganolfan Canser Felindre yng Ngogledd Caerdydd hefyd.

Fodd bynnag, fel y dywedais, rhaid inni fod yn realistig. Mae cystadleuwyr ymhob man. Nid dim ond yn nhriongl euraidd Rhydychen, Caergrawnt a phrifysgolion Llundain. Pe bai felly, byddai hynny'n ddigon anodd, ond mae'r diwydiant yn ddiwydiant byd-eang, ac rydym yn cystadlu â'r prifysgolion mawr yn America, Awstralia ac economïau newydd a datblygol. Mae hynny'n fygythiad mawr i'n huchelgeisiau yn y maes hwn. Er mwyn harneisio'r buddsoddiad hwn i Gymru, rhaid inni gefnogi twf ym maes gwyddorau bywyd drwy greu amgylchedd yng Nghymru sy'n barod i dderbyn yr arloesedd hwnnw ac sy'n amlwg yn ei werthfawrogi.

It would be difficult to attract clinical trials to a country where the gold standard therapies for disease areas are not being regularly used by clinicians. Minister, you have said that there is evidence that demonstrates a link between centres participating in clinical trials and the overall quality of clinical care for all patients. We must do what we can to get those trials, because this is not just about money or getting the jobs and opportunities here, this is about the quality of care and developing a virtuous circle for Wales, where we see investment in new treatments, leading to a greater emphasis on patient care, allowing us to attract the best doctors to deliver the best treatments and, by becoming an example, to attract even more investment and starting that circle over again. However, unfortunately, we are trapped in a vicious circle at the moment where we see that patients, in order to access treatments that are available, have to go through patient referral programmes that delay proceedings. One of the first pieces of casework that I had when I came to the Assembly was a gentleman who came to me trying to access a medicine that was available, but only if he was a special case. We fought for him and we got him that medicine, but, sadly, not until his cancer had progressed to a point where it was no longer treatable and, about two weeks after we had permission to go ahead with the medicine, he had died. We need to make sure that those patients have speedy and appropriate access to the treatments that will extend and improve their lives.

Byddai'n anodd denu treialon clinigol i wlad lle nad yw'r therapïau safon euraidd ar gyfer meysydd clefyd yn cael eu defnyddio'n rheolaidd gan glinigwyr. Weinidog, rydych wedi dweud bod tystiolaeth sy'n dangos cyswllt rhwng canolfannau sy'n cymryd rhan mewn treialon clinigol ac ansawdd cyffredinol gofal clinigol i bob claf. I thank Members for their comments on health technology. I very much welcome this opportunity to reiterate my position that in Wales we will continue to invest in new, innovative and cost-effective medicines and technology and embed a world-leading research culture within NHS Wales.

Our investment in new medicines continues unabated. All medicines approved by the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence in the UK are available in Wales. Our record on this speaks for itself. In the last financial year, NHS Wales spent £94.5 million on new, innovative medicines recommended by NICE. In those situations where NICE has no immediate plans to undertake an appraisal of a new medicine, we then look to the all-Wales medicines strategy group to evaluate cost-effectiveness. This speeds up the availability of new medicines prior to advice being available from NICE and thereby provides an additional service for patients in Wales.

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In 2011-12, we invested £23.7 million on medicines appraised and recommended by the All Wales Medicines Strategy Group. This was £23.7 million in addition to the £94.5 million invested in new medicines recommended by NICE.

Of course, not all medicines demonstrate clear evidence of cost-effective benefit and, therefore, we will not support their routine use. To do so would put an unacceptable burden on the wider NHS. That said, some new medicines are developed for use in small numbers of individuals with rare diseases. I recognise both the benefits that these so-called orphan drugs can deliver and the particular challenge that they may face to demonstrate cost-effectiveness. I am in the process of seeking advice from the group and from the Welsh Health Specialised Services Committee on the best way forward to manage the introduction of these particular medicines. In fact, officials will be meeting with key individuals to discuss this issue next Monday, and I look forward to receiving their advice on this important issue shortly thereafter.

So, patients in Wales have, and will continue to have access to new and innovative medicines, and they are made available at the earliest opportunity.

I will now turn to new technologies other than medicines. I am pleased that we have had the creation of the Welsh health technology fund. I am pleased that it has been welcomed. However, I am disappointed that our investment of over £5 million in the current financial year is not appropriately recognised. As Kirsty Williams said, she met with me and my officials, and she understood the procurement difficulties that we had, which Darren Millar clearly did not understand. We had to spend that money very quickly; we did have to use some replacements, but we had a new linear accelerator in Ysbyty Glan Clwyd and we put money into the genetic centre in Cardiff, among other things. I was pleased to hear Kirsty Williams's suggestions. We have over £20 million for investment over the next two years, and we will certainly give greater consideration to new and innovative technologies. My officials are currently looking at the suggestions that you brought forward.

I noted the comments from the Welsh Conservatives: that we should target the technology fund for the benefit of patients with cancer. However, we are already doing that.

The Member has referred to a cancer drugs fund. We are determined to continuously improve our services and this year we have supported investment in next generation technology and upgraded equipment in key areas to improve functionality, service efficiency and patient outcome. I was pleased that Members welcomed the £4.6 million investment for stereotactic body radiotherapy, which minimises the damage done to surrounding tissues. It is innovative and I understand that, particularly with lung cancer patients, there are improved patient outcomes.

I have been working closely with Edwina Hart, the Minister for Business, Enterprise, Technology and Science, to ensure that the NHS is treated as an anchor company because I think that it will be beneficial in that respect.

We should not forget that most innovative high-cost medicines are introduced through the managed sector, and comparing expenditure on new medicines in primary care against total NHS expenditure, or in the way that you are doing, is not the best measure.

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Finally, I would like to address the issue of loss of exclusivity, which Kirsty Williams raised. When the patent on a medicine expires and the manufacturer loses the exclusive right to produce and market that medicine, the loss of exclusivity allows other manufacturers to market equivalent products at a significantly lower price. As a consequence, savings can accrue to the NHS. These moneys also fund the new, innovative medicines approved by the all-Wales medicine group and NICE and always have done. This has been built in. It is not a new phenomenon; it has been built into the budgetary planning process for at least 20 years. I have already indicated that that is accounted for in the expenditure of £118.2 million for the last financial year.

I call on Peter Black to reply to the debate.

Thank you, Deputy Presiding Officer. I thank those who have taken part in this debate. I think that the case has been made that the pharmaceutical industry has been recognised, including by the Welsh Government, as a key to Wales's economic development and advancement due to its innovative nature. Some 10% of the Welsh workforce is involved in the healthcare sector, both in the public sector and in 300 companies that employ over 15,000 people and contribute more than £1.3 billion to the economy annually. The Welsh Government is investing in a panel to look at developing its strategy for the life sciences sector in Wales that will facilitate the growth of a dynamic life science ecosystem,

'leveraging financial investment where industry, academia, clinicians and government collaborate and deliver a sustainable economy and excellence in healthcare innovation.'

All those things are encompassed in this motion, and we welcome this work, but we must recognise the wider societal benefits as well, by looking at spending on new medicines as an investment, and not just as a cost. It helps to reduced hospital admissions, thereby reducing costs and waiting times in the NHS, easing pressure on the health and social care system. It improves healthy life expectancy, by enabling people to be healthy and active for longer. An OECD study estimated that for every increase by a year in a population's life expectancy, GDP could rise by as much as 4%. Evidence shows that ill health leads to a loss of productivity and an increase in absenteeism, which represents the yearly cost of around 2.5% of GDP—of course, ill health can also lead to job losses, as around about 10% of people who were employed left mainly for health reasons. It also enables people to return to work, easing the pressure on their families and helping people to live more independently and with a better quality of life. Those are the reasons why we believe that this investment in innovation and medicines is so important, and how we should be using the budget released and referred to in the motion in this way is very important as well.

Elin Jones talked about the need for an innovative health technology fund to tackle rare diseases. The Welsh Liberal Democrats support that, and we are happy to support amendment 1. She also referred to the economic impact of this sort of investment in Wales, something that I have just referred to, and which I think has been referred to by a number of speakers in this debate.

Darren Millar talked about his amendment, and the Conservatives' amendment 2 seeks to focus the motion on cancer, which we believe is too narrow, and that is why we will not be supporting it. We will be supporting the Conservatives' amendment 3, but not amendment 4, which we think attempts to make this a debate on the budget. We think that this is not just about cancer, and that is why we are not supporting amendment 2 specifically. What we want to see is an innovative

Mae Llywodraeth Cymru yn buddsoddi mewn panel i edrych ar y broses o ddatblygu ei strategaeth ar gyfer y sector gwyddorau bywyd yng Nghymru a fydd yn hwyluso twf ecosystem gwyddorau bywyd ddeinamig,

gan sbarduno buddsoddiad ariannol lle y mae diwydiant, academyddion, clinigwyr a'r llywodraeth yn cydweithredu ac yn sicrhau economi gynaliadwy a rhagoriaeth wrth arloesi ym maes gofal iechyd.

Mae'r holl bethau hynny wedi'u cynnwys yn y cynnig hwn, a chroesawn y gwaith hwn, ond rhaid inni gydnabod y buddiannau cymdeithasol ehangach hefyd, drwy ystyried gwariant ar feddyginiaethau newydd fel buddsoddiad, ac nid cost yn unig. Mae'n helpu i leihau nifer y bobl a gaiff eu derbyn i'r ysbyty, gan felly leihau costau ac amseroedd aros yn y GIG, gan leihau'r pwysau ar y system iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol. Dengys tystiolaeth fod salwch yn arwain at golli cynhyrchiant a chynnydd o ran lefelau absenoldeb, sy'n cyfateb i gost flynyddol o tua 2.5% o'r CMC—wrth gwrs, gall salwch hefyd arwain at golli swyddi, gan fod tua 10% o'r bobl a oedd wedi'u cyflogi wedi gadael yn bennaf am resymau iechyd. I want to get through this. What we want to see is an innovative Wales-specific approach to funding innovative medicines. It is not that I do not want to hear you, Darren, it is just that I doubt that my voice will last long enough to finish the speech.

In Velindre, they are aiming to increase the percentage of radical patients receiving IMRT to 35% by 2016. In the Royal Marsden Hospital, this treatment is routine, so clearly Wales has to catch up on a number of these innovative treatments if we are to be seen to be punching at the right weight in that regard.

We need some clarification on that, because if it was the case, patients in Cwm Taf would have access to drugs for deep-vein thrombosis that were approved in July 2012 but will not be available to them until May or June this year. Clearly, there are mixed signals going out here in terms of what is available and what is not available, and the reality is that patients, in their hospitals and doctors surgeries, find that those drugs are not being made available as they are told they will be, and they are not being made available in Wales as they are in England. That is something that we seriously need to address in responding to this debate.

Dadl Fer: Cynlluniau Bwrdd Iechyd Hywel Dda ar gyfer Sir Benfro—Gwasanaethau Diogel a Chynaliadwy?

I am pleased to use my short debate this afternoon to discuss Hywel Dda Local Health Board's reconfiguration plans for Pembrokeshire. I am happy to give Joyce Watson, Simon Thomas and William Powell each a minute of my time.

Short Debate: Hywel Dda Health Board's Plans for Pembrokeshire—Safe and Sustainable Services?

Rwy'n falch o gael defnyddio fy nadl fer y prynhawn yma i drafod cynlluniau ad-drefnu Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Hywel Dda ar gyfer Sir Benfro. Rwy'n fodlon rhoi munud yr un o'm hamser i Joyce Watson, Simon Thomas a William Powell.

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The title of my debate poses the question, 'Are Hywel Dda Local Health Board's plans for Pembrokeshire safe and sustainable?' Today, I will argue that the proposals will not provide safe and sustainable services for the people of Pembrokeshire. Members will be aware that, at the end of last month, these controversial plans were referred to the Minister for health by the local community health council. I want to take this opportunity to congratulate the local community health council for its courage and persistence in standing up for patients and the local community by referring the controversial plans to the Minister. Given that the final decision now rests with the Welsh Government, I feel that it is only right and proper that we have an opportunity to debate the plans on the floor of the Assembly Chamber.

Hywel Dda Local Health Board's highly controversial plans have not gone down well in my constituency. The Minister may be interested to know that, only two weeks ago, members of Pembrokeshire County Council, including the Labour Party group, unanimously passed a motion that vigorously rejected Hywel Dda Local Health Board's plans for service change in the area. The people of Pembrokeshire have also spoken loud and clear on these proposals by staging protests, circulating petitions and attending public meetings. Up to 500 people attended a public meeting in Haverfordwest, where strong feelings were expressed against the plans. A recent petition collected approximately 14,000 signatures and was presented to the Assembly's Petitions Committee for consideration. There is also a 'Save Withybush special care baby unit' Facebook page, which has attracted over 8,000 members. That further demonstrates the strength of feeling against one of the most contentious proposals. However, the health board's decision to press ahead with these plans demonstrates that the views of many of my constituents have, quite simply, been ignored. The special care baby unit provides lifesaving services, and it is vital that this unit is not closed or relocated.

Some clinicians have made it clear that establishing a level 2 high-dependency unit at Glangwili hospital will not only lead to closing the special care baby unit at Withybush, but it could threaten Withybush hospital's other departments, such as paediatrics. There is a real danger that the paediatrics department could close as well, because the health board could take staff away from this department to operate the new level 2 unit at Glangwili hospital.

Of course, a paediatrics department is essential to a district general hospital, given that 25% of admissions to an accident and emergency department are children. If the paediatrics department is taken away, children could not be admitted to the accident and emergency department, which could, in turn, make the accident and emergency department at Withybush hospital unsustainable in future. Given the decision to press ahead and create a level 2 high-dependency unit at Glangwili, it is essential to fully consider the knock-on effects that taking away a particular service might have on the sustainability of other core services.

I am pleased that the local community health council has shared this view, and has said

Nid yw cynlluniau dadleuol iawn Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Hywel Dda wedi cael derbyniad da yn fy etholaeth. Efallai yr hoffai'r Gweinidog wybod, dim ond pythefnos yn ôl, i aelodau Cyngor Sir Penfro, gan gynnwys grŵp y Blaid Lafur, yn unfrydol dderbyn cynnig a wrthododd gynlluniau Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Hywel Dda i newid gwasanaethau yn yr ardal yn chwyrn. Mae pobl Sir Benfro hefyd wedi mynegi eu barn yn glir ar y cynigion hyn drwy gynnal gwrthdystiadau, cylchredeg deisebau a mynychu cyfarfodydd cyhoeddus. Bu hyd at 500 o bobl yn bresennol mewn cyfarfod cyhoeddus yn Hwlfordd, lle y cafodd teimladau cryf eu mynegi yn erbyn y cynlluniau. Casglodd deiseb ddiweddar oddeutu 14,000 o lofnodion ac fe'i cyflwynwyd i Bwyllgor Deisebau'r Cynulliad i'w hystyried. Ceir tudalen Facebook hefyd am achub uned gofal arbennig babanod Llwyn Helyg, sydd wedi denu dros 8,000 o aelodau. Mae hon yn enghraifft arall sy'n dangos cryfder y teimladau yn erbyn un o'r cynigion mwyaf dadleuol. Fodd bynnag, mae penderfyniad y bwrdd iechyd i fwrw ymlaen â'r cynlluniau hyn yn dangos bod barn llawer o'm hetholwyr wedi cael eu hanwybyddu'n llwyr. Mae'r uned gofal arbennig i fabanod yn darparu gwasanaethau sy'n achub bywydau, ac mae'n hanfodol nad yw'r uned hon yn cael ei chau na'i hadleoli.

Mae rhai clinigwyr wedi ei gwneud yn glir y bydd sefydlu uned dibyniaeth fawr lefel 2 yn ysbyty Glangwili nid yn unig yn arwain at gau'r uned gofal arbennig i fabanod yn Llwynhelyg, ond y gallai beryglu adrannau eraill ysbyty Llwyn Helyg, megis pediatreg. Mae perygl gwirioneddol y gallai'r adran bediatreg gau hefyd, gan y gallai'r bwrdd iechyd symud staff o'r adran hon i weithredu'r uned newydd lefel 2 yn ysbyty Glangwili.

Wrth gwrs, mae adran bediatreg yn hanfodol i ysbyty cyffredinol dosbarth, o ystyried mai plant yw 25% o'r derbyniadau i adran damweiniau ac achosion brys. Os nad oes adran bediatreg, ni allai plant gael eu derbyn i'r adran damweiniau ac achosion brys, a allai, yn ei dro, wneud yr adran damweiniau ac achosion brys yn Ysbyty Llwynhelyg yn anghynaliadwy yn y dyfodol. O ystyried y penderfyniad i fwrw ymlaen a chreu uned dibyniaeth fawr lefel 2 yn Ysbyty Glangwili, mae'n hanfodol ystyried yn llawn effeithiau canlyniadol posibl penderfyniad i ddileu gwasanaeth penodol ar gynaliadwyedd gwasanaethau craidd eraill.

Rwy'n falch bod y cyngor iechyd cymuned lleol wedi cydfynd â hynny, ac wedi dweud bod

'the HBs ambition to develop a Neonatal Level 2 Unit at Glangwili Hospital in Carmarthen is an inappropriate and indeed an unattainable one in the current circumstances'.

We have also heard from clinicians and staff how closing this unit would have a detrimental effect on families of unborn babies across Pembrokeshire. Senior sister and unit manager of SCBU, Linda Jones, who has worked at the hospital in Haverfordwest for nearly three decades, said that she and other staff members believe that closing the unit is unthinkable for the county's families. Paediatric consultant at Withybush hospital, Gustav vas Falco, has said that he has grave reservations about moving the special care baby unit from Haverfordwest. I hope that, in the wake of the local community health council referring these plans to the Minister for Health and Social Services, she will seriously listen to the views of these medical professionals, as well as taking on board the views of the people of Pembrokeshire.

In the Welsh Government's document, 'A Strategic Vision for Maternity Services in Wales', the Government says that it expects the NHS to

'provide a range of high quality choices of care as close to home as is safe and sustainable to do so, from midwife to consultant-led services'.

In light of the views expressed by medical professionals regarding relocating Withybush special care baby unit, surely the proposed plans by Hywel Dda Local Health Board are not safe and sustainable for families in Pembrokeshire.

In addition, I cannot see how the decision to site the new special care baby unit at Glangwili meets recommendation 13 of the Assembly's Children and Young People Committee report on the provision of neonatal care in Wales. The recommendation states that

'the Welsh Government [needs] to ensure that local health boards take transport transfer times into account when assessing service reconfiguration plans'.

Establishing a level 2 neonatal facility would go against this recommendation. Members are aware that Withybush hospital's catchment area extends into deep rural areas. These areas have challenging links; therefore, travelling any distance to obtain emergency treatment will certainly lessen survival chances. Travelling even further, as proposed in these plans, will put people's lives at risk. Surely, this is making a service more unsafe, not safer.

Centralising a service like a special care baby unit is a real risk for patients. Clearly, the rurality of Pembrokeshire has not been sufficiently considered by the health board. If these plans go ahead, they will put at risk the health and, possibly, lives of babies born in Pembrokeshire, and they will seriously disadvantage patients and families from remote and rural areas.

Mae meddyg ymgynghorol ym maes pediatreg yn Ysbyty Llwynhelyg, Gustav vas Falco, wedi dweud fod ganddo amheuan mawr ynglŷn â symud yr uned gofal arbennig i fabanod o Hwlfordd. Gobeithiaf, ar ôl i'r cyngor iechyd cymuned lleol gyfeirio'r cynlluniau hyn at y Gweinidog Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol, y bydd yn gwrandao o ddifrif ar farn y gweithwyr proffesiynol meddygol hyn, yn ogystal â gwrandao ar farn pobl Sir Benfro.

Yn nogfen Llywodraeth Cymru, 'Gweledigaeth Strategol ar gyfer Gwasanaethau Mamolaeth yng Nghymru', dywed y Llywodraeth ei bod yn disgwyl i'r GIG

'ddarparu ystod o ddewisiadau gofal diogel o safon uchel, o wasanaethau dan arweiniad bydwragedd i wasanaethau dan arweiniad meddygon ymgynghorol.'

Yng ngoleuni'r farn a fynegwyd gan weithwyr proffesiynol meddygol ynghylch adleoli'r uned gofal arbennig i fabanod yn Llwyn Helyg, does bosibl bod cynlluniau arfaethedig gan Fwrdd Iechyd Lleol Hywel Dda yn ddiogel ac yn gynaliadwy i deuluoedd yn Sir Benfro.

Yn ogystal, ni allaf weld sut mae'r penderfyniad i leoli'r uned gofal arbennig newydd i fabanod yn Ysbyty Glangwili yn unol ag argymhelliad 13 o adroddiad Pwllgor Plant a Phobl Ifanc y Cynulliad ar y ddarpariaeth o ofal newyddenedigol yng Nghymru. Dywed yr argymhelliad fod

angen i Lywodraeth Cymru sicrhau bod byrddau iechyd lleol yn ystyried amseroedd trosglwyddo a chludo wrth asesu cynlluniau i ad-drefnu'r gwasanaeth.

Byddai sefydlu cyfleuster newyddenedigol lefel 2 yn mynd yn groes i'r argymhelliad hwn. Mae Aelodau yn ymwybodol bod dalgylch ysbyty Llwynhelyg yn ymestyn i ardaloedd gwledig iawn. Mae cysylltiadau heriol yn yr ardaloedd hyn; felly, bydd teithio unrhyw bellter i gael triniaeth frys yn sicrhau lleihau siawns rhywun o oroesi. Bydd teithio hyd yn oed ymhellach, fel y cynigiwyd yn y cynlluniau hyn, yn rhoi bywydau pobl mewn perygl. Onid yw hyn yn gwneud i wasanaeth fod yn fwy annigol, nid yn fwy diogel.

Mae canoli gwasanaeth fel uned gofal arbennig i fabanod yn risg wirioneddol i gleifion. Yn amlwg, nid yw'r bwrdd iechyd wedi rhoi ystyriaeth ddigonol i natur wledig Sir Benfro. Os bydd y cynlluniau hyn yn mynd yn eu blaenau, byddant yn peryglu iechyd ac, o bosibl, fywydau babanod a anwyd yn Sir Benfro, a byddant yn rhoi cleifion a theuluoedd o ardaloedd anghysbell a gwledig o dan anfantaes fawr.

There are also serious concerns over the plans to close minor injuries units in Tenby and Pembroke Dock. These units are crucial to providing a safe and sustainable health service for local residents. I accept that the health board is considering piloting a service in Tenby during the peak tourist period. It will initially be conducted for eight weeks, from mid-July to September. I believe that this demonstrates a massive disregard for local residents and will put a huge amount of pressure on local GP surgeries, which will have to carry the increased workload. It seems to me that the local health board is more interested in looking after visitors than the local population. As the community health council states in its referral to the Minister,

‘whilst it was stated in the Consultation document that GPs would take over the service, this had not been agreed at that point with the GPs (and nor has it still), and neither did the Health Board mention that this would only be for eight weeks, or that other providers might take on the service, or that plans were in place for any staff redeployment.’

These assumptions were therefore misleading, suggesting that GPs had already agreed to take over the service, when in fact they had not agreed to do so.

These MIUs are vital services that provide serious, much-needed facilities to their local communities. Once again, the people of Pembrokeshire have spoken loudly and clearly on this issue. Members will remember the demonstrations that have taken place locally, and indeed, outside the Senedd. These issues further highlight the concerns over the entire LHB consultation process.

I believe that the consultation process that we saw taking place at the end of last year by Hywel Dda health board has been a farce. I use that word because, quite simply, nearly all of the proposals originally put forward by the board have just been pushed through with no revised plans whatsoever, despite local opposition. The LHB has not addressed and responded to people’s concerns and points of view. Indeed, Tony Wales, Hywel Dda Community Health Council’s chairman and a Labour Party candidate at last year’s local government elections, has said that he was appalled by the recommendations, and called the process little more than a charade. It is becoming increasingly clear that the consultation process has been a shambles. We saw that the north Wales CHC had been given an extended period to respond to Betsi Cadwaladr University Local Health Board’s plans. That begs the question: why was Hywel Dda CHC not extended the same courtesy? Clearly, this has been a shambles.

Cyfyd pryderon difrifol hefyd ynghylch y cynlluniau i gau unedau mân anafiadau yn Ninbych-y-Pysgod a Doc Penfro. Mae’r unedau hyn yn hanfodol i ddarparu gwasanaeth iechyd diogel a chynaliadwy i drigolion lleol. Derbynïaf fod y bwrdd iechyd yn ystyried treialu gwasanaeth yn Ninbych-y-Pysgod yn ystod cyfnod brig yr ymwelwyr. I ddechrau, caiff ei gynnal am wyth wythnos, o ganol mis Gorffennaf tan fis Medi. Credaf fod hyn yn dangos diffyg parch mawr tuag at y trigolion lleol a bydd yn rhoi llawer iawn o bwysau ar feddygfeydd lleol, y bydd yn rhaid iddynt ymgymryd â’r llwyth gwaith cynyddol. Ymddengys imi fod gan y bwrdd iechyd lleol fwy o ddiddordeb mewn gofalu am ymwelwyr na’r boblogaeth leol. Fel y noda’r cyngor iechyd cymuned wrth gyfeirio’r mater at y Gweinidog,

er y nodwyd yn y ddogfen ymgynghori y byddai meddygon teulu yn dod yn gyfrifol am y gwasanaeth, ar y pryd nid oedd meddygon teulu wedi cytuno i wneud hynny (ac nid ydynt wedi cytuno o hyd), ac ni nododd y Bwrdd Iechyd y ffaith mai dim ond am wyth wythnos y byddai’r gwasanaeth hwn ar gael, nac ychwaith y gallai darparwyr eraill ymgymryd â’r gwasanaeth, neu fod cynlluniau ar y gweill ar gyfer adleoli staff.

Felly roedd y rhagdybiaethau hyn yn gamarweiniol, gan awgrymu bod meddygon teulu eisoes wedi cytuno i ddod yn gyfrifol am y gwasanaeth, er nad oeddent wedi cytuno i wneud hynny mewn gwirionedd.

Mae’r Unedau Mân Anafiadau hyn yn wasanaethau hanfodol sy’n darparu cyfleusterau difrifol, mawr eu hangen i’w cymunedau lleol. Unwaith eto, mae pobl Sir Benfro wedi mynegi eu barn yn glir ar y mater hwn. Bydd yr Aelodau yn cofio’r gwrthdystiadau sydd wedi digwydd yn lleol, ac yn wir, y tu allan i’r Senedd. Mae’r materion hyn yn amlygu ymhellach y pryderon ynglŷn â holl broses ymgynghori’r BILL.

Credaf fod y broses ymgynghori a welsom ar ddiwedd y flwyddyn ddiwethaf gan fwrdd iechyd Hywel Dda wedi bod yn ffars. Defnyddiais y gair hwnnw oherwydd, yn syml iawn, mae bron bob un o’r cynigion gwreiddiol a gyflwynwyd gan y bwrdd newydd gael eu cymeradwyo heb unrhyw gynlluniau diwygiedig o gwbl, er gwaethaf gwrthwynebiad lleol. Nid yw’r BILL wedi mynd i’r afael â phryderon a safbwyntiau pobl nac wedi ymateb iddynt. Yn wir, mae Tony Wales, cadeirydd Cyngor Iechyd Cymuned Hywel Dda ac ymgeisydd dros y Blaid Lafur yn etholiadau llywodraeth leol y llynedd, wedi dweud bod yr argymhellion yn arswydus yn ei farn ef, a dywedodd mai siarâd oedd y broses i bob diben. Mae’n dod yn fwyfwy amlwg bod y broses ymgynghori wedi bod yn draed moch. Gwelsom fod CIC Gogledd Cymru wedi cael cyfnod estynedig i ymateb i gynlluniau Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Prifysgol Betsi Cadwaladr. Mae hynny’n codi’r cwestiwn: pam na chafodd CIC Hywel Dda ei drin â’r un cwrteisi? Yn amlwg, mae hyn wedi bod yn draed moch.

Given that the public's attitude towards service change has been largely disregarded, this raises the question as to whether the cost associated with the health board's consultation represents value for money for taxpayers. We all accept the need to consult on service reconfiguration in any area of Wales, and that there will naturally be a cost attached to it. However, Hywel Dda Local Health Board has spent over £300,000 largely to ignore the people that it serves. The question therefore needs to be asked: has this demonstrated value for money for the taxpayer, especially given that the LHB has failed to respond and address the concerns put forward by clinicians and local people?

We have continually heard both the First Minister and the Minister for Health and Social Services talk about safe and sustainable services. Earlier this year, the First Minister said:

'What I will defend—and I will defend it continually—is the need for safe and sustainable services in Wales. I am not going to stand back from that one, because it is exceptionally important.'

I am sure that the Minister would acknowledge that the current services at Withybush General Hospital are safe and sustainable, but any movement of services such as the special care baby unit would be dangerous and unsafe for the people of Pembrokeshire. Surely, taking away a core and essential service like SCBU from a community is downgrading the services at Withybush. To try to pretend otherwise is ridiculous.

This is a very worrying time for the people of my constituency, and today we look to the Minister for support and political leadership. Since Hywel Dda health board has confirmed its plans, the Minister is aware that it has already established an implementation board to push through its plans. Given that the decision on these proposals has now been referred to the Minister, can she provide reassurances this afternoon that this implementation board will not move forward with its plans until she has made a final decision? Surely, no changes should take place until a final decision has been made. Allowing the LHB to proceed with changes would make a mockery of the whole process. The Minister must ensure that no changes take place until she has made her decision, because there are rumours that the LHB is already looking to offload some of its estate, such as Tenby minor injuries unit, before the process has been completed. Surely, this is plainly wrong, especially since this facility was opened only six years ago by a previous Minister for health.

O ystyried bod agwedd y cyhoedd tuag at newidiadau mewn gwasanaethau wedi cael ei hanwybyddu i raddau helaeth, mae hyn yn codi cwestiwn ynghylch a yw'r gost sy'n gysylltiedig ag ymgynghoriad y bwrdd iechyd wedi rhoi gwerth am arian i drethdalwyr. Rydym i gyd yn derbyn bod angen ymgynghori ar ad-drefnu gwasanaethau mewn unrhyw ran o Gymru, ac y bydd cost ynghlwm wrth hynny wrth reswm. Fodd bynnag, mae Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Hywel Dda wedi gwario dros £300,000 ac wedyn wedi anwybyddu'r bobl y mae'n eu gwasanaethu i raddau helaeth. Y cwestiwn, felly, y mae angen ei ofyn yw: a yw hyn wedi bod yn werth am arian i'r trethdalwr, yn enwedig o ystyried bod y BILL wedi methu ag ymateb i'r pryderon a gyflwynwyd gan glinigwyr a phobl leol a mynd i'r afael â hwy?

Rydym wedi clywed y Prif Weinidog a'r Gweinidog Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol yn sôn am wasanaethau diogel a chynaliadwy dro ar ôl tro. Yn gynharach eleni, dywedodd y Prif Weinidog:

Yr hyn y byddaf yn ei amddiffyn—a byddaf yn ei amddiffyn bob amser—yw'r angen am wasanaethau diogel a chynaliadwy yng Nghymru. Nid wyf yn mynd i gefnu ar hynny, oherwydd mae'n eithriadol o bwysig.

Rwy'n siŵr y byddai'r Gweinidog yn cydnabod bod y gwasanaethau cyfredol yn Ysbyty Cyffredinol Llwynhelyg yn ddiogel ac yn gynaliadwy, ond byddai unrhyw ymgais i symud gwasanaethau megis yr uned gofal arbennig i fabanod yn beryglus ac yn anniogel i bobl Sir Benfro. Onid yw symud gwasanaeth craidd a hanfodol megis yr uned gofal arbennig i fabanod o gymuned yn gyfystyr ag israddio gwasanaethau yn Llwynhelyg? Mae ceisio honni fel arall yn chwerthinllyd.

Mae hwn yn gyfnod pryderus iawn i bobl fy etholaeth, a heddiw rydym yn disgwyl i'r Gweinidog ddangos cefnogaeth ac arweinyddiaeth wleidyddol. Ers i fwrdd iechyd Hywel Dda gadarnhau ei gynlluniau, mae'r Gweinidog yn ymwybodol ei fod eisoes wedi sefydlu bwrdd gweithredu i roi ei gynlluniau ar waith. O ystyried bod y penderfyniad ar y cynigion hyn bellach wedi cael ei gyfeirio at y Gweinidog, a all roi sicrwydd y prynhawn yma na fydd y bwrdd gweithredu hwn yn bwrw ymlaen â'i gynlluniau nes ei bod wedi gwneud penderfyniad terfynol? Yn sicr, ni ddylai unrhyw newidiadau ddigwydd nes y bydd penderfyniad terfynol wedi'i wneud. Byddai caniatáu i'r BILL fwrw ymlaen â newidiadau yn gwneud cyff gwawd o'r broses gyfan. Rhaid i'r Gweinidog sicrhau nad oes unrhyw newidiadau yn digwydd hyd nes ei bod yn gwneud ei phenderfyniad, oherwydd mae sibrydion bod y BILL eisoes yn ceisio gwaredu rhannau o'i ystad, megis uned mân anafiadau Dinbych-y-pysgod, cyn bod y broses wedi'i chwblhau. Does bosibl bod hynny'n briodol, yn enwedig gan mai dim ond chwe blynedd yn ôl y cafodd y cyfleuster hwn ei agor gan un o'r Gweinidogion iechyd blaenorol.

Naturally, there are concerns surrounding the independent voice of CHCs, and the Minister's statement yesterday is very worrying given that one of the review's recommendations is that the chair should be appointed by the Minister. I urge the Minister to preserve the independence of CHCs. After all, they should be the patients' champions—there to speak up for local communities, not for the Government of the day. If it were not for Hywel Dda CHC's independence, perhaps the LHB's current proposals would not have been referred to the Minister. I very much hope that the Minister will now take the views of the people of Pembrokeshire into consideration. These are views that have clearly been totally ignored by Hywel Dda health board. I urge her to stand up for the people of Pembrokeshire by doing the right thing and to oppose the board's plans. Local communities in Pembrokeshire deserve safe and sustainable services. These plans by Hywel Dda health board will not be safe and sustainable for local people in Pembrokeshire.

Mae'r rhain yn safbwyntiau sydd yn amlwg wedi cael eu hanwybyddu'n llwyr gan Fwrdd Iechyd Hywel Dda. Rwy'n ei hannog i sefyll o blaid pobl Sir Benfro drwy wneud y peth iawn a gwrthwynebu cynlluniau'r bwrdd. Mae cymunedau lleol yn Sir Benfro yn haeddu gwasanaethau diogel a chynaliadwy. Ni fydd y cynlluniau hyn gan fwrdd iechyd Hywel Dda yn ddiogel nac yn gynaliadwy i bobl leol yn Sir Benfro.

We have seen this week just how short-sighted it is because Hywel Dda officials are telling people not to go to A&E, but to go to the minor injuries unit, and they are closing one of the main units that is in the middle of a major tourism area. 'Together for Health' outlined the challenges that we know faced the health service, and the actions that we believe are necessary in order to ensure that it is capable of world-class performance. It sets out the case as to why we need to reform and modernise our NHS. We have inequalities in health. We need to be more proactive in improving health and preventing avoidable health conditions. We have a rising ageing population, an increasing number of people with long-term conditions, and medical staffing pressures. There are advances in medicine and technology, which we have debated this afternoon, and we know that some specialist services are being spread too thinly and, of course, there are financial constraints.

'Together for Health' set out my vision of a primary and community-care-led NHS that is focused on planning and delivering world-class services, designed to support and meet the health and wellbeing needs of individuals, families and local communities at or as close to home as possible. I really believe that our integrated NHS system, which was introduced back in 2009, is well placed to do this, as opposed to the increasingly privatised and fragmented NHS that we are seeing over the border in England.

The case for change was clearly articulated by the Bevan commission in its report, and endorsed by the full Assembly in Plenary. We all share very positive aspirations to raise the quality of our services, so that we have a health service that is fit for the twenty-first century in Wales. The Bevan commission also noted the responsibility that we have, as politicians, not to stand in the way of essential action to ensure that our services remain in tune with needs, and to use resources to achieve the best possible outcomes for the people of Wales. It is important that the people of Wales understand the implications if we do not reconfigure services.

I of course understand, probably more than anybody, why such changes are not easy, but it is vital to respond to the evolving picture of health and health care in Wales. We all know that the NHS is constantly changing—that is nothing new. I remain very concerned that no matter how many times we debate the vital issue of NHS service change, we are still in the uncomfortable situation where all Members acknowledge and accept the need for change in principle, but oppose it locally. I believe that this is confusing and contradictory behaviour, and it sometimes gets in the way of healthy debate.

Health boards have a statutory duty to plan and deliver services with the aim of improving the quality of care and outcomes for their local populations. To do this well, health boards must engage with their local populations and other stakeholders, such as local government and the third sector, to demonstrate the health and wellbeing needs of individuals, families and local communities, and to debate how best to meet those needs. The ongoing debate at a national and local level about service change has tended to focus on more specialised care in hospitals. I want to use the debate today to shift that focus to local services, as the majority of health care contact—about 90%—takes place outside hospitals.

Ceir datblygiadau ym maes meddygaeth a thechnoleg, yr ydym wedi eu trafod y prynhawn yma, a gwyddom fod rhai gwasanaethau arbenigol yn cael eu gwasgaru'n rhy denau ac, wrth gwrs, mae cyfyngiadau ariannol.

Nododd 'Law yn Llaw at Iechyd' fy ngweledigaeth o GIG a arweinir gan y sector gofal sylfaenol a gofal cymunedol sy'n canolbwyntio ar gynllunio a darparu gwasanaethau o'r radd flaenaf, gyda'r nod o gefnogi a diwallu anghenion iechyd a lles unigolion, teuluoedd a chymunedau lleol yn y cartref neu mor agos i'r cartref â phosibl. Rwy'n wir yn credu bod ein system GIG integredig, a gyflwynwyd yn ôl yn 2009, mewn sefyllfa dda i wneud hyn, yn hytrach na'r GIG sy'n cael ei breifateiddio a'i ddarnio'n gynyddol a welwn dros y ffin yn Lloegr.

Cafodd yr achos dros newid ei fynegi'n glir gan gomisiwn Bevan yn ei adroddiad, a'i gymeradwyo gan y Cynulliad mewn Cyfarfod Llawn. Rydym i gyd yn rhannu dyheadau cadarnhaol iawn i godi ansawdd ein gwasanaethau, fel bod gennym wasanaeth iechyd sy'n addas ar gyfer yr unfed ganrif ar hugain yng Nghymru. Nododd comisiwn Bevan hefyd y cyfrifoldeb sydd gennym, fel gwleidyddion, i beidio â gwrthwynebu camau gweithredu hanfodol i sicrhau bod ein gwasanaethau yn parhau i ymateb i anghenion, ac i ddefnyddio adnoddau i sicrhau'r canlyniadau gorau posibl i bobl Cymru. Mae'n bwysig bod pobl Cymru yn deall y goblygiadau os nad ydym yn ad-drefnu gwasanaethau.

Wrth gwrs fy mod yn deall, yn well na neb fwy na thebyg, pam nad yw newidiadau o'r fath yn hawdd, ond mae'n hollbwysig ymateb i'r darlun o iechyd a gofal iechyd sy'n datblygu yng Nghymru. Rydym i gyd yn gwybod bod y GIG yn newid drwy'r amser—nid yw hynny'n beth newydd. Rwy'n pryderu'n fawr o hyd, ni waeth sawl gwaith yr ydym yn trafod mater hollbwysig newid gwasanaethau'r GIG, ein bod yn dal yn y sefyllfa anghyfforddus lle mae pob Aelod yn cydnabod ac yn derbyn yr angen am newid mewn egwyddor, ond yn ei wrthwynebu yn lleol. Credaf fod hyn yn ymddygiad dryslyd ac anghyson, ac weithiau mae'n rhwystro i ddadl iach.

Mae gan fyrdau iechyd ddyletswydd statudol i gynllunio a darparu gwasanaethau gyda'r nod o wella ansawdd y gofal a'r canlyniadau i'w poblogaethau lleol. Er mwyn gwneud hyn yn dda, rhaid i fyrdau iechyd ymgysylltu â'u poblogaethau lleol a rhanddeiliaid eraill, megis llywodraeth leol a'r trydydd sector, er mwyn dangos anghenion iechyd a lles unigolion, teuluoedd a chymunedau lleol, a thrafod y ffordd orau o ddiwallu'r anghenion hynny. Mae'r ddadl sy'n mynd rhagddi ar lefel genedlaethol a lleol ynglŷn â newidiadau mewn gwasanaethau wedi tueddu i ganolbwyntio ar ofal mwy arbenigol mewn ysbytai. Rwyf am ddefnyddio'r ddadl heddiw i newid y ffocws i wasanaethau lleol, gan fod y rhan fwyaf o gyswllt gofal iechyd—tua 90%—yn digwydd y tu allan i ysbytai.

I want to see much more scale and pace in shifting the focus from hospitals to providing more care at home, or close to home. I want to see more integration between primary, community and secondary care, between the NHS and local government and the third sector, working together for the benefit of citizens. This will better meet the needs of people and will capitalise on the opportunities for using resources and expertise for better outcomes.

The vision is for high-quality and accessible community-based and person-centred services across Wales, with a particular focus on the needs of the frail, the vulnerable and those with complex care needs. Health boards have already established locality networks and community resource teams across Wales to plan, co-ordinate and deliver integrated care more effectively. I have made it clear that these local structures now need to be rapidly developed and strengthened to mature into what they need to be in order to deliver.

There are good examples of models that are transforming care and support, particularly for frail and older people, enabling them to stay at home or in the community setting, avoiding unnecessary hospital admissions, or supporting prompt discharge home for those who have been in hospital.

Rwyf am weld y ffocws yn newid o ysbytai i ddarparu mwy o ofal yn y cartref, neu'n agos i'r cartref, ar raddfa lawer mwy ac yn llawer cynt. Rwyf am weld mwy o integreiddio rhwng gofal sylfaenol, cymunedol ac eilaidd, rhwng y GIG a llywodraeth leol a'r trydydd sector, gan weithio gyda'i gilydd er budd dinasyddion. Bydd hyn yn diwallu anghenion y bobl yn well a bydd yn manteisio ar y cyfleoedd i ddefnyddio adnoddau ac arbenigedd i sicrhau canlyniadau gwell.

Y weledigaeth yw gwasanaethau hygyrch o ansawdd uchel yn y gymuned sy'n canolbwyntio ar yr unigolyn ledled Cymru, gyda ffocws arbennig ar anghenion pobl eiddil, pobl sy'n agored i niwed a'r rhai ag anghenion gofal cymhleth. Mae byrddau iechyd eisoes wedi sefydlu rhwydweithiau bro a thimau adnoddau cymunedol ledled Cymru i gynllunio, cydgysylltu a darparu gofal integredig yn fwy effeithiol. Rwyf wedi ei gwneud yn glir bod angen bellach i'r strwythurau lleol hyn gael eu datblygu a'u hatgyfnerthu'n gyflym er mwyn aeddfedu nes eu bod yn cynnig yr hyn y mae angen iddynt ei gynnig er mwyn cyflawni.

Ceir enghreifftiau da o fodelau sy'n trawsnewid gofal a chefnogaeth, yn enwedig i bobl eiddil a hŷn, gan eu galluogi i aros yn y cartref neu yn y gymuned, gan osgoi derbyniadau diangen i'r ysbyty, neu gefnogi proses o ryddhau cleifion sydd wedi bod yn yr ysbyty i'w cartrefi yn ddi-oed.

Thank you, Minister, for taking the intervention. You were talking about the fact that you want more provision in the community to take the pressure off district general hospitals, which we would all agree with. However, the closure of many minor injuries units, such as that in Ysbyty Cwm Rhondda in my area, puts greater pressure on the DGH. What action are you taking to make sure that the staff are there to deal with the pinch points, rather than closing community services, which is what has been going on under your leadership of the health service?

I have been having conversations with the chairs to ensure that that happens. It is very important that staff are used in the best possible places, using the best possible resources, and that is a message that I have given strongly to the chairs.

Rwyf wedi bod yn cael sgrysiâu gyda chadeiryddion i sicrhau bod hynny'n digwydd. Mae'n bwysig iawn bod staff yn cael eu defnyddio yn y mannau gorau posibl, gan ddefnyddio'r adnoddau gorau posibl, a dyna neges yr wyf wedi'i chyfleu'n gryf i gadeiryddion.

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As I have said, while health boards have made good progress, there is a need to increase the pace and scale of change to deliver the shift from hospital to the primary and community setting, because I want to see measurable improvement by 2016. I want to see measurable improvement with a more proactive and systematic approach to improving the health of individuals, families and local communities. I want improvement in assessing individual need through a more whole-person-centred and partnership approach between the individual and the professional to achieving health and wellbeing. I want improvements in assessing and meeting population need, such as the complex needs of an ageing population and an increase in the number of people with long-term conditions. I want to get rid of any fragmented care, and I want to reduce health inequalities.

I will shortly be launching the local integrated care plan to support and guide health boards, local government, the third sector and other partners to focus on the delivery of this measurable improvement by 2016. The plan is based on five key themes: improving health and wellbeing, detecting health problems quickly, local integrated teams, person-centred care, and sustainable health and social services. The measurement of effective local integrated care and how people are better off as a result will be done through a range of population outcome indicators and service performance measures, set out in the programme for government and in the national outcome framework that is being developed for health and social care. Paul Davies referred to community health councils. He will be aware that I have just had the review. We are having a debate next Tuesday when we will be able to debate it much more fully.

In conclusion, let us not lose sight of the reasons why changes to the NHS are happening. They are essential to ensure safe and sustainable services for the future. If change does not happen, some services are in danger of collapsing. Neither I nor this Government will stand by and let this happen. Members, I understand the concerns that everyone has for their services. The focus has to move from acute to local care. Change is unavoidable. This Government will deliver on its promises to improve our health service.
